COPY OF REGULATIONS ABOVE REFERRED TO.

1. Duty will be received at any of the above sub-treasuries on small quantities of gold to be transmitted by post to parts beyond the seas. The quantity so forwarded may in no case exceed four ounces.

2. Persons desirous of availing themselves of this permission should present their gold, together with the letter or packet in which they intend to forward it, at a sub-treasury, and pay the amount of duty required.

3. As instructions have been given to the sub-treasurers to seal and secure such packages containing the gold so to be transmitted, and to certify to the quantity, all persons must be careful to observe that these letters or packages must in no cases be re-opened previous to their being placed in the Post Office, as otherwise the gold will be liable to condemnation in the manner provided by the Act.

BALLAARAT QUARRY RESERVES.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the Quarries hereinafter specified, situated at Ballaarat, being reserved for the uses particularized in conjunction with each of such Quarries respectively, a plan of which reserves has been recorded at this office, that is to say :—

GOVERNMENT QUARRY RESERVE, BALLAARAT.—Commencing at a point bearing south one chain and fifty links from the south-east angle of allotment eight, section three, in the parish of Ballaarat; thence by a road one chain and fifty links wide bearing south, fourteen chains and seventy-three links; thence by a road one chain and fifty links wide bearing north fifty-one degrees twelve minutes west, eighty-six links, and north, thirty-eight degrees ten minutes west, eighteen chains and six links; and thence by a road one chain and fifty links wide bearing east, eleven chains and seventy-eight links to the commencing point.

QUARRY RESERVE FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT EAST.—Commencing at a point bearing south eleven chains and fourteen links, more or less, from the south-west angle of the township reserve of Ballaarat; thence by a line bearing east, eight chains and thirty links; thence by a line bearing south, twelve chains and ninety-seven links; thence by a road one chain and fifty links wide bearing north fifty-one degrees twelve minutes west, ten chains and sixty-three links; and thence by a road one chain and fifty links wide bearing north, six chains and thirty-one links to the commencing point.

QUARRY RESERVE FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT WEST.—Commencing at a point bearing south one chain and fifty links from the south-west angle of the township reserve of Ballaarat; thence by a road one chain and fifty links wide bearing east, eight chains and thirty links; thence by a line bearing south nine chains and sixty-four links; thence by a line bearing west, eight chains and thirty links; and thence by a road one chain and fifty links wide bearing north, nine chains and sixty-four links to the commencing point.

ABSTRACT OF METEOROLOGICAL OBSERVATIONS TAKEN IN VICTORIA, DURING THE QUARTER ENDING
31st MARCH, 1858.

By R. BROUGH SMYTH, C.E., F.G.S., ETC., ETC., DIRECTOR OF METEOROLOGICAL OBSERVATORIES.

IN January the weather was very hot, and hot winds were frequent, sometimes blowing violently. Very little rain fell. The air was unusually dry. There were many bush fires throughout the country, described by the observers as of an unusually destructive character.

The weather was warm in February, but there were no hot winds. On the 11th the wind was northerly, and *slightly warm* after mid-day.

The mean temperature of March was 0·2° less than the mean temperature of February. The heat during the day was greater than in February, but the nights were cooler. There were no hot winds at Melbourne.

The mean temperature at Melbourne, as compared with 1856 and 1857, was as follows:—

January.—The thermometer in shade at Melbourne exceeded 100° on five days, 90° on six days, 80° on nine days, 70° on nine days, and 60° on two days. The highest temperature was 107·8° on the 27th, and the lowest 43·5° on the 14th. Cirri were frequently seen at morning, and after mid-day the sky was often cloudless.

February.—The thermometer in shade exceeded 90° on six days, 80° on five days, 70° on twelve days, and 60° on five days. The highest temperature was 96·2° on the 18th, and the lowest 47·3° on the 3rd. Much rain fell during the month, and the sky was often entirely covered with cloud at morning. It was often cloudless at night. Thunder-storms were frequent in many parts of the country, from the 9th to the 19th.

