PROPOSED ROAD.

COUNTY OF NORMANBY.

NOTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan, describing the exact course and bearings of, and the admeasurements required for, a road in the county of Normanby, proposed to be made by the Board of Land and Works, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the name of the owner and occupier thereof, so far as known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work, have been deposited at the Public Lands Office, Melbourne, the particulars of which are as follow:—

PROPOSED ROAD THROUGH THE PRE-EMPTIVE SECTION OF MR. DUNCAN MCCREA, AT MERINO TOWNSHIP, IN THE COUNTY OF NORMANBY.—Commencing 41 chains 89 links from the north-west corner, along the western boundary, of Mr. Duncan McCrea's pre-emptive section; from thence, bearing south 49° 19' east for 55 chains 98 links, to the southern boundary of the said pre-emptive section, distant 30 chains 53 links from the south-east, and 40 chains 93 links from the north-east, corners of the said section; the quantity of land proposed to be taken for such road being 5a. 2r. 15p.

The estimated cost of effecting the said work is £203 9s. 4d., viz., assumed value of land (5a. 2r. 15p., at 45s. per acre), £13 4s. 4d.; and 448 rods of three-rail fencing (at 8s. 6d. per rod), £190 5s.

All persons affected by the proposed road are requested to set forth in writing, addressed to the President of the Board of Land and Works, Office of Roads and Bridges, Melbourne, within forty days from the first publication of this notice, any well-grounded objections that they may have to the said road, failing which they will be thereafter precluded from making any such objections or claiming any compensation whatsoever.

MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT EAST.

BYE-LAW No. 17.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE STOPPING OF STREETS AND THOROUGHFARES DURING THE FORMING AND REPAIRING THE SAME.

WHEREAS an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria was passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, whereby it was amongst other things enacted, "That it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the general good rule and government of such municipal district," and that no such bye-law should have any force or effect until the Lieutenant Governor should under his hand have signified his assent thereto, and when such bye-law should have been consented to the Lieutenant Governor should cause publicity to be given thereto in such manner as he should see fit: And whereas it is expedient to make a bye-law for the stopping the streets and thoroughfares of the district of Ballaarat East during the forming and repairing of the same: Be it therefore enacted, that during such time as any of the said streets, roads, lanes, highways, passages or public places within the said district shall be under repair, or during the making or repairing of any sewers or drains therein, it shall be lawful for the surveyor of the said council to cause so many bars, posts, rails and chains or other obstructions to be fixed, set up and placed across or along any of the streets, lanes, highways and passages or other public places within the said district to prevent the passing of carriages, carts and drays, horses and cattle, whilst such works are in progress, as to the surveyor may seem proper; and if any person or persons shall throw down, break, remove, damage or injure any of the said bars, posts, rails, chains or other obstructions, every person so offending shall, upon conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace, for every such offence forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Forty shillings, together with the costs and the expense of repairing the injury done.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 17, made by the municipal council of Ballaarat East, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.
