TERRITORIAL MAGISTRATES.

VICTORIA, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland QUEEN, Defender of the Faith: To the several persons named in the schedule hereunto annexed,

GREETING—

KNOW ye that we have, with the advice of Our Executive Council, assigned you jointly and severally and every one of you, our Justices to keep our peace in our colony of Victoria, and to keep and cause to be kept all ordinances and laws for the good of the peace and the preservation of the same, and for the quiet rule and government of our people within our said colony of Victoria, according to the force, form and effect of the said ordinances and laws respectively, and to chastise and punish all offenders against the same. We have also, with the advice aforesaid, assigned you and every two or more of you, our Justices, to inquire the truth more fully by the oath of good and lawful men in that behalf chosen, tried and sworn according to law, and by whom the truth of the matter shall be better known, of all and all manner of felonies, trespasses and misdemeanors committed and done within our said colony of Victoria, of which the Justices of our peace may or ought lawfully to inquire, and also to hear and determine all and singular the felonies, trespasses and misdemeanors aforesaid, as in the like cases it has been accustomed or ought to be done, and all offenders for their offences aforesaid, according to the said ordinances and laws, to chastise and punish. And therefore we command you and every of you, that to keeping the peace, ordinances and laws aforesaid, you diligently apply yourselves, and that at certain days and places, which shall be duly and legally appointed for these purposes, into the felonies, trespasses and misdemeanors aforesaid, you make inquiries and all and singular the premises hear, and determine and perform and fulfil them in the aforesaid form, doing therein what to justice appertains, according to the custom of England, saving to us the amerciaments and other things to us therefrom belonging.

And we command, by the tenor of these presents, all our sheriffs whom it may concern, that at certain days and places, which shall be made known to them respectively, they cause to come before you, or any two or more of you, as aforesaid, so many and such good and lawful men, by whom the truth of the matter in the premises shall be the better known and inquired into.

In testimony whereof we have caused these our letters to be made patent.

Witness our trusty and well-beloved SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of our colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven.
