PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

In pursuance of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the nineteenth year of Her Majesty's Roign, intituled, "An Act to provide for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council and "Legislative Assembly of Victoria respectively:" I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation abolish the polling place already appointed for the electoral district mentioned in the schedule hereunto annexed; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby appoint that the places mentioned in the last column of the same schedule shall be the polling places for the purpose of taking the poll at any contested election for the said district; and that all votes in respect of qualifications within the boundaries and limits mentioned in the second column of the same schedule, shall be taken at any election for such district at the polling place or polling places in the said last column set opposite to the names of the respective divisions of such district, that is to say:—

Division.	Boundaries and Limits.	Polling Places.
Brighton	BRIGHTON. As described in the Proclamation of the sixth day of September, 1856	At or near the Devonshire Arms Hotel, and at or near the Plough and Harrow Inn.
