PAYMENT OF PROCEEDS OF POUND SALES.

WITH reference to the Regulations respecting Public Accounts, and the Regulations for Management of Pounds, the attention of the officers concerned is directed to the following rules for payment of the proceeds of pound sales into Sub-Treasuries, to which it is desired that immediate effect should be given.

1. Poundkeepers are, as hitherto, in pursuance of the Regulations for Management of Pounds, to furnish their monthly account of sales and make the payments due thereon to the stipendiary magistrate or chairman of the bench, as indicated in the annexed schedule, and to forward the monthly statements A and B as usual to the Audit Office, Melbourne.

2. Stipendiary magistrates will require of the poundkeepers a punctual compliance with the regulations, and are, on receipt of account sales and money, to transmit the same to the sub-treasury named in the schedule, from which office a receipt for the amount will be returned by course of post.

3. Any default in the accounts or payments will be reported from the sub-treasury to the head office, in Melbourne, in the same manner as the default of a collector of revenue.

TOLLS AT McLENNAN'S STRAITS PUNT, GIPPS LAND.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for making and improving Roads in the colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to declare that tolls should be payable and collected at any punt or ferry which should be constructed, repaired, or supported at the public expense, and that it should be lawful for His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to declare the tolls to be payable at such punts and ferries, and such rates and tolls from time to time to vary and alter, and any such Proclamation to revoke: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of August, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, certain rates of tolls were authorised to be collected at the punt or ferry called and known as the McLennan's Straits Punt, on the Lower or Coast road, in the district of Gipps Land: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the said tolls: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, by virtue of the power and authority by the said Act in me vested, revoke so much of the said Proclamation as declares the rates of tolls to be payable and collected at the said McLennan's Straits Punt, on the Lower or Coast road, in the district of Gipps Land, and with the advice aforesaid I do hereby declare that the following tolls, and no higher, shall be payable and collected at the said punt or ferry, that is to say:—

ACTS OF COUNCIL (19th VICTORIA) ALLOWED.

IT is hereby notified that the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies has (in three several despatches, dated the 24th and 25th of last April, Nos. 26, 27 and 28) intimated that the Queen has been pleased to confirm and allow the undermentioned Acts of the Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria passed in the session held in the 19th year of Her Majesty's reign, A.D. 1855-6, viz:—

19th VICTORIA.—PUBLIC ACTS.

No. 1.—"An Act to further continue an Act, intituled, 'An Act to prevent for a limited time Party Processions and certain other Public Exhibitions in the Colony of New South Wales.'"

No. 2.—"An Act to alter the laws relating to Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes, and certain other securities, and to facilitate the remedies thereon."

No. 4.—"An Act to amend the law respecting Defamatory Words and Libel."

No. 5.—"An Act to re-enact an Act, intituled, 'An Act to authorise for a limited period an Assessment on Stock.'"

No. 6.—"An Act to repeal so much of an Act, intituled, 'An Act more effectually to promote the erection of Buildings for Public Worship and to provide for the maintenance of Ministers of Religion in the Colony of Victoria,' as relates to any grant of money out of the General Revenue."

No. 7.—"An Act to amend an Act, intituled, 'An Act to regulate the conveyance of Passengers to Victoria.'"

No. 9.—"An Act to amend an Act, intituled, 'An Act to restrain the careless use of Fire.'"

No. 10.—"An Act to amend an Act, intituled, 'An Act to amend an Act intituled an Act to amend the Law relating to the Post Office.'"

No. 11.—"An Act to provide for the better regulation of proceedings at Elections of Members of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria respectively."

No. 12.—"An Act to provide for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria respectively."

No. 14.—"An Act to make provision for the eradication of certain Thistle Plants and the Bathurst Burr."

No. 15.—"An Act to enable the Government of Victoria to purchase all the property and other interests possessed by 'The Melbourne, Mount Alexander, and Murray River Railway Company.'"

No. 16.—"An Act to amend an Act, intituled, 'An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria.'"

No. 17.—"An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in Victoria to the service thereof for the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and for further appropriating the said Revenue."

No. 18.—"An Act to amend an Act, intituled, 'An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in the Colony of Victoria to the service thereof for the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, and for further appropriating the said Revenue.'"

No. 19.—"An Act to alter and simplify the Practice and mode of Procedure in an Action at Law, and for other purposes in relation thereto."

