ROAD THROUGH THE PARISH OF BULLA-BULLA.

(Amended Description.)

NOTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan, describing the exact course and bearings of, and the admeasurements required for, a road through the parish of Bulla-bulla, in the county of Bourke, proposed to be made by the Central Road Board, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the names of the owners and occupiers thereof, so far as known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work, have been deposited at the Public Lands Office, Melbourne, the particulars of which are as follow:—

The road commences at a point on a public road (dividing sections iv. and viii. from sections v. and vii.) 41 chains from the south-west corner of section iv., bearing west 36 degrees 25 minutes north, 52 chains; thence west 37 degrees 45 minutes north down Lighthouse Gully, 17 chains 60 links; thence west 11 degrees 10 minutes north, 7 chains 90 links; thence north 40 degrees west, 21 chains; thence by a curve to a point on the Deep Creek, bearing north 31 degrees 30 minutes west, 8 chains 50 links; thence north 37 degrees 57 minutes east, 22 chains 20 links; thence north 15 degrees 58 minutes west, 16 chains 50 links; thence north 59 degrees 50 minutes west, 19 chains 50 links; thence west 19 degrees 20 minutes north, 14 chains 60 links; thence due north, 22 chains 60 links, passing through the property of David Patulla, joining the road at the south side of section xiii.

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

BRUNSWICK.

(Second Petition.)

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition to His Excellency hereinafter set forth, signed by three hundred and eighty-two householders resident within the district of Brunswick, in the county of Bourke.

The petitioners state that it will greatly tend to benefit the district of Brunswick that it should be constituted a municipal district, and propose that the boundaries thereof should be as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the bridge on the Merri Creek at the village of Northcote, and bounded on the south by a line bearing west to the eastern boundary of the Prince's Park reserve, by the said reserve northerly and westerly to the Sydney road; thence westerly along the northern boundary of the Royal Park reserve to the Moonee Ponds, by the said ponds north-westerly to the north-western corner of section 125, parish of Jika Jika; thence easterly along the northern boundary of section 127, parish of Jika Jika, to the Merri Creek, and by the said creek south-easterly to the point of commencement.

The petitioners further state that the area of the proposed district does not exceed nine square miles, and that it contains a population of householders exceeding five hundred, and that no one point in such area is distant more than six miles from any other point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

“May it therefore please Your Excellency to declare by Your Excellency's Proclamation that the said district be a municipal district under the name of ‘The Brunswick Municipality,’ pursuant to the provisions of 18 Victoria No. 15.”

THE FIRST HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF BELFAST, MADE IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 43 OF THE MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS ACT, 18 VICTORIA NO. 15.

FORMATION.

THE district of Belfast was duly proclaimed a municipality on the 1st day of July, 1856, and its boundaries described as "commencing at a point on the sea coast, being the south-eastern angle of section VII., parish of Belfast; thence by a line bearing north 7 degrees 52 minutes west, being the eastern boundary of sections VII., VIII., IX., and X., to the southern boundary of section XXIV., in the parish aforesaid; thence by a line easterly, being the southern boundary of sections XXIV., XXV., XXVI., and XXVII., to the River Moyne; thence by the western side of the River Moyne to the Belfast Lough; thence by a line south-easterly crossing the said lough, to the northern angle of suburban portion 38 A, in the said parish of Belfast; thence on the north-eastern boundary of the said portion to the sea coast, and thence by the sea coast to the commencing point aforesaid, including the islands at the mouth of the River Moyne;" and a public meeting of the resident householders and landowners within the said district was held in the Court House, Belfast, on Saturday, 27th day of September, 1856, for the purposes prescribed by the Municipal Institutions Act, James Mylne Knight, Esq., having been appointed by His Excellency to preside at such meeting.

The meeting elected Messrs. John Bland and John Wall to act as assessors, and decided that the council should consist of seven members, who should not receive pecuniary remuneration. A poll was then taken by voting cards, and the following are the names of the members declared elected and the number of votes received:—

The first meeting of the council was held in the Road Board Office, on the 30th day of September, at which Alexander Russell, Esq., was elected chairman for the municipal year.

APPOINTMENTS.

Town Clerk.—S. J. Bayly was appointed on the 21st October, at a salary of £100 per annum.

