SANDHURST MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAW SUPPLEMENTARY TO BYE-LAW No. III.—[16th November, 1858.]

AT a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Sandhurst, begun and holden at Sandhurst, in the said district, on the 16th day of November, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Exemption from assessment.*—That inasmuch as certain portions of the said bye-law No. 3 are objectionable, it is therefore enacted, that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the said bye-law, no owner of any machine exclusively emptying itself into the main channel of the Bendigo Flat shall be liable to any portion of assessment whatever of the quarterly fee of Two pounds (£2) leviable or payable under said bye-law.

2. *Members of mining board disqualified from taking certain offices.*—No member of the mining board shall act as a paid officer under any bye-law of the mining board or under any committee appointed under such bye-law.

3. *Duties of treasurer, &c.*—That the treasurer, collector, or any officer of any local drainage committee shall, once in each week, lodge all moneys received by him as such officer in a public bank in Sandhurst, to the credit of the committee under which he acts; and the said treasurer or officer shall have a pass-book in which such moneys shall be entered by the said bank as so lodged; and the said book shall be produced at the stated and ordinary meetings of said committee, or whenever the said committee may require; and the said treasurer, collector, or other officer shall furnish the mining boards of the district with a report of the work done once in each three months, with an audited statement of accounts and balance sheet; and no money placed in bank as above shall be drawn by the committee except by cheques signed by the chairman and by two or more of the members of the said committee, and also countersigned by the treasurer or authorised officer.

4. *Books to be kept by committee.*—That each local drainage committee shall keep a minute book in which all their proceedings shall be recorded, and also a book which shall contain an account of all works done under the direction of the committee, and of the receipt and expenditure of all moneys collected under their authority; and that these books shall be kept open to the inspection of, and reasonably accessible to, any of the mill owners assessed by the said committee.

5. *Enforcement of payment of fees.*—It shall be lawful for any justice of the peace to enforce the payment of any fees, declared before such justice to be due and payable by any owner or part owner of any machine, assessed under any regulations of any local drainage committee, in the same manner that any justice is now by law empowered to enforce the payment of any money adjudged by him to be paid; but no justice of the peace shall enforce such payment except upon the issue and service of a summons in the usual manner, and bearing of the complaint so made by the said treasurer.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-law.

AVOCA PETITION.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-six householders and landholders resident at Avoca, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

By His Excellency's Command,

The petitioners state that Avoca is one of the oldest townships on the gold fields; that in addition to its gold field, it is in the centre of a rich agricultural district; that it is well watered and wooded; that it has always been the head-quarters of the district, and that it is on the main road to Adelaide, and sixteen miles distant from any other town of importance.

That in the absence of a recognized or municipal body to watch over its affairs, its interests have suffered seriously, all property being thereby deteriorated in value, and its mineral resources scarcely developed.

That the creation of a municipality would be a certain means of remedying the evils before stated, and rendering Avoca one of the first townships on the gold fields.

The petitioners suggest that the proposed municipal district be as follows, viz. :—“From a point at the south-west corner of allotment 137 of country allotments south-west of Avoca; thence north three miles; thence east three miles; thence south three miles; thence west three miles to the point of commencement;” such area not containing more than nine square miles, in which no one point is distant more than six miles from any other point, and there being three hundred house and land holders therein.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

“Your memorialists therefore pray your Excellency may be pleased to cause the above district to be proclaimed a municipality under the provisions of the 18th Victoria No. 15, by the name of the Avoca Municipality.”

BRIGHTON—SECOND PETITION.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-five householders and landholders resident at Brighton, in the county of Bourke, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

By His Excellency's Command,

The petitioners solicit that Brighton may be proclaimed a municipal district, and state that the area prayed for does not exceed nine square miles, that it contains a population of householders of between three and four hundred, and that no one point therein is distant more than six miles from any other point.