No. 20.—"An Act for adopting and applying portions of certain Acts of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the Sessions of the thirteenth and fourteenth and in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, in the Administration of Justice in Victoria."

No. 21.—"An Act to provide for the Registration of Imported Stock."

PRIVATE ACTS.

"An Act to authorise the admission of Alexander Keefor to practise as a Barrister in the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria."

"An Act to incorporate a Company to be called 'The Studley Park Bridge Company,' and to enable the said Company to erect and maintain a Bridge over the River Yarra Yarra, at Church-street, East Collingwood, and to take toll thereat, and for other purposes."

"An Act to enable the Shareholders and Members of a certain Joint Stock Insurance Company, carrying on business in the colony of Victoria under the name, style and firm of 'The Victoria Fire and Marine Insurance Company,' to sue and be sued in the name of the Chairman for the time being of the Board of Directors of the said Company, and for other purposes therein mentioned."

"An Act to authorise the Melbourne and Hobson's Bay Railway Company to make a Branch Railway from their present Railway to St. Kilda, and to amend their Act of Incorporation, and to extend the powers therein contained, and for other purposes."

INDUSTRIAL SCHOOLS.

LADY interested in industrial education is prepared to appropriate £100 in the following manner:—

A premium of £50 to be given to a master in a Denominational or National School who shall give successful instruction in the growth of hemp or flax and their manufacture into rope, or £25 for the cultivation and £25 for the manufacture, in separate schools.

Also a premium of £50 to a master who shall give successful instruction in basket making, and the cultivation of suitable material as osiers, or £25 for cultivation and £25 for manufacture.

Managers of public elementary schools are requested to forward propositions before 1st August next. Not less than three schools must compete, or the premium will not be available.

It is to be observed that considerable assistance is also given by the Denominational School Board, under the rules, in carrying out industrial arrangements.

ix *Drainage and cleansing spaces between tents; clearing tent sites; confining pigs and goats.*—To ensure attention to cleanliness in Chinese camps on the gold fields, the inhabitants of each tent shall keep free from rubbish of any sort, and properly drain the half of any space which may intervene between their tent and that next adjoining in every direction. Upon the removal of any tent from a camp, the owners of the same shall remove all rubbish, &c., from the site thus becoming vacant. The owners of pigs or goats shall keep the same folded without the limits of the camp.

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

FITZ ROY WARD—MELBOURNE.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition to His Excellency hereinafter set forth, signed by over one thousand householders and ratepayers of Fitz Roy Ward, in the city of Melbourne.

The petitioners state that having carefully considered the management and financial position of the city of Melbourne, they are satisfied as to the inexpediency of continuing to be a portion thereof, on the following grounds, viz. :—

1st. At the present moment the city revenue is insufficient by £36,000 to meet current expenses and keep in moderate repair the "made" streets, without providing for a single mile of new street, and that to meet the deficiency double rates will be required for the ensuing year.

2nd. The streets at present unmade are twenty-four miles in length, and for these and other works it has been proposed in the city council to raise £300,000 (in addition to the Gabrielli loan of £500,000), and thus to add to involvement.

The petitioners observe, that facility in raising such large sums leads to lavish expenditure and increased burthens, and apprehend that all the present rates would barely suffice to pay the interest of the loans, leaving unprovided for the maintenance and scavenging of the present streets.

That it appears from official returns, that during the year ending 31st August, 1856, the payments to the staff of the corporation, or salaries, amounted to £15,300, and the incidental expenses to £4000, making together £19,300, out of a revenue of £49,000, the management thus absorbing 40 per cent., while the corporate income is insufficient by upwards of £36,000 per annum to meet legitimate expenses.

That Fitz Roy Ward, being unequally represented in the city council, cannot obtain justice, Melbourne proper (which contains 640 acres), returning 16 members, while Fitz Roy Ward (which contains 340 acres) only returns 4 members.

