REGULATING MINING LEASES OF AURIFEROUS
CROWN LAND IN THE MINING DISTRICT OF
BALLAARAT.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the 20th day of December,
1858.

PRESENT :

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the 21st year of Her Majesty Victoria, No. 32, it was made lawful for the Governor to grant certain leases for any term not exceeding ten years, for mining purposes, of any auriferous Crown land : AND WHEREAS by the same Act it was also made lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make such regulations, not being contrary to the said Act, as should appear to be necessary for prescribing the form of documents and leases to be issued under the same Act, the modes, times, dates, and places of the issue thereof, and the conditions on which such leases should be issued : AND WHEREAS it appears to be necessary, in reference to all leases which the Governor may grant as aforesaid of any auriferous Crown land being in the mining district of Ballaarat, to make the regulations hereinafter expressed : Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in reference to all leases which the Governor may grant as aforesaid of any auriferous Crown land being in the mining district of Ballaarat, make the regulations next following :—

WHAT LANDS MAY BE LEASED.

All auriferous Crown land in the mining district of Ballaarat may be applied for on lease under these regulations, except—

1. The whole or any part of any claim held by any person other than the applicant
2. The whole or any part of any land which any holder of a miner's right other than the applicant is entitled to occupy, and actually does occupy *bonâ fide*, for mining purposes and for residence
3. The whole or any part of any land through or upon which any holder of a miner's right, other than the applicant, is entitled to cut, construct, and use races and dams for mining purposes
4. The whole or any part of any land which any holder of a business license, other than the applicant, is entitled to occupy, and does actually occupy *bonâ fide*, for the purpose of residence and of carrying on his business
5. The whole or any part of any land in or over which any person other than the applicant has any interest or authority other than those above mentioned which he may lawfully use or exercise for mining purposes or for discovering the existence of gold.

REQUIREMENTS PRELIMINARY TO THE ISSUE OF LEASES.

1. Any person applying for a lease of auriferous Crown land in the mining district of Ballaarat, shall apply for such lease by addressing and forwarding to the nearest Warden of the mining district an application in duplicate in the form in schedule hereunto appended marked A., and the Warden shall, as soon as it may conveniently be done, enter or cause to be entered, in a book to be kept for the purpose, such application, numbered according to the order in which it shall have been received, and shall thereupon and upon receipt of the deposit in the application referred to give to the applicant a certificate and receipt in the form in schedule hereunto annexed marked B., and the priority of every application shall be determined according to the time at which it was so received and entered as aforesaid.

2. At the time of applying as aforesaid for a lease, the applicant must (in addition to the charges of survey) deposit the sum of ten pounds, as a guarantee for payment of any expenses which may be incurred by reason of any objection to such application being allowed. And whether such objections shall be allowed or not any surplus which may remain over expenses incurred shall be returned to the applicant.

Printed copies of the forms A., B., and C. will be issued at the office of the Warden of the district, free of expense.

OFFICIAL SURVEY.

Upon receipt of such application and money aforesaid, a surveyor will be directed by the Warden to proceed to the land applied for, on a day which will be notified to the applicant, and to survey the land, and report thereon, as to the area, boundaries, and description thereof, to the Warden, for transmission to the Chief Secretary.

At the day notified the applicant shall attend on the land, and the surveyor shall, under the direction of such applicant, mark out the land applied for, with two midway southerly and northerly posts, and four corner posts firmly fixed in the ground at least three feet in height above the surface thereof ;

and shall affix upon some conspicuous place within the boundaries of the land applied for, a notice dated on that day, setting forth in the form in the schedule hereunto annexed, marked C., the description of the land to be applied for, and the address of the applicant, and the steps to be taken by any persons desirous of objecting to the issue of such lease.

OBJECTIONS.

1. Any person objecting to the issue of such lease to any applicant, shall within eight days after the date of the notice posted on the land as aforesaid, forward to the Warden of the district, and also to the applicant at the address stated in such notice posted as aforesaid, full notice of all objections against the issue of such lease to the applicant.

Every person so objecting shall deposit with the Warden the sum of ten pounds, as security for the due prosecution of his objections, and in satisfaction of all expenses to which the applicant may be put by such objections ; and if such objection should not be prosecuted, or shall fail, so much of such sum shall be handed over to the applicant as may by the Warden be declared necessary to defray the expenses of the applicant, and the balance (if any) shall be refunded to the person objecting.

