## TIME SIGNAL AT WILLIAMSTOWN.

MARINERS and the public generally are informed that  
the following alterations in the mid-day time signal are  
now observed.

The Time Ball will drop from the cross-arms at the top of  
the shaft on the tower of the Electric Telegraph Station,  
Gellibrand's Point, instead of the Flagstaff as hitherto.

The Ball will be hoisted half-mast at 12.30 p.m., up to the  
cross-arms at 12.55, and will be dropped at *One o'clock* exactly  
(observatory mean time) daily (Sundays excepted).

The drop of the Ball will indicate 15 h. 20 m. 10 sec. Green-  
wich mean time, and any error occurring, accident or other-  
wise, in the signal, will be duly notified in the daily papers of  
the ensuing day.