March.—The thermometer in shade exceeded 90° on seven days, 80° on five days, 70° on fourteen days, and 60° on five days. The highest temperature was 97·0° on the 7th, and the lowest 46·8° on the 31st. At morning it was frequently calm, or nearly calm. Fine cirrus and cirro-cumulus clouds formed when the wind was northerly. It was often cloudless at night.

The mean temperature of the dew-point for the quarter was 55·3°, being 0·2° lower than the mean for the same quarter in 1856, and 1·1° lower than the mean for the same quarter in 1857.

The mean degree of humidity (complete saturation = 1 000) at Melbourne, as compared with the same quarter in 1856 and 1857, was as follows:—

Lightning was seen, but thunder was not heard, at Melbourne, on the 4th January, 9th, 11th, 15th, 17th, 18th and 23rd February, and 11th, 12th and 25th March; at Geelong on 4th January; at Heathcote on 9th, 10th, 13th, 16th and 17th February, and 12th March; at Sandhurst on 4th January, 10th, 16th and 17th February, and 13th March; at Beechworth on 18th February, and 1st and 25th March; at Portland on 6th and 13th March; at Ballaarat on 4th January, and 12th March; at Camperdown on 14th January, 14th February, and 12th March; at Kooyooro on 9th and 13th February; at Mount Egerton on 11th and 15th February, and 12th March; and at Green Hills (near Mount Ararat) on 4th and 14th January.

Thunder was heard, but lightning was not seen, at Heathcote on 14th, 15th and 23rd February; at Beechworth on 15th January, 3rd and 14th February, and 26th March; at Portland on 24th January; at Ballaarat on 13th February; at Camperdown on 24th January; at Kooyooro on 14th, 15th, 16th and 17th February, and 24th March; near Mount Warrenep on 13th and 16th February; at Mount Ararat on 11th, 12th, 14th, 18th and 19th February, and 12th, 13th and 24th March; and at Welshpool on the 29th January.

Fog was present at Melbourne on 3rd, 4th and 30th March; at Beechworth on 5th February; at Camperdown on 23rd and 28th January, 28th February, and 4th, 17th, 20th, 25th, 26th, 28th and 29th March; at Mount Egerton on 22nd, 25th and 28th January, 6th, 7th, 14th and 15th February, and 3rd, 5th, 9th and 18th March; and at Welshpool on 4th March.

Shooting stars were observed at Melbourne on 3rd, 6th, 7th, 13th, 14th and 17th January, 9th and 21st February, and 7th, 12th, 13th, 14th, 15th and 19th March; at Heathcote on 5th January, and 8th and 21st February, and 3rd, 6th, 20th and 28th March; at Portland on 4th and 26th March; and at Kooyooro on 8th, 13th and 14th February, and 4th, 12th and 26th March.

Solar Halos were observed at Melbourne on 1st, 3rd, 10th and 27th January, 19th February, and 1st, 8th and 29th March; and at Camperdown on 7th March.

Lunar Halos were observed at Melbourne on 25th February, and 3rd March; at Geelong on 25th February, and 3rd March; at Heathcote on 1st March; at Beechworth on 25th February; at Ballaarat on 25th and 26th February, and 3rd March; at Camperdown on 3rd and 30th March; at Kooyooro 2nd January, 25th, 26th, 27th and 28th February, and 30th March; at Mount Egerton on 25th February; at Mount Ararat on 25th February; and at Welshpool on 26th March.

A Lunar Rainbow was seen at Welshpool on 26th March.

Hail fell near Melbourne on 3rd and 16th February.

Hot or Warm Winds blew at Melbourne on 1st, 4th, 9th, 15th, 23rd, 26th, 27th and 30th January, and on 11th February (only slightly warm); at Geelong on 4th and 9th January (apparently not always recorded); at Heathcote on 4th, 26th, 27th, 29th and 30th January; at Beechworth on 4th January (apparently not always recorded); (not recorded at Portland); at Ballaarat on 4th, 14th, 23rd, 26th and 29th January, 11th February, and 8th March; at Kooyooro 4th, 9th and 14th January; near Mount Warrenep on 14th, 23rd and 26th January; at Mount Ararat on 4th, 9th and 27th January, and 11th February; and at Welshpool on 10th, 24th and 27th January, and 17th March.