INQUIRY INTO APPLICATIONS AND OBJECTIONS.

After the expiration of the eight days allowed for objections, the Warden will proceed to hold, at a time and place to be named by him, an inquiry into the truth of the particulars stated by the applicant and of the objections made by each objector.

At such inquiry the Warden or other officer will receive such information as the parties may offer, and as he may think pertinent to his inquiry ; and immediately after such inquiry, or, should there be no objections, immediately after the expiration of the eight days allowed for objections, he shall forward to the office of the Chief Secretary the application and objections thereto, if any, and his report thereon.

LEASES.

All leases to be applied for, and which it may be proposed to grant, shall be considered under the following classification :

1. *Surfacing Leases.*—These will relate to auriferous land, which it is unnecessary to work by shafts, and to which there is no defined bottom.
2. *Leases of Quartz Reefs.*—These will relate to quartz reefs, or to land interspersed with reefs or rocks of auriferous quartz.
3. *Leases of Alluvial Land adapted to deep sinking.*—These will embrace lands which require to be worked by shafts, but where the gold is deposited in drift, and not in matrix.

The Governor may issue to any applicant who has complied with such of these regulations as refer to his application, a lease of the land applied for after the time prescribed by the eleventh section of the Gold Fields Act, viz. : One month after notice of the intention to grant the same shall have been published in the *Government Gazette*.

Every lease will bear date the day of the execution thereof, and may be obtained at the office of the Warden, who shall deliver the same to the applicant, or such person as shall be duly authorized to receive the same, upon receipt of a fee of £1.

The parcel of land demised will (except in leases of quartz areas) be as nearly in the form of a rectangular parallelogram as is practicable ; provided that in no case shall the length exceed twice the breadth.

The parcel of land demised by any lease will be described therein, by such area, and mores and bounds, as shall have been reported by the surveyor, and approved by the Chief Secretary, upon report of the Warden.

The term of the lessee in the land demised cannot in any case exceed ten years.

The areas of leases shall be, except in special cases herein-after provided for—

1. For surfacing leases an area not more than fifty acres, nor less than five.
2. For leases of quartz reefs not more than eight hundred yards by one hundred wide, nor less than one hundred yards by eighty.
3. For leases of alluvial lands, adapted to deep sinking, not more than fifty acres, nor less than five.
4. The rent reserved shall be at the rate of five pounds per acre of land, and five pounds for every one hundred yards in length of quartz reefs demised pursuant to these regulations, and said rents shall be made payable quarterly in advance during the entire term, and the day of the execution of the lease shall be deemed to be the quarter-day upon which the first payment shall be made.

In special cases, where it shall be shown that a departure from the foregoing areas or rents would be for the public advantage, same may be extended and increased by the Governor in Council, and such covenants, conditions, and stipulations may be imposed and such rents and royalties reserved, as by the said Governor in Council may be considered necessary ; provided that the Warden shall not entertain any application for a greater extent of land or quartz reef than the maximum quantities hereinbefore stated without a special order from the Chief Secretary.

ACTS OF PARLIAMENT (21st VICTORIAE).

IT is hereby notified that the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies has intimated that the Queen has been pleased to leave to their operation the undermentioned Acts of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the 21st year of Her Majesty's Reign, 1857-58, viz.:-

No. 50.—An Act to amend an Act intituled "An Act to authorise the construction of a Main Trunk Line of Railway from Melbourne to the River Murray and of a Main Trunk Line of Railway from Geelong to Ballarat."

No. 51.—An Act more effectually to facilitate proceedings in the colony of Victoria by and against a certain Banking Company called the "Union Bank of Australia" and for other purposes therein mentioned.

No. 52.—An Act to amend an Act intituled "An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria."

No. 53.—An Act to amend the laws relating to particular Friendly Societies.

No. 54.—An Act to restrict the Boundaries of the Town of Geelong and to make further provision for defining the Wards thereof.

No. 55.—An Act for preventing the careless use of Fire.

No. 56.—An Act to facilitate the formation of Mining Associations and to amend and extend the provisions of an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty intituled "An Act for the better Regulation of Mining Companies" and to render certain Preferable Liens and Mortgages of personalty by Miners and Mining Companies valid without delivery and for other purposes.

