TIME SIGNAL AT WILLIAMSTOWN.

MARINERS and the public generally are informed that the following alterations in the mid-day time signal are now observed.

The Time Ball will drop from the cross-arms at the top of the shaft on the tower of the Electric Telegraph Station, Gellibrand's Point, instead of the Flagstaff as hitherto.

The Ball will be hoisted half-mast at 12.30 p.m., up to the cross-arms at 12.58, and will be dropped at One o'clock exactly (observatory mean time) daily (Sundays excepted).
