REGULATIONS FOR VESSELS CARRYING PASSENGERS TO PORT CURTIS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.,

TATHEREAS by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to amend the law relating to the Carriage of "Passengers by Sea," it is amongst other things enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Governor of each of Her Majesty's Possessions abroad, by any Proclamation to be by him from time to time issued for that purpose (which shall take effect from the issuing thereof), to declare what shall be deemed for the purposes of the said Act to be the length of the voyage of any ship carrying passengers from such possession to any other place whatsoever, and to prescribe such scale of diet for the use of the passengers during the voyage as he shall think proper, and also to declare what medicines, medical comforts, medical instruments, and other matters shall be deemed necessary for the medical treatment of the passengers during such Colonial voyage: Now therefore I, Sir Henry BARKLY, the Governor of Victoria, by this my Proclamation, issued for that purpose, do declare that the following shall be deemed, for the purposes of the said Act, the length of the voyage of any sailing vessel, auxiliary screw propelling vessel, screw steam vessel, or paddle-wheel steam vessel carrying passengers from any port or place in Victoria to the Port called and known as Port Curtis, situated on the eastern coast of Australia between the twenty-third and twenty-fourth parallels of south latitude, that is to say :-

And I do hereby further declare, that, in addition to and irrespective of any provisions of their own which any passengers may have on board, the master of every such ship shall make to each passenger during the voyage including the time of detention, if any, at any port or place before the termination of such voyage, the following issues of pure water, and sweet and wholesome provisions, being in accordance with the dietary scale fixed in the said recited Act; (that is to say,) of water three quarts daily to each statute adult, exclusive of the quantity specified in the 31st section of the said Act as necessary for cooking purposes, namely, ten gallons for every day of the prescribed length of voyage for every one hundred statute adults on board.

Substitutions at the following rates may, at the option of the Master of any Passenger Ship, be made in the above Dietary Scale, that is to say:—

1 lb. of Preserved Meat for 1 lb. of Salt Pork or Beef. 1 lb. of Flour, or of Bread or Biscuit, or ½ lb. of Beef or of Pork, for 1½ lb. of Oatmeal, or 1 lb. of Rice, or 1 lb. of Peas. 1 lb. of Rice ... for 11 lb of Oatmeal, or vice versa. ... ` 1 lb. of Preserved Potatoes ... for 1 lb. of Potatoes. ••• ... for 8 ozs. of Raisins. 10 ozs. of Currants 3½ ozs. of Cocoa, or of Coffee roasted or ground ... for 2 ozs, of Tea. 3 lb. of Treacle for 1 lb. of Sugar. ... for 1 gill of Vinegar. 1 gill of Mixed Pickles ...

And, lastly, I do hereby further declare, that the Medicines, Medical Comforts, Medical Instruments, and other matters necessary for the medical treatment of the Passengers during any such Colonial voyage, shall be as follow, viz.:—