Green Clouds were observed at Melbourne on the 3rd January at 1^o 30' p.m. They were of the *cirro-cumulus* form, and at a great altitude. One cloud as it approached the sun's place was brilliantly colored—green and pale rose predominating.

Plum ripe at Melbourne, 8th January; at Heathcote, 31st January; at Beechworth, in January; and at Portland, in January.

Fig ripe at Melbourne, 14th January.

Peach ripe at Melbourne, in highly favorable localities, 15th January, and generally, 10th February; at Sandhurst, 21st February; at Beechworth, in January; at Portland, in January—February; and at Castlemaine, 30th January.

Grape ripe at Melbourne, 25th February; at Sandhurst, 28th February; at Heathcote, 24th February; and at Beechworth, in January.

Apple ripe at Heathcote, end of January; at Beechworth, in January; and at Portland, in January. The apple, and some other fruit trees, were in blossom (second time) on 4th March.

Early crops of *Barley* were springing near Melbourne, at the end of March.

The instruments used are Standard Barometers by Newman; and Thermometers by Cassell and Co., and Negretti and Zambra, corrected by Kew Standards.

TOLLS ON ROADS UNDER THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number Forty), intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for His Excellency, with the advice of His Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to declare the rates of tolls to be collected by any district road board, as thereinafter mentioned, and such rates and tolls from time to time to vary and alter, and any such Proclamation to revoke: And whereas by another Act passed in the seventeenth year of the same reign (Number Twenty-nine), intituled, *An Act to amend an Act intituled "An Act for making and improving Roads in the colony of Victoria,"* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor, pursuant to the provisions of the nineteenth section of the said first recited Act, to declare, alter and revoke the rates of tolls to be collected by the Central Road Board in manner thereinafter directed, in like manner as by the said section is directed as to a district road board, and that the provisions in the twentieth section of the said first recited Act as to a district road board levying toll should be deemed to authorise the said Central Road Board to levy tolls and erect toll-bars, toll-gates and toll-houses: And whereas by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the same reign (Number Thirty-one), intituled, *"An Act to establish a Board of Land and Works,"* it was amongst other things enacted that on and after the first day of January, 1858, the Central Road Board should be, and the same was thereby abolished, and all the rights, powers, duties and authorities thereof should be and the same were thereby transferred to and vested in, and should and might be exercised by the said Board of Land and Works: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the rates of tolls authorised to be collected on all roads under the charge of the said Board of Land and Works, as hereinafter specified: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby vary and alter the rates of tolls now authorised to be collected in the manner and from and after the times hereinafter specified; and with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby declare that from and after the date of this present Proclamation, as to all toll-bars, toll-gates, and toll-houses now in the possession of the Board of Land and Works and not at present let on lease, and from and after the first day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, as to all toll-bars, toll-gates, and toll-houses at present let on lease, it shall be lawful for the said Board of Land and Works to direct tolls to be paid for all animals and vehicles passing or re-passing through or by any toll-bars, toll-gates or toll-houses now or hereafter erected and built in and upon main or other roads under the charge of the said Board of Land and Works at a rate not exceeding the rates hereinafter declared, that is to say:—

NUMBERS OF TEACHERS, ETC., ALLOWED TO SCHOOLS.

So long as the average daily attendance in a school continues under thirty, the salary awarded will not exceed that of a probationary teacher; but whenever an average daily attendance of thirty pupils can be shown from the records of the school for a period of three months, the teacher will then be paid the amount of salary to which he or she may be entitled, according to the scale of classification.

The commissioners will not ordinarily grant a salary to a workmistress in a mixed school, unless there be an average attendance of twenty female pupils.

When the average daily attendance in a school reaches forty, the commissioners will grant a paid monitor.

The commissioners will not grant a salary to an assistant teacher in any school in which there is not an average daily attendance of at least fifty pupils; and in schools where the average attendance does not rise considerably above this, and which are already provided with paid monitors, assistants cannot be recognized by the board.