No. 57.—An Act to incorporate a Company to be called "The Geelong Gas Company" and for other purposes.

No. 58.—An Act to amend an Act to establish a Board of Land and Works.

No. 59.—An Act to amend an Act, intituled "An Act to establish a Board of Commissioners for the better Sewerage and Drainage of the City of Melbourne and for supplying Water thereto and to the Suburbs thereof."

Notice to Mariners.

NEW RIVER HARBOR, FOVEAUX STRAITS.

Invercargill, 30th October, 1858.

Sir,

The New River pilot having communicated to me the following information, I lose no time in forwarding the same to your Honor.

1. The pilot states that the channel at the entrance of the New River (in which, at low-water springs, Mr. Thompson, chief surveyor, found from sixteen to eighteen feet two years ago) is gradually filling up, so that two months ago the pilot could only find nine feet, and about a fortnight ago only six feet.

2. That a new channel (at present the only one) has opened up two cables length to the north-west of the former one, in which the pilot found, when he last sounded, fifteen feet at low water: where this channel now exists there were formerly only a few feet.

I have taken steps to apprise the commanders of the whalers which frequent the river of the change, which I trust may prevent them making an attempt to enter the river by the old channel, which attempt would certainly be attended with serious consequences to vessels of their draught.

Strangers will not likely attempt to enter without a pilot; but as a recent instance occurred in which a stranger did so enter, I would respectfully suggest that, to prevent accident, all publicity should be given to the above report.

I indulge a hope that this new channel, which has so suddenly made its appearance, and is much wider than the old one, will continue to increase in depth, and thus make the port of New River much more easy of access than it has hitherto been.

MUNICIPALITY OF MALDON.

BYE-LAW NO. 5.—FOR AN ASSESSMENT OF THE ANNUAL VALUE OF ALL PROPERTY IN HOUSES AND LANDS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF MALDON, FOR THE CURRENT YEAR ENDING 10TH SEPTEMBER, 1859.

WHEREAS by an Act of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria and the Legislative Council thereof, 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted, that the council of any municipal district shall make an annual assessment of all property in houses and lands within the limits of such district according to its fair annual value: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of the district of Maldon, that the assessment on the annual value of property within the said municipal district of Maldon, as prepared by George Edward Thomson, the assessor or valuator appointed by this council for the purpose of making such assessment, amounting to the sum of sixteen thousand four hundred and sixty-nine pounds (£16,469), and contained in forty-three pages or sheets of paper, and signed by the chairman at this meeting, shall be the assessment or value upon which a rate for the current year shall be levied, and shall be legal and in force for the municipal year commencing on the 10th day of September last and ending on the 10th day of September, 1859.

BYE-LAW NO. 6.—TO IMPOSE A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND SIXPENCE IN THE POUND ON AN ASSESSMENT OF ALL PROPERTY IN HOUSES AND LANDS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF MALDON, FOR THE CURRENT YEAR ENDING 10TH SEPTEMBER, 1859.

WHEREAS by an Act of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria and the Legislative Council thereof, 19 Victoria No. 16, intitled, *An Act to amend an Act intitled an Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is thereby enacted, that no toll, rate or due, shall be imposed by the council of any municipal district save by bye-law subject to the assent of the Governor, as in the said recited Act mentioned: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council for the district of Maldon, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor as required by the provisions of the said Act, the hereinafter rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be and be taken to be the rate on the assessment of all property in houses and land within the limits of the municipal district of Maldon aforesaid, for the current year ending the 10th day of September, 1859, to be and remain in force until a new rate be made by the said municipal council as required by the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 33.

The foregoing Bye-laws, Nos. 5 and 6, made by the municipal council of Maldon, have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF ST. KILDA.

BYE-LAW NO. 17.—FOR THE REGULATION OF SHADES OR AWNINGS OVER OR ACROSS THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF ST. KILDA.

