REGULATIONS FOR ADVERTISING IN THE PUBLIC JOURNALS.

ALL Government advertisements which are required for publication in the local journals in Melbourne are to be forwarded for insertion by the Head of the Department concerned; in other parts of the colony advertisements intended for the country papers are to be forwarded for insertion by the officer authorised for that purpose.

Accounts for advertising must in the first instance be sent for certificate to the Head of the Department, or to the officer from whom the order to insert the advertisement was received, who will be held responsible for the correctness of the account so far as regards the number of insertions charged for.

The accounts are then to be forwarded to the Government Printer, who will examine them and ascertain that the number of advertisements charged for have been inserted, that the computations are correct, that the rates charged, &c., are in accordance with the tender, and that the amount is due. If found correct the accounts are at once to be forwarded to the Treasury for payment; but if errors are discovered the Printer will forward the account with his report thereon to the Treasurer.

APPLICATION FOR ENLARGEMENT.

IT is hereby notified that the inhabitants of the parishes of Bellarine and Paywit, in the county of Grant, in public meeting assembled, have agreed to the subjoined resolutions, having for their object the annexation to the Portarlinton Road District of the portion of the parish of Paywit comprised within the following boundaries, viz. :—

"Commencing at the south-east angle of portion D, section 4, block 2, Paywit; and bounded by a line bearing thence east about two miles to the western shore of Swan Bay; thence by Swan Bay and Port Phillip Bay to the north-western angle of the said parish; thence by part of the western boundary of the said parish south about six and a half miles, and further south about one mile along the western boundary of section 4, block No. 2, of the said parish, to the point of commencement."

Resolutions agreed to at a meeting of the inhabitants of the parishes of Bellarine and Paywit, held at the Road Board Office, Bellarine, on 15th September, 1858 :—

"That it is the opinion of this meeting that in consequence of the increasing traffic on the roads of this district, and of the necessity that exists for further provision being made for the formation and repairs of such roads, that that portion of the parish of Paywit shown on the survey now before the meeting [described above] should be annexed to the Portarlinton Road District.

"That a deputation from this meeting, consisting of the chairman (Mr. J. G. Macdonald), and Mr. S. L. Carlows, J.P., be appointed to wait upon the Honorable the President of the Board of Land and Works to request that he will advise His Excellency to proclaim the northern portion of the said parish of Paywit as being within the Portarlinton Road District.

AMHERST PETITION.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and seventy householders and landowners in the town and parish of Amherst, in the county of Talbot, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

By His Excellency's Command,

The petitioners state that they are householders and landowners in the town and parish of Amherst.

That the township has been established for upwards of five years, and that in addition to its gold fields it is situated in the centre of a rich agricultural district.

That all public works for improving the town and its vicinity have been neglected, the streets and roads remaining in a disgraceful state, whereby the value of property has become deteriorated, and the commercial and agricultural interests of the population have suffered greatly.

That the erection of the district into a municipality under the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, would conduce to health and cleanliness, and be the most certain mode of providing for its present and future requirements.

ness, and be the most certain mode of providing for its present and future requirements.

The petitioners suggest the following boundaries for the proposed district, viz. :—"Commencing at the north-west boundary of the township of Amherst; thence due east four miles to the north-east corner of allotment 18, section 4; thence in a south-westerly direction three miles to a point marked in the map as allotment 10, section 7; thence in a north-westerly direction three miles and five chains to the south-west boundary of the township; thence due north one mile to the commencing point."

They further state that the proposed district does not exceed nine square miles, that no one point therein is more than six miles distant from any other point, and that upwards of three hundred householders and landowners are resident within it.

And the petitioners pray as follows :—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency will be pleased to have the above district proclaimed a municipality under the provisions of the said Act, by the name of 'The Municipality of Amherst.'"

CRESWICK PETITION.

The petitioners state that a public meeting was held at Creswick, on the 30th of June last, whereat it was agreed that the erection of Creswick into a municipality was desirable, the meeting being impressed with the conviction that such a step was advisable for the better government and improvement of the township and its vicinity.

They further state that the area which they propose for a municipal district does not exceed nine square miles, that it contains three hundred householders, and that no point therein is distant more than six miles from any other point.

And the petitioners pray as follows :—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency may declare the district a municipal district, under the name of the 'Municipality of Creswick,' pursuant to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, &c."

