PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO BRUNSWICK.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session held in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign (Number 13), intituled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force within the municipal district of Brunswick.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifteenth day of October, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and in the twenty-second year of Her Majesty's Reign.

## MUNICIPALITY OF PRAHRAN.

## BYE-LAW No. 59.—A BYE-LAW FOR CONDUCTING THE ELECTION OF MUNICIPAL COUNCILLORS BY BALLOT.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the council of any municipal district shall make bye-laws for the conducting of elections: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Prahran, that from and after this bye-law shall have received the assent of His Excellency the Governor:—

1. That bye-law No. 42, "For conducting the election of councillors and the election of chairman, in the absence of the chairman for the time being," shall be and is hereby repeated.
2. If at any election the chairman of the municipal council shall be a candidate for re-election or shall be incapacitated from presiding at such election, either from illness, absence from the district, or any or other cause, it shall be competent for the remaining members of the municipal council (being a quorum) to appoint some one of themselves to act as chairman for the purpose of carrying out such election, and it shall be lawful for the chairman upon a vote of the council, to appoint under his hand and seal, such and so many persons as to the council may seem necessary, to act as deputy chairmen and poll clerks and to appoint such and so many places within the municipal district as may seem to the said council necessary to be the polling places: Provided always that no inn or public-house or any portion thereof shall be used for the purpose.
3. If at any election a poll shall be demanded in the manner and form required by the said Act, the chairman shall cause to be provided at the polling place or places, a sufficient number of stalls or compartments, together with ink and pens or pencils, for the purpose of enabling the electors to mark the voting papers as hereinafter provided, in any which polling place no person, other than the chairman, the poll clerk or poll clerks, the scrutineers and electors who may be tendering their votes, shall be entitled to be present, and any other person than such chairman, poll clerk or poll clerks, scrutineers and electors who may be tendering their votes, who shall intrude behind the barrier and on being required to withdraw by the chairman shall refuse so to do, shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the provisions of this bye-law, and upon being convicted thereof before any two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the district, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds; provided always that it shall be lawful for the chairman or deputy chairman to summons to his assistance within such barrier any member or members of the police force for the purpose of preserving the public peace, quelling any breach thereof that may have arisen, and for removing from within such barrier or from the polling room any person or persons who may in his opinion be obstructing the polling, or wilfully violating any of the provisions of this bye-law or of the said Act.
4. The chairman shall cause to be printed and stamped with the municipal seal a sufficient number of voting papers in the form annexed, which he shall have in his own custody, and shall deliver to each deputy chairman such number thereof as shall be sufficient for the number of ratepayers who may poll at the room within such deputy's division, taking a receipt for the exact number so delivered, and shall keep a sufficient number of voting papers for the ratepayers who may poll at the place where he himself shall preside, and shall write his initials on the back of every voting paper before it shall be delivered to any ratepayer about to vote, and in like manner each deputy chairman shall write his initials on every voting paper within the division whereat he shall preside, and it shall be the duty of the chairman and each deputy chairman to keep an exact account of all such voting papers, and upon the delivery of each ballot paper the presiding chairman shall check, or cause to be checked off, upon a printed roll signed by the chairman, the voter's name, and such check shall be *prima facie* evidence of the identity of the elector whose name shall appear on the roll, and of the fact of his having voted at the election at which such ballot papers were delivered.
5. Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint by writing under his hand, to be delivered to the chairman at any time before Eight o'clock in the morning of the polling day, one scrutineer to be present on his behalf in the polling room.
6. It shall be lawful for the chairman, at the request of any candidate or scrutineer, to put to any person before he shall receive his voting paper the following questions only:—  
First. What is your Christian and surname?  
Second. Are you of the age of twenty-one years?  
Third. Are you a ratepayer on the ratepayers' roll of the municipal district of Prahran?  
Fourth. Have you already voted at this election?  
And if any person shall wilfully give a false answer to any of the questions aforesaid, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the meaning of this bye-law, and on being convicted before any two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the district, shall forfeit and pay a sum or penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds.
7. In case the voting paper as of any person shall have been received and any other person shall afterwards demand his voting paper as of the same person, the chairman when such person shall propose to deposit his voting paper in the ballot-box shall refuse to allow the same to be put therein, but shall

receive and keep the same apart, and at the close of the election decide whether such person has already voted or not, and for the purpose of such decision it shall be lawful for the chairman to take evidence on oath or affirmation, and such decision shall be final and conclusive on all parties, and if it shall appear to the chairman that such elector has not already voted such vote shall be added to the number already polled, but if otherwise such vote shall not be allowed.