Lastly, that there are in Fitz Roy Ward, 13 miles of streets and 10,000 inhabitants, that its importance is such as to require local management, and that its only hope of future prosperity rests in a total and speedy separation from the city.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency will be pleased to take their case into your most favorable consideration, and cause the necessary steps to be taken to have the district of 'Fitz Roy,' proclaimed a separate municipality, with the following extension of its boundaries, to obviate objections from the city council of Melbourne, namely, that its southern boundary be the centre of Victoria parade, in lieu of the north side line of the same; its western boundary, the centre of Nicholson street, continued in a straight line northwards to the Merri Creek, in lieu of the east side line of the said street ending at Reilly street; that the eastern bound-

dary be the centre of Smith street to the Heidelberg road, and thence along the East Collingwood boundary north to the Merri Creek in lieu of the west side line of the said street ending at Reilly street, and its northern boundary be the Merri Creek, in lieu of Reilly street."

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

SOUTH YARRA.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition to His Excellency, hereinafter set forth, signed by three hundred and six householders and ratepayers of South Yarra, in the county of Bourke.

By His Excellency's Command,

The petitioners state that the locality of South Yarra is within the municipal district of Prahran, and that but a small portion of the municipal rates levied on the property in South Yarra has been applied to local improvements; in short, that the municipal council have almost ignored it, not having metalled or formed the roads, nor removed the rubbish from them, and that horses, cattle, pigs, goats, &c., are allowed to roam at large and commit depredations.

That South Yarra is too remote from Prahran to admit of the petitioners sharing the benefits attending municipal institutions, such as a Post Office, facilities for extinguishing fires, a Mechanics' Institute, &c., &c., and that the requirements of South Yarra, differing from those of Prahran, will be better fulfilled by residents than by strangers interested only in the improvement of distant localities contiguous to their own properties.

That the municipal council of Prahran are about to borrow £8000 on mortgage of the rates, that the properties of the petitioners have been rated for 1857 at 1s. in the pound on a rack rental, and they fear that it will be necessary to levy a yearly rate of 2s. in the pound until such loan be repaid.

That the only improvement by aid of such loan contemplated in South Yarra will consist in making and metalling a short piece of road called Yarra street, a work of little if any benefit to the petitioners, but serviceable to the Prahran municipal council for hauling stones over to make roads distant from South Yarra, and that the formation of the Melbourne and Suburban Railway will obviate the necessity for such a road.

That the majority of the petitioners consented to be included within the municipal district of Prahran upon the distinct understanding that the lowest possible rate only would be assessed, and that the council should not borrow money except with the approval of the ratepayers, signified at a public meeting convened for the purpose, which meeting has not been convened.

That the present rateable property within South Yarra is nearly, if not quite, as valuable as that of the whole municipal district was at the time of its constitution.

Lastly, the petitioners state that the area of the proposed municipal district does not exceed nine square miles, that it contains more than three hundred householders or ratepayers, and that it is bounded on the north by the River Yarra Yarra, on the east by the Kooyong road, on the south by the centre of the Commercial road, and on the west by the centre of the Punt road, as delineated on a plan which accompanies the petition.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore most humbly pray that Your Excellency will be pleased to declare the locality comprised within the boundaries hereinbefore defined a municipal district, by the name of the South Yarra Municipality, or by such other name as Your Excellency may think fit, under the Act of the 18th Victoria No. 15, intituled, "*An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*," and that for such purpose Your Excellency will, if necessary, vary and alter the present boundaries of the municipal district of Prahran: And that Your Excellency will not consent to the borrowing of eight thousand pounds by the municipality of Prahran, until the

locality in which your petitioners reside has been proclaimed a separate municipality."

WILFUL MURDER. FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.

PARTICULARS.

On Monday, 15th June, one of two miners working in an abandoned gully called Paddy's Gully, a mile and a half from Avoca, found the head of a European female at the bottom of a hole. The head was fractured in two places. It had been severed from the trunk by a sharp instrument. At the top of the forehead there is a bullet hole. The teeth are entire, except two, which are decayed. Some reddish brown hair lay beside the head. The deceased is supposed to have been about 30 years of age, and to have been dead about three months or more.

In a neighbouring hole had been previously found a tarpaulin or a canvas fly covered with blood: it appears to be a dray cover. The skeleton was found on an open piece of ground near the Four Mile Flat (on Mr. Bradshaw's run): it is destitute of the head, and otherwise incomplete. An American axe, rusted with blood, with a straight handle of iron bark, lay alongside the skeleton.

The murder appears to have been committed while the parties were camped for the night, and the head was carried four miles from the trunk in a direction leading up the country towards Avoca.