MARYBOROUGH MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAW.—[4th September, 1858.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Maryborough, begun and holden at Maryborough, in the said district, on the 4th day of September, One thousand eight hundred and fifty eight, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Water privileges.*—Any party of miners desirous of securing water for mining purposes from any river, creek or other source, shall make application in writing to the mining board for authority to do so, whereupon such mining board may give a written permission authorising the applicants to divert such water; and all such water permits shall be subject to any conditions the mining board may deem necessary to impose at the time of giving such permit; and should any party or parties fail to act in accordance with such conditions, the mining board may cancel such permit.

2. *Special notice for water privileges.*—All applicants for water privileges under the preceding rule must deposit a written notice of intention with the clerk of the mining board at least eight days previous to the same being entertained: such notice to state—first, date of application; second, the usual name of river, creek or other source from which it is proposed to divert the water; third, a plan particularizing the exact spot whence such diversion is to be made, giving the bearings and distances of the proposed course, also showing any places of note within a quarter of a mile, or private property, such water course may come near or pass through.

3. *Priority of water right.*—Any recommendation given by the mining board for the diversion of water shall take precedence according to date of the permit, and in the order in which the same is granted; and if at any time the supply of water shall become insufficient, the party holding the permit last given shall cease to possess such right during such deficiency of water as against an antecedent grant.

4. *Protection to water races.*—Parties obtaining a water right shall be entitled to a width of ten (10) feet, measuring from the centre, on each side of their race, against any other party, except for mining purposes; should such ground at any time be required for mining purposes, authority to work the same must first be obtained in writing from the district surveyor, who may impose such conditions as he may deem necessary for the protection of the race, such conditions to be subject to the approval of the mining board.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-law.

MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 18.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE CONDUCTING OF PUBLIC MEETINGS OF THE RATEPAYERS AND OF ELECTIONS OF MEMBERS OF COUNCIL, AND ALSO FOR REGULATING THE PROCEEDINGS AT THE ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN.

At all public meetings of the ratepayers convened by the council or the chairman for the election of councillors or other municipal business, the chairman, or in his absence the senior councillor then present, shall preside, and in case of an equality of votes shall have the casting vote.

2. If at any election the chairman of the municipal council for the time being shall be a candidate for re-election, or shall be incapacitated from presiding at such election, either from illness, absence from the district, or any other cause, it shall be competent for the remaining members of the municipal council (being a quorum) to appoint some one of themselves to act as chairman for the purpose of carrying out such election, and it shall be lawful for the chairman upon a vote of the council, to appoint under his hand and seal such and so many persons as to the council may seem necessary to act as deputy chairman or chairmen, poll clerk or poll clerks, and to appoint such and so many places within the municipal district as may seem to the said council necessary to be the polling place or places.

3. If, at any election, a poll shall be demanded in the manner and form required by the said Act, the chairman shall cause to be provided at the polling place or places a sufficient number of stalls or compartments, together with ink and pens for the purpose of enabling the elector to mark the voting papers as hereinafter provided, in any which polling place no person other than the chairman, the town clerk, or his deputy, the scrutineers, or electors who shall for the time being be tendering their votes, shall be entitled to be present, and any other person than such chairman, town clerk, or his deputy, scrutineers, and electors who shall for the time being be tendering their votes, who shall intrude behind the barrier and upon being required to withdraw by the chairman shall refuse to do so shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the provisions of this bye-law, provided always that it shall be lawful for the chairman, town clerk, or his deputy, to summon to his assistance in such compartment or room any member or members of the police force for the purpose of preserving the public peace, quelling any breach thereof that may have arisen, and for removing out of such room any person or persons who may in his opinion be obstructing the polling or wilfully violating any of the provisions of this bye-law, and upon being convicted thereof before two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the district, shall forfeit and pay a sum or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

4. The chairman in each polling place shall cause to be provided for the purpose of such election a locked-up box, of which he shall keep the key, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the voting papers, and which box shall stand in front of the chairman, and each elector shall receive from the chairman a voting paper in the form in the schedule hereunto annexed, and shall thereupon retire to a stall or compartment provided for that purpose, and there strike out the name or names of such candidates as he does not intend to vote for, and deposit the same in the ballot-box in the presence of the chairman, town clerk, or his deputy and scrutineers, and in case such elector shall be unable to read or be blind he shall signify the same to the chairman, who shall thereupon mark or strike out the names of such candidates as such elector shall designate, and no elector shall take out of such polling place any such voting paper either before or after he has marked the same, and any person wilfully infringing any of the provisions of this clause, or obstructing the polling by any unnecessary delay in performing any act within the polling place, shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the meaning of this bye-law, and on being convicted thereof before any two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the district shall forfeit and pay a penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds.

5. Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint by writing under his hand, to be delivered to the chairman at any time before eight o'clock in the morning of the polling day, one scrutineer to be present on his behalf in the polling place.

6. It shall be lawful for the chairman or for any scrutineer to put to any person before he shall have received his voting paper the following questions only:—

First. What is your name and surname?

Second. Are you of twenty-one years of age?

Third. Are you a ratepayer on the ratepayers' roll of this municipal district of Ballaarat.

Fourth. Have you paid all rates levied upon you, except such as shall have become payable by you within six months before this election?

Fifth. Have you already voted at this election?

And if any person shall wilfully give a false answer to any of the questions aforesaid, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the meaning of this bye-law, and on being convicted thereof before any two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the district, shall forfeit and pay a sum or penalty of not exceeding Five pounds.

7. At every election it shall be the duty of the town clerk or his deputy to provide himself with the ratepayers' roll, and

as each elector comes forward to demand his voting paper to see whether the name of such elector appears upon the roll as a ratepayer within the meaning of the said Act, and as each elector deposits his voting paper within the ballot-box to mark off such elector's name as having voted at such election.

8. In case the voting paper, as of any person shall have been received, and any other person shall afterwards demand his voting paper, as of the same person, the chairman, when such person shall propose to deposit his voting paper in the ballot-box shall refuse to allow the same to be put therein, but shall receive and keep the same apart, and at the close of the election decide whether such person has already voted or not, and for the purpose of such decision it shall be lawful for the chairman to take evidence upon oath or affirmation and such decision shall be final and conclusive on all parties; and if it shall appear to the chairman that such person has not already voted at such election, such vote shall be added to the number already polled, but if otherwise such vote shall not be allowed.

9. At the close of the poll or as soon after as conveniently may be, the chairman in the presence of the scrutineers, shall count the number of votes polled for each candidate, and if on the state of the poll being announced, the number of votes, shall have been found to have been equal for any two or more candidates, one or more of whom, but not all, shall by the state of the poll and the number of members to be elected, be entitled to be declared to be elected, the chairman shall by a casting vote or votes, as the case may be, decide which of the candidates for whom the votes may be equal shall be elected, but no chairman shall be entitled to vote at any election except in the case of an equality of votes; and the chairman shall then in the presence of the scrutineers seal up all the voting papers given during the election and safely preserve them amongst the records of the council.

10. That all places within which polling is conducted shall be deemed public places.

11. The chairman of the council shall be annually elected in the following manner: At the first meeting of council after the annual election, which meeting shall be convened by the retiring chairman or the person presiding at the annual election, the senior councillor then present shall take the chair at the hour mentioned in the notice calling the meeting, provided the whole council is present, otherwise at the expiry of half-an-hour thereafter, and the council shall proceed by open voting on motion as usual to elect a chairman for the current year, and the councillor in whose favour the show of hands shall be declared by the acting chairman to be the chairman of the council for the current year, and shall take the chair accordingly.

12. If the result of voting for chairman should be that the highest number of votes is held equally by more than two councillors, then another voting shall take place for those councillors only holding such equality of votes until a majority is recorded, and the chairman shall be elected by the majority of the members of the municipal council.

13. Upon the resignation or disqualification of the chairman of the council at the next meeting of the council thereafter the senior councillor then present shall take the chair *pro tem.*, and immediately after the confirmation of the minutes of the preceding meeting shall proceed to the election of a chairman of council for the residue of the municipal year in manner prescribed by this bye-law.

14. In determining the seniority of councillors for the purpose of this bye-law, it shall be understood to mean those councillors who shall have held office for the longest period without re-election, and having the greatest number of votes when elected.

DIRECTIONS.

The voter is to strike out the name or names of the candidate or candidates for whom he does not intend to vote, by drawing a line through the same with a pen.

He must be careful not to leave uncanceled more names than are capable of being returned at this election, namely, names, otherwise the ballot paper will be invalid.

The ballot paper so marked is to be dropped by him into the ballot box.

The voter is not permitted to take his ballot paper out of the polling place.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 18, made by the municipal council of Ballaarat, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.
