## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference, by any municipal council constituted under the said Act, with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to exempt certain places and buildings from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Prahran: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of Prahran the following public places and buildings, situate and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

The Methodist Chapel, Commercial road.  
The Independent Chapel, Chapel street.  
The Wesleyan School Room, Mount Erica.  
The Scotch School Room, Sargood street.  
The Baptist Chapel, Charles street.  
The Church School Room, Chapel street.  
The Windsor School Room.  
The Windsor Catholic School Room.  
The Mechanics' Institute, Chapel street.  
The Court House, Chapel street.

## NOTICE TO PERSONS CLAIMING PROCEEDS OF SALE OF IMPOUNDED CATTLE.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18th Victoria No. 30, intituled, "An Act to amend the Law relating to the Impounding of Cattle," and, under clause XXI. thereof, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified that the following revised Regulations are, from and after this date, to be observed by all persons entitled to claim from the fund accruing from the sale of impounded cattle by virtue of the Act.

1. The claimant must obtain a true and certified extract from the pound sales book, giving the full description, brands, and dates of sale of the cattle on account of which he claims; and the extract is to be signed by the poundkeeper.

2. A declaration of ownership of the cattle at the time when sold out of pound is to be made before a magistrate or justice of the peace, and by virtue and under the provisions of an Act made and framed in the ninth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for the more effectual abolition of Oaths and Affirmations taken and made in various Departments of the Government of New South Wales, and to substitute Declarations in lieu thereof, and for the suppression of voluntary and extra-judicial Oaths and Affidavits." Vide Form B.

3. The printed form of claim hereinafter mentioned, to be used and marked (A.) when duly completed, must be accompanied by the original or a certified copy of the receipt for the cattle, and also a certificate of character of the claimant, signed by two respectable householders, as directed below, and marked (C.)

4. No claim can be allowed unless made in accordance with these Regulations, and presented to the Treasurer within a period of two years from the time the proceeds of the sale of the cattle are paid over to that officer.

5. Copies of printed forms, as below, to be used and marked (A.), (B.) and (C.) respectively, are to be obtained at the Treasury, or of any of the poundkeepers.

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

WARRINGAL OR HEIDELBERG.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition to His Excellency, hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-one inhabitant householders of the township of Warringal, otherwise called Heidelberg, in the county of Bourke.

The petitioners state that they are subjected to great inconvenience and danger from the condition of the streets and roads in their locality, the communication between the township and Melbourne having been during last winter all but cut off, and the streets rendered nearly impassable for both foot passengers and vehicles.

That any general regulations promotive of cleanliness, health and convenience are in the present state of things impracticable, and that hence the township is consigned to utter neglect, and the value of property deteriorated, many persons having removed, and others having been deterred from coming to reside.

The petitioners state further that they feel convinced that the formation of the township into a municipality, under the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, will be the most certain mode of making provision for its present and future requirements.

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

CARISBROOK.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition to His Excellency hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-two householders and landowners in the township and parish of Carisbrook, in the county of Talbot.

The petitioners state that they are householders and landowners in the town and parish of Carisbrook, and are convinced that it will conduce to the improvement, welfare and good government of the township if it were incorporated into a municipal district under 18 Victoria No. 15, and they propose the following boundaries, viz.:—Commencing at the north-western point of suburban allotment 4, parish of Carisbrook, and running in a south-westerly direction one hundred and sixty-one chains; thence due south three hundred and thirty-two chains to the Government road from Carisbrook to Anherst; thence due east eighty-two chains, crossing Back Creek and Mount Greenock Creek; thence in a north-easterly direction four hundred and twenty chains to the south-east corner of the cemetery; thence due north, running along the boundary of the cemetery eight chains to the main Government road to Melbourne through Tarragower; and thence in a north-westerly direction two hundred and twenty-two chains to the commencing point.

The petitioners further state that the proposed municipal district contains nine square miles, that no one point in it is more than six miles distant from any other point, and that more than three hundred landowners and householders are resident within it.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"That Your Excellency will be pleased, by proclamation in the usual manner, to declare the district of Carisbrook a municipal district, under the provisions of the Act of Council before mentioned."

YOU are hereby requested, within ninety days after the service of this notice upon you, to remove and set back certain fences which encroach upon and obstruct the free use of the roads running along the west and south sides respectively of your property, known as Glenferrie, being portion 21, parish of Gardiner, fronting on the Gardiner's Creek, and which said encroachments are set forth and described and are colored red upon the plan, a copy of which has been served upon you, and the original of which may be inspected at this office, and the particulars of which are as follow:—

At the N.W. corner marked A, on the said plan, the width of road enclosed within the present fence is twenty-two feet, increasing southerly to the point marked B, on the said plan, where it is twenty-six feet wide, thence diminishing to twelve feet six inches, at the point marked C on the said plan. At the south-west corner, marked C on the said plan, there is no encroachment on the road running south of the allotment. From this point the line of fence encroaches on the road easterly to the point marked D on the said plan, where the width of road included within the fence is sixteen feet, thence diminishing easterly to the S.E. corner of the allotment, where the road is of its full width.
