TRANSMISSION OF GOLD IN LETTERS THROUGH THE POST OFFICE.

NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC.

WITH the view of affording facilities to persons resident on the gold fields and elsewhere for transmitting by post to parts beyond the seas small quantities of gold without the necessity for entering such gold at any custom house, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of gold being examined at the places mentioned below, subject to the following regulations, in accordance with the provisions of the Act 18 Victoria No. 29, sec. 8.

Sub-treasury, Beechworth

REGULATIONS.

1. Duty will be received at any of the above sub-treasuries on small quantities of gold, to be transmitted by post to parts beyond the seas. The quantity so forwarded may in no case exceed four ounces.
2. Persons desirous of availing themselves of this permission should present their gold, together with the letter or packet in which they intend to forward it, at a sub-treasury, and pay the amount of duty required.
3. As instructions have been given to the sub-treasurers to seal and secure such packages containing the gold so to be transmitted, and to certify to the quantity, all persons must be careful to observe that these letters or packages must in no cases be re-opened previous to their being placed in the post office, as otherwise the gold will be liable to condemnation in the manner provided by the Act.

MUNICIPALITY OF RICHMOND.

BYE-LAW No. 4.—A BYE-LAW FOR IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate on all houses and lands within the limits of such municipal districts according to the fair average value thereof, such rate not to exceed the sum of two shillings: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Richmond, that a rate for the current year of one shilling in the pound of the fair average annual value of all property in houses and lands within the limits of the municipal district be imposed and levied.