8. The chairman in each polling room shall be provided with a locked box (of which he shall keep the key) with a cleft or opening in such box capable of receiving the voting papers, and which box shall stand upon the table at which the chairman, poll clerk, and scrutineers shall preside, and each elector shall receive a voting paper in the form in the schedule hereunto annexed, and shall thereupon retire to a stall or compartment provided for that purpose, and there strike out the name or names of such candidates as he does not intend to vote for, and deposit the same in the ballot-box in the presence of the chairman, poll clerk, and scrutineers, and in case such elector shall be unable to read or be blind he shall signify the same to the chairman, who shall thereupon mark or strike out the names of such candidates as such elector shall designate; and no elector shall take out of such polling room any such voting paper, either before or after he has marked the same. Any person wilfully infringing any of the provisions of this clause, or obstructing the polling by any unnecessary delay in performing any act within the polling room, shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the meaning of this bye-law, and on being convicted thereof before any two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the district, shall forfeit and pay a sum or penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

9. At the close of the poll, or so soon after as conveniently may be, the chairman and his deputies, in the presence of the poll clerks and scrutineers, shall count the number of votes polled for each candidate, and if on the state of the poll being announced the number of votes shall be found to be equal for any two or more candidates, one of whom, but not all, shall by the state of the poll and the number or numbers to be equal shall be elected he entitled to be declared elected, the chairman shall, by a casting vote or votes, as the case may be, decide which of the candidates for whom the votes may be equal shall be elected; but no chairman shall be entitled to vote at any election except in the case of an equality of votes, and the chairman shall then, in the presence of the scrutineers, seal up all the voting papers given during the election, and the town clerk shall safely preserve them for six months at the least amongst the records of the council.

10. Any person personating or attempting to personate any elector or deceased elector, or who shall vote a second time on the same day, shall upon conviction, before two or more justices of the peace acting in and for the said district, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.

11. That all places within which polling is conducted shall be deemed public places.

12. For the purpose of more efficiently carrying out the provisions of this bye-law the municipal district shall be divided into three divisions, viz. :—

No. 1 division bounded on the north by the River Yarra, the south by the centre of Commercial road, on the east by the Boundary road, and on the west by the Punt road.

No. 2 division bounded on the north by the centre of Commercial road, on the south by the centre of High street, on the east by the Boundary road, and the west by the Punt road.

No. 3 division bounded on the north by the centre of High street, on the south by the Wellington street and Dandenong road, on the east by the Boundary road, and on the west by the Punt road.

The ratepayers' roll shall contain the names in the divisions distinct and separate, and no ratepayer shall be permitted to vote except in the division in which his name is registered.

## DIRECTIONS.

The voter is to strike out the name or names of the candidate or candidates for whom he does not intend to vote, by drawing a line through the same with pen or pencil.

He must be careful not to leave uncanceled more names than are capable of being returned at this election, namely names, otherwise his ballot paper will be invalid.

The ballot paper so marked is to be dropped into the ballot box.

The voter is not permitted to take his ballot paper out of the polling place.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 59, made by the municipal council of Prahran, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

**MUNICIPALITY OF SOUTH BARWON.**

**BYE-LAW No. 8.**—FOR THE ERECTION OF A TOLL-BAR NEAR THE BARWON BRIDGE, AND AT THE BREAKWATER WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL BOUNDARIES.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Vict. No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is in clause 29 of the said Act provided, that it shall be competent for every municipal council to establish tolls, rates, and dues upon any road within the jurisdiction of such council: And whereas it is considered necessary, in order to enable the council of the South Barwon municipality to provide funds for the due repair and maintenance of the roads of the said municipality, that a toll-gate should be erected on the south side of the Barwon bridge, and also at the breakwater within the said municipal boundary, in such situations as may meet the direct traffic passing to and from the said municipality, and that a toll should be levied on all waggons, drays, carts, gigs, or other vehicles, and on all horses, horned cattle, sheep, and pigs passing through the said toll-gates, according to the scale set forth in the annexed Schedule A., the proceeds of such tolls to be applied as follows:—

First. That the repair and maintenance of the Barwon bridge and the breakwater, whenever called for by the Board of Land and Works, form a primary charge upon the tolls collected at these bars:

Secondly. That the council do pay annually to the town council of Geelong such portions of the tolls as shall be estimated by the road engineer of the district to be necessary for the repair and maintenance of the approach to the Barwon bridge from Fyans street, Geelong, and also for the repair and maintenance of one-half of the breakwater:

Thirdly. That the council appropriate the balance of the said tolls to the maintenance of the Colac, Barrabool, German-town, and Mount Colite roads, in proportion to the traffic on those roads respectively:

Be it therefore enacted by the said council, That so soon as the sanction of His Excellency the Governor in Council is obtained, a toll-bar or bars be erected as before stated, and the tolls set forth in the said Schedule A. be levied thereat; provided, however, that the said tolls be not levied until after the 31st day of December, 1858.

