NOMINATION AND POLLING PLACES FOR THE EASTERN PROVINCE ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the nineteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, *An Act to provide for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria respectively*: I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation abolish the place already appointed for the nomination of Candidates to serve in the Legislative Council of Victoria for the Eastern Province, and I do hereby appoint that Wangaratta shall be the place of nomination as aforesaid for the said Eastern Province; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do also abolish the polling places already appointed for the divisions of the said Eastern Province mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereunto annexed, and I do hereby appoint that the several places mentioned in the last column of the Schedule hereunto annexed shall be respectively polling places for the purpose of taking the poll at any contested election for the said Eastern Province, and that all votes in respect of qualifications within the boundaries and limits mentioned or referred to in the second column of the same Schedule shall be taken at any election for such province at the polling place or polling places set opposite thereto in the said last column, that is to say:—
