MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 14.—FOR IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND SIXPENCE IN THE POUND ON THE ASSESSABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BALLAARAT, FOR THE YEAR ENDING THE 16TH JANUARY, 1858.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted that the municipal councils are empowered to impose a rate upon all assessable property within their respective municipal districts, according to its fair annual average value, provided no such rate shall exceed the sum of Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Ballaarat, that a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound be levied on all assessable property within the municipal district of Ballaarat, for the year ending the sixteenth day of January, 1858, and be due and payable in equal proportions upon the fifteenth day of April and the fifteenth day of August respectively, in 1857.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 14, made by the municipal council of Ballaarat, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF CASTLEMAINE.

BYE-LAW No. 18.—TO REGULATE THE ERECTION OF SHADES OR AWNINGS, AND PREVENT ANY OBSTRUCTION UPON, OVER, OR ACROSS THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the general good rule thereof; and whereas it is expedient to regulate and control the erection of shades or awnings over or across the public footpaths, and prevent any obstructions upon such footpaths within the municipality of Castlemaine, so as to prevent such erections or obstructions becoming public nuisances: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Castlemaine that any person or persons who shall erect or cause to be erected any shade, awning, or other obstruction, over, upon, or across any public footpaths within the municipality without first having obtained in writing the consent of the said municipal council to such erection, shall on conviction thereof before two or more of the justices of the peace for the said district, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Five pounds: And be it further ordered and

directed by the authority aforesaid that every such shade, awning or obstruction, when such consent to the erection of the same shall have been obtained, shall be erected with the upright posts or pillars thereof immediately at the outside of the kerb stone or other boundary of the footpaths, and that no plate, rafter, or tie of any such shade or awning, or other obstruction shall be of a less height above the surface of such footpaths than seven feet in the clear to the under side of such rafter, plate or tie: And be it further ordered and directed that, it shall be lawful for the said council to direct and require the removal of any shade, awning or other obstruction erected across, over or upon any public footpaths of the said municipality, except the same be in strict accordance with the foregoing directions, whether such shade, awning or other obstruction shall have been erected prior to the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, or subsequently thereto; and it shall be further lawful for the said council to give notice to remove any such shade, awning or other obstruction by means of the surveyor or other officer of such council to any owner or occupier, by whom or for whom such shade, awning or other obstruction shall have been erected, and any such owner or occupier who shall refuse or neglect to remove any such shade, awning or other obstruction within forty-eight hours from the time of such notice of removal being given, shall, on conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace for the said district, forfeit and pay for every such offence, refusal or neglect, a sum or penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

MUNICIPALITY OF CASTLEMAINE.

BYE-LAW No. 19.—PROHIBITING DAMAGE TO THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS AND WATERCOURSES, AND REGULATING THE FORMATION OF PRIVATE DRAINS AND CROSSINGS.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the general good rule thereof: Be it ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Castlemaine that any person who shall ride, drive or lead any horse or beast, or who shall drive or wheel any cart, barrow, carriage or other vehicles upon or across any of the public footpaths or watercourses of the municipal district of Castlemaine, or who shall in any way cause damage to the said public footpaths or watercourses or any of them, shall upon conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Provided that every owner or occupier of any gateway, yard or lane to which access by horses, beasts, carriages or other vehicles can be obtained only by riding, leading or wheeling upon or across any of the said public footpaths or watercourses who shall make and maintain such crossing or crossings over the said public footpaths or watercourses, or any of them as may be necessary for approach and access to any such private gateway, yard or lane at the expense of such owner or occupier, and under the superintendence of such officer or officers as the said municipal council may appoint for that purpose, shall be allowed to use such crossing without being liable to the penalty hereinbefore imposed. The owner or occupier of any building or premises who shall cause or suffer any water to be discharged or to overflow from any such building or premises into or over any public footpaths within the said district, shall, upon conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, provided that if such owner or occupier shall make and maintain such drains leading through and under the adjoining path as shall be necessary to discharge the water from such building or premises into the public watertables, channels or gutters, at the expense of such owner or occupier, under the superintendence of such officer or officers as the said council may appoint for that purpose, he shall not be liable to the penalty hereinbefore imposed.
