TOLLS ON ROADS WITHIN THE ELTHAM ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of His Executive Council, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to declare the Rates of Tolls to be collected by any District Road Board, as hereinafter mentioned: And whereas the Eltham District Road Board deem it advisable that money should be raised by tolls within their district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare and proclaim that it shall be lawful for the Eltham District Road Board to direct tolls to be paid for all animals and vehicles passing or repassing through or by any toll-bars, toll-gates, or toll-houses, now or hereafter erected and built by the said Board in and upon public roads within the said Eltham Road District, at rates not exceeding the rates hereinafter declared, that is to say:—

Three-fourths only of the above rates for any vehicle to be paid when the tires of the wheels of such vehicle are not less than four and a half inches wide, and perfectly flat and level throughout their whole width.

EXTRACTS FROM THE REGULATIONS RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

NOTICE.

WITH the view of affording every possible facility to the public for obtaining payment of accounts at the Treasury, the Hon. the Treasurer has directed the following extracts from the Regulations respecting Public Accounts to be notified for general information:—

1. Persons having claims upon any department of the public service must make their claims upon a proper form of account, signed by them, and certified by the officer who incurred the expense, as well as by the head of his department. The following are to be the forms used:—

2. When the claim is for services performed, exact dates and period of service and rate of remuneration must be set out. When it is for articles supplied, the dates and places of delivery and quantities and prices of the goods must be stated.

3. All accounts must be signed by the claimant himself. His signature is to be written against the total of his claim. The only case in which an account not signed by a claimant can be entertained is when the claimant has left the colony. In that case an agent acting under a power of attorney, which must first be registered in the offices of the Treasurer and the Commissioners of Audit, may claim for him, but the account should be in the name of the agent as such attorney.

4. Accounts transmitted for payment in an incomplete state or vitiated in any essential particular,—by erasure, interlineations, or otherwise,—will be returned to the department from which they were received in order that they may be completed or made out anew.

5. If the claimant cannot write, his mark must be attached to the account and properly witnessed.

6. Although an agent may not prefer a claim on behalf of another, he may, when an account is passed for payment, receive the amount due thereon, on the presentation of an order or authority signed by the claimant in either of the following forms, in which the amount must be written in words at full length:—

7. The transferable form of order is adopted for convenience of merchants, bankers and others, who can thus authorise their clerks to receive the amount for them. But it is not to be understood that this or any other form of order passes any property in the claim upon the Treasury. That continues in the original claimant, who is at liberty to cancel any such order, and appear personally to receive the amount thereof.

8. After an account has passed into the Pay Office for payment, the first order which may be presented will, if not previously cancelled, be acknowledged.

9. Orders cannot be noted, registered, accepted, or in any way acknowledged with reference to accounts not ready for payment.

10. If it is wished that an account should be paid at any other Pay Office than that at Melbourne, the name of the Pay Office at which it is required to be made payable must be written distinctly on the face of the document.

TRANSMISSION OF BOOKS BY POST FROM VICTORIA TO THE UNITED KINGDOM AND OTHER PLACES.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the ninth day of August, 1858.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend an Act, intituled, 'An Act to amend the Law relating to the Post Office,'" it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to make, or cause to be made, arrangements with the Postmaster General in England, or with the authorities of any British possession or foreign country, for the appointment, determining and collection of postage and rates of postage upon letters, packets, and newspapers conveyed between the colony aforesaid and such kingdom, possession, or country, and for the exemption of such letters, packets, and newspapers from all or any rates: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that in pursuance of such arrangements made as aforesaid, packets containing printed books posted in the colony of Victoria for the places specified in the accompanying schedule, shall, after the publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*, be liable to the rates of postage, and subject to the regulations also set forth in the schedule herunto annexed.

And the Honorable George Samuel Evans, LL.D., Her Majesty's Postmaster General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS.

Every book packet must be sent either without a cover or in a cover open at the ends or sides.

No book packet must exceed two (2) feet in length, breadth, or depth, or three (3) pounds in weight.

A book packet may contain any number of separate books, almanacks, maps, or prints, and any quantity of paper, vellum, or parchment (to the exclusion of letters, whether sealed or open), and the books, maps, papers, &c., may be either printed, written, or plain, or any mixture of the three.

On the cover, or outside of the packet, in addition to the name and address of the person to whom the same is to be delivered, the sender thereof shall be at liberty to subscribe a statement of the contents thereof, together with his name and address.

The books, &c., may be in any binding, mounting or covering, whether such binding be loose or attached. In the case of prints or maps, rollers may accompany them, and markers, whether of paper or otherwise, may be sent with books or other printed papers.

If a book packet be found to contain any enclosure which is sealed or otherwise closed against inspection, or any letter, whether sealed or not, the letter or other enclosure will be taken out, and forwarded to the address on the packet, charged

with the full postage as an unpaid letter, together with an additional rate equal to the amount chargeable on a book not exceeding half (½) a pound in weight. The remainder of the packet, if fully prepaid, will be forwarded without any extra charge.