*Penalty for evading tolls.*—And whereas it is competent for the said council to fix a penalty for neglect or breach of any bye-law made by such council: Be it further enacted, That any person or persons who shall in any manner evade or attempt to evade, or aid, assist, or abet any person in evading or attempting to evade the payment of any toll authorised by this bye-law, shall, on conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace; be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, according to the nature of the offence.

*Exemption from tolls.*—And whereas it is expedient that certain parties should necessarily be exempted from payment of tolls: Be it further enacted, That no toll shall be demanded or taken by virtue of this bye-law of or from any person in Her Majesty's service, or in the employment and service of Government being in the discharge of his duty, or of any person in the employment of the municipal council, or of or from any person going to or returning from any place of public worship, or any funeral, or of or from any minister of religion, or of or from any vehicle laden with manure, or on any return vehicle having a ticket for the day.

ties for the current year: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Sandhurst, that all the several properties within the limits of the said municipal district shall be assessed for the year 1858 according to the several amounts of annual value respectively affixed to the same in the assessment roll, confirmed by the said municipal council on the 24th September, 1858, and amounting to a total sum of one hundred and fifteen thousand six hundred and fourteen pounds; and also that a rate of ninepence in the pound of said annual value is hereby imposed on all the said properties for the year 1858, to be due and payable on the eleventh day of October, in the present year.

IT is hereby notified that a petition, signed by thirteen proprietors, landholders and residents upon the eastern side of the Geelong and Mount Duneed road, within an area marked on a tracing which accompanied the petition, has been presented to the Governor, and that the substance and prayer of such petition are as follow :—

The petitioners state that they are much interested in the Mount Duneed road (which lies immediately within the western boundary of the Conewarre Road District), and that it is much used by wood carriers coming from Geelong, and also by residents in the adjoining parish of Duneed (which forms part of the Barrabool Road District).

That the Mount Duneed road for two years and upwards has been in a condition perilous to human life and to the safety of the cattle and vehicles passing over it.

That the Conewarre Road Board have, during the two years that this road has been in its charge, expended only £250 thereon for the purpose of making good two small portions.

That the petitioners have paid the highest rate of assessment allowed by law, and have failed to obtain any relief from the Conewarre Board in answer to their application, on the ground, as alleged, of insufficient funds.

The petitioners despair of relief from the Conewarre Road Board owing to the poverty of the district. They conceive that their interests and those of the residents on the eastern side of Duneed are identical in the road which passes between them, and believe that were their locality and road included within the Barrabool Road District, the assessment levied in the neighborhood of the road would be expended thereon; that their interests generally would receive better attention, and that they themselves would be relieved from the risks and loss at present occasioned by the very bad condition of the road.

**PARTICULARS.**

The remains were found in a hollow tree, about four feet from the ground, and in a sitting posture. When first discovered, the head was bound up in a cotton handkerchief with red marks upon it, and under the handkerchief appeared a quantity of blood. The bones were mostly denuded of flesh, but a considerable quantity of black hair remained. There are marks of violence on the skull. The following articles were found with the corpse, viz:—An opossum rug, two shirts which apparently had been saturated with blood, a shooting-jacket, a light canvas coat (in the pockets of which were a piece of ribbon, portions of a newspaper, and a purse resembling a Chinese purse), a pair of tweed trousers, two or three blankets bearing marks of blood, sixty or seventy small skewers, several of which were stuck in the skin of the corpse, some comforters tied in a knot, a piece of dark calico, a pouch, a billy, and a panican. An aperture on the other side of the tree had been carefully covered over with bark which had been nailed over it. A few paces from the tree were found portions of blanket corresponding with those found in the tree, and also several strips of female dress tied in a knot. An attempt appears to have been made to burn the tree. There were also found ten rafters of a frame tent, with nails, hidden among portions of decayed trees.

The corpse is supposed to have been deposited in the place where it was found five or six months ago, and appears to have been that of a middle-aged man, not of European origin.