Town Surveyor.—C. Ringk was appointed on the 14th November, at a salary at the rate of £250 per annum; the surveyor to provide himself with instruments.

Treasurer.—Wm. Young, Esq., manager Bank of Victoria, tendered his services gratuitously. Accepted 7th October.

The council have not yet thought fit to appoint permanent committees, but for the carrying out of special objects the appointment of special committees has been found advantageous.

For the compilation of the ratepayers' roll, the valuation of assessable property, and the collection of the rate, tenders were called, and the most obliging tenders appointed.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been adopted by the council:—
No. 1. For striking a rate of one shilling in the pound on the yearly value of property within the municipality. Passed 7th October, gazetted 4th November.

No. 2. For the appropriation of government grant in aid for the year 1856 of the municipality. Passed 19th November, gazetted 30th December.

No. 3. To regulate by means of standing orders the proceedings of the council. Passed 14th October, gazetted 9th December and 16th January, 1857.

No. 4. To regulate the deposit of night soil, &c. Passed 12th November. Not yet assented to, on the ground that no site was set apart for the purpose.

No. 5. To enforce the cleansing of chimney flues. Passed 12th November, gazetted 3rd March, 1857.

No. 6. For the preservation of footways, watercourses, &c. Passed 26th November, gazetted 16th December.

No. 7. For the prevention of accidental fires, &c. Passed 3rd December, gazetted 30th December.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

For copy of the *Government Gazette*. Granted.

For eight copies of the Municipalities Act. Granted.

For a moiety of the police bench fines when applicable. Granted.

For a tracing of the Belfast special survey. Granted.

For fifty copies of bye-law No. 3. Refused.

CORRESPONDENCE.

The council availed themselves of the earliest opportunity to urge upon the Government the immediate necessity of expending the sum of £10,000 voted for public works in this district for 1856, so long delayed, but which have since been commenced and are in progress.

A lengthened correspondence took place in reference to the grant of £4000 in aid of this municipality, and after what the council felt to be a tedious and unnecessary delay, received the first moiety (£2000), on the 20th December; the second moiety was received on the 14th January, 1857.

The council unanimously voted a congratulatory address to His Excellency the Governor on his arrival.

The council have petitioned the Governor and Executive Council to place upon the supplementary estimates for this year the sum of £20,000 towards improving the harbor of this port.

MISCELLANEOUS.

The superintendent of police communicated with the council, and signified his willingness to carry out any suggestions of the council as to the employment, &c., of the police; the arrangements having been explained to them, were considered satisfactory. The council have availed themselves of the labor of prisoners for breaking road metal.

The census commissioners solicited the co-operation of the council in the taking of the census, which was willingly accorded.

A device for the corporation seal, with the motto "*Commune Bonum*," was agreed to by the council, has been approved, and the seal is now in the hands of an engraver.

A resolution was passed by the council on the 25th March, 1857, to request His Excellency, by Proclamation, to exempt from assessment places of worship, schools, &c., as defined, to which no reply has yet been received.

Property liable to assessment has been valued at the annual value of £23,873. Number of persons on the ratepayers' roll, 421. Number of persons in the municipal district, as per census returns just taken, males 1083, females 1197; total 2280.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The prosecution of public works was necessarily delayed until the council received the grant in aid, when contracts were immediately advertised, and the tender of Messrs. G. and R. Johnson, for street improvements, was accepted, amount £1673 10s.; also the tender of the same parties, for the formation and metalling one-half the road from town to Rosebrook, amount £1400 8s. Both works are in progress. The street improvements consist of the formation, metalling with limestone, and drainage, with pitched water tables, of portions of Bank street, William street, and James street. Tenders for other urgently required works have been called for, and the works will be proceeded with as soon as practicable.

ATTENDANCE.

There have been 29 ordinary and 13 special meetings of the council, of which the chairman attended 22 ordinary and 13 special.

The working of the council hitherto has been attended with many difficulties, and that they have many more to contend with the council are well aware; but, notwithstanding their peculiar position, they have full confidence in their own ability to place the municipality of Belfast on a footing satisfactory to the ratepayers, and one that will bear favorable comparison with any other kindred institution established.
