EXAMINATION OF MINING SURVEYORS.

At a meeting of the Committee of Examiners of the Board of Science the following notice to Mining Surveyors was ordered to be published:

EXAMINATION.

Mining surveyors will be examined by written or printed papers in the following subjects:—

1. Questions in surface and underground surveying.
2. Questions in general geological principles applicable to mining districts.
3. Methods of discriminating the principal rocks, ores, and simple minerals of common occurrence.
4. Mining engineering, including construction of machinery and elementary dynamics.

Each surveyor, in addition to the above examination, will be required to write an account of the mining regulations and practice of the district for which he seeks to be licensed.

Surveyors who have satisfactorily passed the above examinations, will be required, *vis à vis*, to explain mining models, and show the methods of using instruments.

Examinations will be held twice in each year.

Surveyors intending to present themselves must notify their intention to the secretary of the Board of Science, on or before the first Monday in September and the first Monday in March.

MUNICIPALITY OF BRUNSWICK.

BYE-LAW No. 4.—A BYE-LAW TO PREVENT MISCHIEF ARISING FROM FIRES IN CHIMNEY FLUES.

WHEREAS by the Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," the council of any municipal district is authorized to make bye-laws, among other things for the prevention and extinguishing of fires: And whereas great danger to life and property by reason of fire arises from chimney flues taking fire, and it is necessary that the same be guarded against: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Brunswick that the occupier of any premises within the said district whereof any chimney flue shall take fire, shall, on conviction thereof before any one or more justice or justices of the peace for the said district, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 4, made by the municipal council of Brunswick, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF EAST COLLINGWOOD.

BYE-LAW No. 19.—FOR EMPOWERING THE CHAIRMAN OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF EAST COLLINGWOOD, FROM AND AFTER THE DATE HEREOF, TO TAKE ELECTIONS BY BALLOT TO SUPPLY VACANCIES FROM TIME IN THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF EAST COLLINGWOOD.

(Under 18th Victoria No. 15.)

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18th Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is enacted, *inter alia*, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the regulation of their own proceedings * * * the conducting of elections: And whereas it is expedient that from and after the date hereof that the chairman of the municipal council of East Collingwood, or his deputy or deputies, be severally hereby empowered to take elections by ballot to supply vacancies occurring from time to time in the municipal council of East Collingwood in like manner as far as the same may apply as elections by ballot are now from time to time taken to supply vacancies in the Legislative Council and Assembly of Victoria, according to the provisions to that effect in the Acts of Council 19th Victoria No. 11, "Regulations of Elections Act," and 19th Victoria No. 12, "An Act for the Election of Members:" Be it therefore hereby enacted that such elections to supply vacancies in the municipal council of East Collingwood be taken by ballot from and after the date hereof.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 19, made by the municipal council of East Collingwood, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF EAST COLLINGWOOD.

BYE-LAW No. 20.—FOR RESCINDING CLAUSES 12, 13 AND 15 OF BYE-LAW No. 5, FOR CONDUCTING OF PUBLIC MEETINGS AND ELECTIONS AND SO FORTH.

(Under 18 Victoria No. 15.)

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is enacted, *inter alia*, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the regulation of their own proceedings and the conducting of public meetings: And whereas by the making of bye-law No. 18 by the municipal council of East Collingwood, for taking elections by ballot, it is necessary and expedient to rescind clauses 12, 13 and 15 of bye-law No. 5, made by the said council, assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and gazetted on the 3rd day of October, 1856, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 33: And be it enacted that the aforesaid clauses 12, 13 and 15 of said bye-law No. 5, be and they are hereby rescinded.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 20, made by the municipal council of East Collingwood, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF SANDHURST.

No. 15.—A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE THE CONDUCTING OF THE ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted that the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act may make bye-laws for the conducting of elections: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, dated the 23rd day of April, 1856, the district of Sandhurst was duly established a municipal district under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of the district of Sandhurst that from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency as required by the provisions of the said Act:—

1. If at any election the chairman of the municipal council for the time being shall be incapacitated from presiding at such election, either from illness, absence from the district, or any other cause, it shall be competent for the remaining members of the municipal council (being a quorum) to appoint some one of themselves to act as chairman for the purpose of carrying out such election.

