GOLD EXTRACTION.

FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.

A MEMORIAL having been presented to His Excellency the Governor by the Local Court of the District of Sandhurst, requesting that a premium should be awarded to any person or persons making known some new process for the extraction of gold from its matrix : It is hereby notified that a reward of Five Hundred Pounds will be paid to any person who shall, within twelve months from this date, discover a new mode of extracting gold from rock, upon the following conditions :—

1. The discoverer shall prove to the satisfaction of the Mining Commissioners that his process is cheaper and more effective than the process by crushing, washing, and amalgamation.
2. The discoverer shall claim no other reward than the sum of money now offered.
3. The discovery shall be thrown open to the free use of the public.
4. The right to the reward shall be decided by the said Mining Commissioners, and the decision of the said Commissioners shall be final and conclusive.
