### QUARTERLY SURVEY OF HIGH AND LOW PRESSURE STEAM VESSELS.

NOTICE is hereby given that under the fifth clause of the above cited Act the owner of every steam vessel employed as stated is bound to have the whole of her machinery surveyed by the Engineer Surveyor appointed for that purpose by the Victoria Steam Navigation Board, in the manner and at the times following:—

2. When the claim is for services performed, exact dates and period of service and rate of remuneration must be set out. When it is for articles supplied, the dates and places of delivery and quantities and prices of the goods must be stated.