If a packet be not sufficiently prepaid according to its weight, but nevertheless a single book rate be prepaid, it will be forwarded charged with the deficient book postage, and with an additional book rate.

In the event of a book packet being posted altogether unpaid, or prepaid less than a single rate, it will be detained and sent to the Dead Letter Office.

The packet, if correctly posted, will be delivered according to its address without further charge.

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

ARARAT.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by Two hundred and twenty-five householders at Ararat, in the county of Ripon, praying for the erection of the said township into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are convinced that necessity exists for the erection of Ararat into a municipal district, and that its incorporation will tend to the improvement and good government thereof; and they suggest the following boundary line, viz.—“Commencing at a point 12,150 links, more or less, north from the north-east corner of allotment 2, section 2, parish of Burrenbeep, to be continued thence by a line bearing north 12,000 links; thence by a line bearing east 32,000 links; thence by a line bearing south 12,000 links; and thence by a line bearing west 32,000 links to the point of commencement, containing an area of about six square miles, within which no spot shall be distant six miles from any other spot,” and a population of more than 300 householders.

And the petitioners pray as follows—
“Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that Ararat may be proclaimed a municipal district according to the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15.”

CASTLEMAINE MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAWS.—[12th August, 1858.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Castlemaine, begun and holden at the Board Room, Camp, Castlemaine, in the said district, on the 12th day of August, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

59. Every company legally constituted may have issued to them the requisite number of miners' rights to hold ground or any other privilege under these bye-laws, and every such miner's right shall be registered and numbered in the name of the chairman, manager or actuary, for the time being, but under no circumstances shall such registered miners' rights be assignable or transferable, except on mortgage, bond, or other security for money lent; and it is hereby further ordained that such registered miners' rights shall not entitle the holder to vote at any election to return members to serve on the mining board of this district.

60. *Valid objections to applications may be entertained.*—Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, it shall be lawful for any authorised miner or miners, on the day of application, to oppose the granting of any privilege under these bye-laws; and should such objections be valid or otherwise, the warden shall either grant or refuse such application as to him may appear just and expedient. And further, should it be proved to the satisfaction of the warden that any such privilege shall have been obtained through false representations, every such grant or privilege shall be deemed null and void, and the parties guilty of the same shall be liable to the penalty attached to every breach of these bye-laws; and the warden is hereby ordered to inflict the penalty.

61. *Protection to parties applying for ground, &c.*—Any party or parties posting any authorised notice or marking off any ground to be applied for under these bye-laws, shall be deemed in possession of the same from the time of marking and posting of

such notice, and until the decision of the warden shall have been obtained.

62. *Valuation of mining plant allowed.*—Any claim of whatever kind deemed by the warden, or warden and assessors, to be relinquished or forfeited in accordance with these bye-laws, and shall adjudge the same to any other person; it shall be lawful for him or them to estimate the value of any mining plant, slabs, or other material, dam, race, or road made thereto by such former owner, and should the incoming occupant consider the same to be beneficial to him, and is not required by the former holder of the claim, he or they shall adjudge such sum of money to be paid as to him or them shall appear just and equitable; and unless such sum be paid within one month from the time of such adjudication, the claim and mining implements shall revert to the former owner; Provided, however, that no compensation will be allowed to the former holder unless he either dispose of or remove the said mining plant within one month of such claim being adjudged to the occupant.

63. *Non-forfeiture of claims through neglect of hired workmen.*—Any party or parties holding any claim or portion thereof, or share or interest therein, and who employ hired labor to work the same, shall register his or their interest with the warden of the district, and his or their title thereto shall not be deemed relinquished or abandoned through any neglect or omission on the part of the workmen employed; Provided always after due notice to such employer his interest be fully represented in conformity with these bye-laws, and moreover all privileges, water-rights, or easements, of what nature or kind soever, to which the employer is entitled, shall be deemed to be and are hereby vested in him.

64. *Mortgages on claims.*—The mortgagee of any claim, whether quartz or alluvial, shall by registering his interest in such claim with the warden of the district, be thereby protected from the consequences of any neglect or omission committed by the mortgagor or his agents, in contravention of any of the bye-laws enacted by this board, and shall not be deemed or held to have relinquished, forfeited, or lost, his property, lien, or claim upon the mining claim of the mortgagor through or by such, his, the mortgagor's neglect: Provided always, after due notice to the mortgagee, his interest be duly represented in conformity with these bye-laws.

65. *Justifiable absence from claim.*—Any party or parties working a claim shall not forfeit his or their interest therein by being absent through accident, sickness, or attendance at a court of justice or the mining board.

66. The warden is hereby authorised to inflict the penalty attached to the breach of any of these bye-laws in accordance with the enactment 21 Victoria No. 32, section 126; and no claim of whatever kind shall be deemed relinquished or forfeited unless where it is distinctly specified in these bye-laws.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-laws.