2. If at any election a poll shall be demanded in the manner and form required by the said Act, the chairman shall cause to be provided at the polling place a sufficient number of stalls or compartments, together with ink and pens, or pencils, for the purpose of enabling the elector to mark the voting papers as hereinafter provided, in which polling place no person other than the chairman, the town clerk or his deputy, the several candidates and their respective scrutineers, and the electors who shall for that time be tendering their votes, shall be entitled to be present; and any person other than such chairman, town clerk or his deputy, candidates, scrutineers and electors, who shall intrude into such room, and on being required to withdraw by the chairman shall refuse so to do, shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the provisions of this bye-law, and being convicted thereof before any two or more justices of the peace, shall forfeit and pay the sum of Two pounds.

3. The chairman shall cause to be provided for the purpose of such election a locked up box, of which he shall keep the key, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the voting papers, and which box shall stand upon the table in front of the chairman; and each elector shall receive from the chairman a voting paper, in the form in the schedule hereunto annexed, and shall thereupon retire to a stall or compartment provided for that purpose, and there strike out the names of such candidates as he does not intend to vote for, and deposit the same in the ballot-box, in the presence of the chairman, town clerk or his deputy, and scrutineers; and in case such elector shall be unable to read, or be blind, he shall signify the same to the chairman, who shall thereupon mark or strike out the names of such candidates as such elector shall designate; and no elector shall take out of such polling place any such voting paper, either before or after he has marked the same; and any person wilfully infringing any of the provisions of this clause, or obstructing the polling by any unnecessary delay in performing any act within the polling place, shall be deemed guilty of an offence within this bye-law, and on being convicted thereof before any two or more justices of the peace shall forfeit and pay the sum of Two pounds.

4. Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, by writing under his hand, to be delivered to the chairman at any time before Eight o'clock in the morning of the polling day, one scrutineer to be present on his behalf in the polling place.

5. It shall be lawful for the chairman or for any candidate or scrutineer to put to any person before he shall have received his voting paper the following questions only:—

1. What is your name and surname?
2. Are you of the age of twenty-one years?
3. Are you a ratepayer on the ratepayers' roll of the municipal district of Sandhurst?
4. Have you paid all rates levied upon you, except such as shall have become payable by you within one month before this election?
5. Have you already voted at this election?

And if any person shall wilfully give a false answer to any of the questions aforesaid he shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the meaning of this bye-law, and on being convicted thereof before any two justices of the peace, shall forfeit and pay the sum of Twenty pounds.

6. At every election it shall be the duty of the town clerk or his deputy to provide himself with the ratepayers' roll, and as each elector comes forward to demand his voting paper, to see whether the name of such elector appears upon the roll as a ratepayer within the meaning of the said Act, and as each elector deposits his voting paper within the ballot-box, to mark off such elector's name as having voted at such election.

7. In case the voting paper as of any person shall have been received, and any other person shall afterwards demand his voting paper as of the same person, the chairman, when such person shall purpose to deposit his paper in the ballot-box, shall refuse to allow the same to be put therein, but shall receive and keep the same apart, and at the close of the election decide whether such person has already voted or not; and for the purpose of such decision it shall be lawful for the chairman to take evidence on oath or affirmation, and such decision shall be final and conclusive on all parties; and if it shall appear to the chairman that such elector has not already voted at such election, such vote shall be added to the number already polled, but if otherwise, such vote shall not be allowed.

8. At the close of the poll, or as soon after as conveniently may be, the chairman, in the presence of the scrutineers, shall count the number of votes polled for each candidate, and if on

the state of the poll being announced the number of votes shall have been found to have been equal for any two or more candidates, one or more of whom, but not all, shall by the state of the poll and the number of members to be elected, be entitled to be declared to be elected, the chairman shall, by a casting vote or votes, as the case may be, decide which of the candidates for whom the votes may be equal shall be elected, but no chairman shall be entitled to vote at any election, except in the case of an equality of votes.

