MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT.

BYE-LAW NO. 14.-FOR IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND SEXPENCE IN THE POUND ON THE ASSESSABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BALLAGRAT, FOR THE YEAR ENDING THE 16TH JANUARY, 1858.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions "in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted that the municipal councils are empowered to impose a rate upon all assessable property within their respective municipal districts, according to its fair annual average value, provided no such rate shall exceed the sum of Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Ballaarat, that a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound be levied on all assessable property within the municipal district of Ballaarat, for the year ending the sixteenth day of January, 1858, and be due and payable in equal proportions upon the fifteenth day of April and the fifteenth day of August respectively, in 1857. tively, in 1857.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 14, made by the municipal council of Ballnarat, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF CASTLEMAINE.

BYE-LAW NO. 18 .-- TO REGULATE THE ERECTION OF SHADES OR AWNINGS, AND PREVENT ANY OBSTRUCTION UPON, OVER, OR ACROSS THE PUPLIC FOOTPATHS.

OR AWNINGS, AND PRENEY ARY OBSTRUCTION OF AS, OR AGROSS THE FUFLIC FOOTPATHS.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Instimutions in Victoria" the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the general good rule thereof; and whereas it is expedient to regulate and control the erection of shades or awnings over or across the public footpaths, and prevent any obstructions upon such footpaths within the municipality of Castlemaine, so as to prevent such erections or obstructions becoming public nuisances: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Castlemaine that any person or persons who shall erect or cause to be erected any shade, awning, or other obstruction, over, upon, or across any public footpaths within the municipality without first having obtained in writing the consent of the said municipal council to such erection, shall on conviction thereof before two or more of the justices of the peace for the said district, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Five pounds: And be it further ordered and

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the general good rule thereof: Be it ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Castlemaine that any person who shall ride, drive or lead any horse or beast, or who shall drive or wheel any cart, barrow, carriage or other vehicles upon or across any of the public footpaths or watercourses of the municipal district of Castlemaine, or who shall in any way cause damage to the said public footpaths or watercourses or any of them, shall upon conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Provided that every owner or occupier of any gateway, yard or lane to which access by horses, beasts, carriages or other vehicles can be obtained only by riding, leading or wheeling upon or across any of the said public footpaths or watercourses who shall make and maintain such crossing or crossings over the said public footpaths or watercourses, or any of

them as may be necessary for approach and access to any such
private gateway, yard or lane at the expense of such owner or
occupier, and under the superintendence of such officer or
officers as the said municipal council may appoint for that
purpose, shall be allowed to use such crossing without
being liable to the penalty hereinbefore imposed. The owner
or occupier of any building or premises who shall cause or
suffer any water to be discharged or to overflow from any
such building or premises into or over any public footpaths
within the said district, shall, upon conviction thereof before
any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for
every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Ten pounds,
provided that if such owner or occupier shall make and maintain such drains leading through and under the adjoining path
as shall be necessary to discharge the water from such building
or premises into the public watertables, channels or gutters, at
the expense of such owner or occupier, under the superintendence of such officer or officers as the said council may appoint
for that purpose, he shall not be liable to the penalty hereinbefore imposed.
