TRANSMISSION OF GOLD IN LETTERS.

THE following amended list of places, approved by His Excellency in Council, at which duty will be received on small quantities of gold transmitted through the medium of the Post Office to parts beyond the seas, according to the regulations of 5th January, 1857 (of which a copy is subjoined), is published for general information:

"1. Duty will be received at any of the above sub-treasuries on small quantities of gold to be transmitted by post to parts beyond the seas. The quantity so forwarded may in no case exceed four ounces.

"2. Persons desirous of availing themselves of this permission should present their gold, together with the lotter or packet in which they intend to forward it, at a sub-treasury, and pay the amount of duty required.

"3. As instructions have been given to the sub-treasurers to seal and secure such packages containing the gold so to be transmitted, and to certify to the quantity, all persons must be careful to observe that these letters or packages must in no cases be re-opened previous to their being placed in the Post Office, as otherwise the gold will be liable to condemnation in the manner provided by the Act.

ABSTRACT OF METEOROLOGICAL OBSERVATIONS TAKEN IN VICTORIA, DURING THE QUARTER ENDING 31sr MARCH, 1858.

By R. Brough Smyth, C.E., F.G.S., Etc., Etc., Director of Meteorological Observatories.

IN January the weather was very hot, and hot winds were frequent, sometimes blowing violently. Very little rain fell. The air was unusually dry. There were many bush fires throughout the country, described by the observers as of an unusually destructive character.

The weather was warm in February, but there were no hot winds. On the 11th the wind was northerly, and slightly warm after mid-day.

The mean temperature of Maich was 0.2° less than the mean temperature of February. The heat during the day was greater than in February, but the nights were cooler. There were no hot winds at Melbourne.

The mean temperature at Melbourne, as compared with 1856 and 1857, was as follows:-

January.—The thermometer in shade at Melbourne exceeded 100° on five days, 90° on six days, 80° on nine days, 70° on nine days, and 60° on two days. The highest temperature was 107.8° on the 27th, and the lowest 49.5° on the 14th. Cirri were frequently seen at morning, and after mid-day the sky was often cloudless.

February.—The thermometer in shade exceeded 90° on six days, 80° on five days, 70° on twelve days, and 60° on five days. The highest temperature was 96°2° on the 18th, and the lowest 47°3° on the 3rd. Much rain fell during the month, and the sky was often entirely covered with cloud at morning.

It was often cloudless at night. Thunder-storms were frequent in many parts of the country, from the 9th to the 19th.

March.—The thermometer in shade exceeded 90° on seven days, 80° on five days, 70° on fourteen days, and 60° on five days. The highest temperature was 97.0° on the 7th, and the lowest 46.8° on the 31st. At monning it was frequently calm, or nearly calm. Fine cirrus and cirro-cumulus clouds formed when the wind was northerly. It was often cloudless at night.

The mean temperature of the dew-point for the quarter was 55.3°, being 0.2° lower than the mean for the same quarter in 1856, and 1.1° lower than the mean for the same quarter in 1857.

The mean degree of humidity (complete saturation = 1 000) at Melbourne, as compared with the same quarter in 1856 and 1857, was as follows:—

Green Clouds were observed at Melbourne on the 3rd January at 1° 30' p.m. They were of the cirro-cumulus form, and at a great altitude. One cloud as it approached the sun's place was brilliantly colored—green and pale rose predominating.

Plum ripe at Melbourne, 8th January; at Heathcote, 31st January; at Beechworth, in January; and at Portland. in January.

Fig ripe at Melbourne, 14th January.

Peach ripe at Melbourne, in highly favorable localities, 15th January, and generally, 10th February; at Sandhurst, 21st February; at Beechworth, in January; at Portland, in January—February; and at Castlemaine, 30th January.

Grape ripe at Melbourne, 25th February; at Sandhurst, 28th February; at Heathcote, 24th February; and at Beechworth, in January.

Apple ripe at Heathcote, end of January; at Beechworth, in January; and at Portland, in January. The apple, and some other fruit trees, were in blossom (second time) on 4th March.

Early crops of Barley were springing near Melbourne, at the end of March.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sin Hunay Barrly, Knight Commander of the Most Homorable Order of the Bath. Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c. &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number Forty), initiuled, An Act for making and improving Roads in the colony of Victoria, it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for His Excellency, with the advice of His Excellency Council, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to declare the rates of tolls to be collected by any district road board, as thereinafter mentioned, and such rates and tolls from time to time to vary and alter, and any such Proclamation to revoke: And whereas by another Act passed in the seventeenth year of the same reign (Number Twenty-nine), initiuted, An Act to amend an Act initiuted "An Act for making and improving Roads" in the colony of Vetoria," it was amongst other things suacet that it should be lawful for the Governor, pursuant to the provisions of the nineteenth section of the said first recited Act, to declare, alter and revoke the rates of tolls to be collected by the Central Road Board in manner thereinafter directed, in like manner as by the said section is directed as to a district road board, and that the provisions in the twentieth section of the said first recited Act as to a district road board levying toll should be deemed to authorise the said Central Road Board to levy tolls and erect toll-bars, toll-gates and toll-houses: And whereas by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the same reign (Number Thirty-one), intituled, "An Act to establish a Board of Land "and Works," it was amongst other things enacted that on and after the first day of January, 1858, the Central Road Board should be, and the same was thereby abolished, and all the rights, powers, duties and authorities thereof should be and the same were thereby transferred to an hereinafter declared, that is to say :-

So long as the average daily attendance in a school continues under thirty, the salary awarded will not exceed that of a probationary teacher; but whenever an average daily attendance of thirty pupils can be shown from the records of the school for a period of three months, the teacher will then be paid the amount of salary to which he or she may be entitled, according to the scale of classification.

The commissioners will nor ordinarily grant a salary to a workmistress in a mixed school, unless there be an average attendance of twenty female pupils.

When the average daily attendance in a school reaches forty, the commissioners will grant a paid monitor.

The commissioners will grant a salary to an assistant teacher in any school in which there is not an average daily attendance of at least fifty pupils; and in schools where the average attendance does not rise considerably above this, and which are already provided with paid monitors, assistants cannot be recognized by the board.