WHEREAS it is expedient to regulate and control the erection of shades or awnings over, across, or adjoining the public footpaths in the fronts of shops, dwelling-houses, or other premises within the municipality of St. Kilda, so as to prevent such erections becoming public nuisances: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the municipal district of St. Kilda, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, section 33, &c., any person or

persons who shall erect or cause to be erected any shade or awning over or across any public footpath within the municipality without having first obtained in writing the consent of the said municipal council to such erection, shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

And be it further ordered and directed by the authority aforesaid, that every such shade or awning, when such consent to the erection of the same shall have been obtained, shall be erected with the upright post or pillars thereof immediately at the outside of the kerb stone or other boundary of the footpath in front of any shop, dwelling-house, or other premises to which such shade or awning shall be attached, and that no plate, rafter or tie of any such shade or awning shall be of a less height above the surface of such path than seven feet in the clear to the under side of such plate, rafter or tie.

And be it further ordered and directed that it shall be lawful for the said council to direct and require the removal of any shade or awning erected across, over or adjoining any public footpath within the said municipality, except the same be in strict accordance with the foregoing directions, whether such shade or awning shall have been erected prior to the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief, or subsequently thereto; and it shall be further lawful for the said council to give notice to remove any such shade or awning by means of the surveyor or other officer of such council to any owner or occupier by whom or for whom such shade or awning shall have been erected; and any such owner or occupier who shall refuse or neglect to remove any such shade or awning within forty-eight hours from the time such notice of removal being given, shall, on conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence, refusal, or neglect, a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing bye-law, No. 17, made by the municipal council of St. Kilda, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF SANDHURST.

NO. 17.—A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE THE CONDUCTING OF THE ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act may make bye-laws for the conducting of elections: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, dated the 23rd day of April, 1855, the district of Sandhurst was duly established a municipal district, under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of the district of Sandhurst, that from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency, as required by the provisions of the said Act, that it shall be lawful for the chairman of the municipal council, or acting chairman appointed under clause 1 of bye-law 15, upon a vote of the council to such effect, to appoint under his hand and seal such and so many persons as to the council may seem necessary to act as deputy chairman or deputy clerks in lieu of the town clerk, and to appoint such and so many places within the municipal district as may seem to the said council necessary to be the polling places.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 17, made by the municipal council of Sandhurst, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

APPROACHING LAND SALES.

AUDITORS' REPORT.

To the Chairman and Members of the Boroondara District Road Board.

GENTLEMEN,

HAVING audited the accounts of the board for the past financial year, ending 4th September ultimo, we beg leave to lay before you the result of our examination.

1. We have no evidence to show that the accounts of the preceding year have been audited.

2. The balance sheet submitted by the board we find substantially correct, though so framed as to render it necessary to go into the minutest details of the accounts to ascertain the *bond fide* receipts, expenditure, assets, and liabilities of the board.

3. The vouchers being correct, have passed through the books in due course, with the exception of two, amounting to £186 10s. 8d., which remained in the hands of the Government, according (as represented to us) to a former arrangement at the Central Road Board Office.

4. In the course of our audit, Mr. Thomas Johnson, a ratepayer, desired that we would note his protest against the following items:—

1st. Contract No. 1. as properly belonging to Contract No. 9 of 1857.

2nd. Contract No. 2, as expenditure on private property.

3rd. To the salary of the surveyor, for not having given the dates of engagement, &c.

4th. To the salary of the collector, as contrary to agreement.

Mr. Johnson also objected to the balance of £13 10s., as carried from the previous year, because that certain works contracted for, according to the minute book, were paid in excess by a sum of £685 10s. 9d., and that this excess should be added to the £13 10s. to show the actual balance. The contracts so represented are those referred to in accounts of the year ending September, 1857, as having been paid for by a sum of £3540 14s. 9d., whereas they were tendered for and accepted by the board at a sum of £2855 4s. The accounts referred to not having been audited, and the auditors not feeling justified in going into them, they can but note the objection.

5. With the view to placing the balance sheet submitted to you by the ex-board in the form we deem easiest of comprehension as to the real state of the accounts, we beg leave to submit it to you on the accompanying folio.

6. In placing on the Cr. side the sum of £224 11s. 11d. as a balance to be accounted for as over expenditure, instead of subtracting it from the returned balance in the hands of treasurer, according to rule, we do so in order to keep in view the original totals as they appear in the accounts and bank book.

The amount said to be due to Government (£254 9s. 3d.) we find has been merely a subversion of funds to that amount from the legitimate channel of public works to official expenses.

7. In reference to the rate collectors' accounts (which we only received last night), we find them substantially correct on being checked. The item of irrecoverable rates has been reduced by a sum of 10s. 9d. now paid in.