MUNICIPALITY OF WILLIAMSTOWN.

BYE-LAW No. 36.—To regulate the conducting of the Election of Members of the Municipal Council.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, "*An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*," it is amongst other things enacted that the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act may make bye-laws for the conducting of elections: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, dated the 12th day of March, 1856, the district of Williamstown was duly established a municipal district under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of the district of Williamstown that from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor as required by the provisions of the said Act:—

1. That the bye-law No. 21, intitled, "A bye-law for the conducting of elections of councillors," shall be and is hereby repealed.

2. If at any election the chairman of the municipal council for the time being shall be a candidate for re-election, or shall be incapacitated from presiding at such election either from illness, absence from the district, or any other cause, it shall be competent for the remaining members of the municipal council (being a quorum) to appoint some one of themselves to act as chairman for the purpose of carrying out such election; and it shall be lawful for the chairman, upon a vote of the council, to appoint under his hand and seal such and so many persons as to the council may seem necessary to act as deputy chairman or chairmen, poll clerk or poll clerks, and to appoint such and so many places within the municipal district as may seem to the said council necessary to be the polling place or places.

3. If at any election a poll shall be demanded in the manner and form required by the said Act, the chairman shall cause to be provided at the polling place or places a sufficient number of stalls or compartments, together with ink and pens, or pencils, for the purpose of enabling the elector to mark the voting papers as hereinafter provided, in any which polling place no person other than the chairman, the town clerk or his deputy, the scrutineers, and the electors who shall for the time being be tendering their votes shall be entitled to be present; and any person other than such chairman, town clerk or his deputy, scrutineers, and electors who may be tendering their votes, who shall intrude behind the barrier, and on being required to withdraw by the chairman shall refuse so to do, shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the provisions of this bye-law, and upon being convicted thereof before any two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the district, shall forfeit and pay a sum or penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds.

4. The chairman in each polling place shall cause to be provided for the purpose of such election a locked-up box, of which he shall keep the key, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the voting papers, and which box shall stand upon the table in front of the chairman; and each elector shall receive from the chairman a voting paper, in the form in the schedule hereunto annexed, and shall thereupon retire to a stall or compartment provided for that purpose, and there strike out the name or names of such candidates as he does not intend to vote for, and deposit the same in the ballot-box, in the presence of the chairman, town clerk, or his deputy, and

scrutineers; and in case such elector shall be unable to read, or be blind, he shall signify the same to the chairman, who shall thereupon mark or strike out the names of such candidates as such elector shall designate; and no elector shall take out of such polling place any such voting paper, either before or after he has marked the same; and any person wilfully infringing any of the provisions of this clause, or obstructing the polling by any unnecessary delay in performing any act within the meaning of this bye-law, and on being convicted thereof before any two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the district, shall forfeit and pay a sum or penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds.

5. Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, by writing under his hand, to be delivered to the chairman at any time before Eight o'clock in the morning of the polling day, one scrutineer to be present on his behalf in the polling place.

6. It shall be lawful for the chairman or for any candidate or scrutineer to put to any person before he shall have received his voting paper the following questions only:—

1. What is your christian and surname?
2. Are you of the age of twenty-one years?
3. Are you a ratepayer on the ratepayers' roll of the municipal district of Williamstown?
4. Have you paid all rates levied upon you, except such as shall have become payable by you within six months before this election?
5. Have you already voted at this election?

And if any person shall wilfully give a false answer to any of the questions aforesaid he shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the meaning of this bye-law, and on being convicted thereof before any two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the district, shall forfeit and pay a sum or penalty of not exceeding Fifty pounds.