That the persons who have signed the petition exceed in number one hundred and fifty, all of whom reside within the proposed district.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

“Your petitioners pray that the limits and boundaries of the said municipal district may be as follows, viz. :—On the west side commencing at the south-west corner of the south boundary road of the special survey and the beach along the beach between the north and south boundary roads of the said special survey; thence eastwardly along the northern boundary road of the said special survey to a road running at right angles therewith, which road is generally called and known as Tucker's road; thence southwardly along the said Tucker's road to its intersection with the red metal road, or more properly called the road from Melbourne to Frankston; thence along the said last-named road to the Plough and Harrow Hotel; and thence at right angles in a westerly direction along the south boundary road of the said special survey to the place of commencement;” and further, “that your Excellency will be pleased to appoint some fit and proper person to preside as chairman at any meeting of the said householders to be hereafter convened, and at all adjournments thereof.”

BYE-LAW No. 28.—FOR APPROPRIATING NINE HUNDRED AND SIXTY-NINE POUNDS, THE SECOND PORTION OF THE LEGISLATIVE GRANT TO THIS MUNICIPALITY FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

BYE-LAW No. 29.—FOR APPROPRIATING ONE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED AND FIFTY-EIGHT POUNDS TWO SHILLINGS AND EIGHTPENCE, THE BALANCE OF THE LEGISLATIVE GRANT TO THIS MUNICIPALITY FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

BE it and it is hereby enacted by the municipal council of Beechworth, that the One thousand five hundred and fifty-eight pounds two shillings and eightpence, forming the balance of this year's Legislative Grant to this district, be expended (when received) as follows, viz. :—

1. In the formation of portion of the Bridge street footpaths, Newtown.
2. In the formation of the unnamed street past Bridge Inn, Newtown.
3. In the formation of High street footpaths from Short street to the bridge.

MUNICIPALITY OF NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL.

BYE-LAW No. 10.—FOR REGULATING WATER DRAWERS.

WHEREAS great destruction of property has occurred at fires through the absence of a prompt supply of water for extinguishing the same: And whereas it has been found necessary, to prevent such mischiefs, to cause all water drawers to attend at fires, and to have their carts or drays constantly filled with water during the evening: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Newtown and Chilwell, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, every water drawer plying for hire shall, on being informed of any fire occurring within this district, immediately attend at such fire with a load of water, and on neglect or refusal so to do, shall, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace, pay a fine not exceeding Forty shillings: And it is further ordered and directed that each water drawer residing within this municipal district shall cause his cart or dray to be filled with water from sunset to sunrise, and on neglect thereof shall, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace, pay a fine not exceeding Forty shillings: And it is further ordered and directed that every water drawer plying for hire shall cause his name and the words "water carrier" to be painted in legible letters on some conspicuous part of the dwelling in which he resides, and in case of his neglecting so to do, shall, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace, pay a fine not exceeding Twenty shillings.

MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF PORTLAND.

BYE-LAW No. 7.—FOR EMPOWERING THE COUNCIL TO CLOSE ANY STREET, ROAD, WAY, OR FOOTPATH, DURING THE PROGRESS OF ANY WORKS AFFECTING THE SAME.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the care and control of the roads and streets of any municipal district are entrusted to the municipal council thereof: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Portland, that it shall be lawful for the said council or their duly authorized surveyor to close up and stop against public traffic any street, road, lane, way, or footpath, or any portion of street, road, lane, way, or footpath, in such manner as to them or him shall seem best during the progress therein or affecting the same of any works undertaken by the said council, or at their instance, or for the purpose of equalizing the use and wear of any such street, road, lane, way or footpath, or any portion thereof: And be it further enacted by the said council, that any person or persons damaging or removing any barrier, of whatever kind, or any notice placed for the above purpose, or in any way making use of any such street, road, lane, way, or footpath so closed or stopped up, until the same shall have been re-opened by the council or their surveyor for public traffic, shall upon conviction forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding the sum of Ten pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 7, made by the municipal council of Portland, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.