7. At every election it shall be the duty of the town clerk or his deputy to provide himself with the ratepayers' roll, and as each elector comes forward to demand his voting paper, to see whether the name of such elector appears upon the roll as a ratepayer within the meaning of the said Act, and as each elector deposits his voting paper within the ballot-box to mark off such elector's name as having voted at such election.

8. In case the voting paper as of any person shall have been received, and any other person shall afterwards demand his voting paper as of the same person, the chairman, when such person shall propose to deposit his voting paper in the ballot-box, shall refuse to allow the same to be put therein, but shall receive and keep the same apart, and at the close of the election decide whether such person has already voted or not; and for the purpose of such decision it shall be lawful for the chairman to take evidences on oath or affirmation, and such decision shall be final and conclusive on all parties; and if it shall appear to the chairman that such elector has not already voted at such election, such vote shall be added to the number already polled, but if otherwise such vote shall not be allowed.

9. At the close of the poll or as soon after as conveniently may be, the chairman, in the presence of the scrutineers, shall count the number of votes polled for each candidate, and if on the state of the poll being announced the number of votes shall have been found to have been equal for any two or more candidates, one or more of whom, but not all, shall, by the state of the poll and the number of members to be elected, be entitled to be declared to be elected, the chairman shall, by a casting vote or votes, as the case may be, decide which of the candidates for whom the votes may be equal shall be elected, but no chairman shall be entitled to vote at any election except in the case of an equality of votes; and the chairman shall then, in the presence of the scrutineers, seal up all the voting papers given during the election, and safely preserve them amongst the records of the council.

10. That all places within which polling is conducted shall be deemed public places.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for Regulating Juries*, it is enacted that in case any assizes, or any county court or court of general sessions of the peace, shall hereafter be lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at any town other than those at which the same are now holden, the clerk of petty sessions at such court town, and the clerk of petty sessions at every other town or place within the jury district of such court town, and all justices, constables, officers of police and sheriffs, shall, within such time as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall order for that occasion only, do and perform all such acts, matters, and things in and towards preparing, correcting, allowing, sending and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve as aforesaid, and making out the jury books for every such jury district as are thereinbefore required to be ordinarily done at a different time or period; and all such last mentioned jury books shall be brought into use, and the persons whose names shall be therein set down shall be liable to serve immediately after the same shall have been made out by the sheriff; and the said last-mentioned books shall be used until new books shall have been prepared under the provisions thereinbefore contained: And whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the 26th day of July, 1858, it was ordered by His Excellency, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, that a county court should be holden at Maldon, the same being a place at which a county court had not previously been holden: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that (in lieu of the days previously appointed) the jury list for the jury district of Maldon be prepared and published on or before the 23rd day of August instant, and shall be corrected and revised on or before the 31st day of the same month of August; and that the jury books shall be made therefrom on or before the 7th day of September now next ensuing; and that such jury books shall be brought into use and be used in and for the said district from and after the said 7th day of the same month of September.

And the Honorable Henry Samuel Chapman, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

On the 4th of January, Messrs. J. A. Bromfield, John Davidson and Thos. Mickle, were elected members of the municipal council, in the room of Messrs. S. Macgregor, W. Bateman, jun., and John McDonald, who retired by rotation on the 5th of January. Councillor Elliott was unanimously elected chairman for the current year.

On the 20th of January, councillor J. Dobson resigned his seat, but was re-elected on the 16th of February.

On the 12th of March, the chairman and councillor T. Denney resigned their seats—the former in anticipation of his departure for Europe. The vacancies were filled by the election on the 8th of April of Messrs. S. Macgregor and H. Walsh, jun.

On the 24th of March, councillor Coulstock was elected chairman for the remainder of the year, vice councillor J. Elliott, resigned.

The tramway, after being connected with the new jetty, and put in full working order, was leased, on 7th May, to Mr. Jas. Bateman for a period of three years, at a rental of Seventy-five pounds per annum.

The tunnel constructed at the eastern side of the town has been completed, and during the present rainy season has proved most effectual in draining a large area, principally low-lying ground.
