TIME SIGNAL AT WILLIAMSTOWN.

MARINERS and the public generally are informed that the following alterations in the mid-day time signal are now observed.

The Time Ball will drop from the cross-arms at the top of the shaft on the tower of the Electric Telegraph Station, Gellibrand's Point, instead of the Flagstaff as hitherto.

The Ball will be hoisted half-mast at 12.30 p.m., up to the cross-arms at 12.58, and will be dropped at *One o'clock* exactly (observatory mean time) daily (Sundays excepted).

The drop of the Ball will indicate 15 h. 20 m. 10 sec. Greenwich mean time, and any error occurring, accident or other wise, in the signal, will be duly notified in the daily papers of the ensuing day.

ACCOUNTS FOR MEDICAL ATTENDANCE.

THE following information is published with a view to facilitate the payment of medical practitioners' claims for incidental attendance on cases in watch-houses, at the request of the police, &c., &c.

Accounts should in all cases be made out on the proper form (L. 2, vide *Gazette* of 15th December, 1857, page 2408), and should be headed "The Department of Medical," &c., and, after being signed by the claimant and the officer at whose request the attendance was given, should be forwarded to the Chief Medical Officer.

The fullest particulars of the services rendered should in every case be given on the face of the account, as the name of the prisoner or person attended, the nature of the disease, &c., the place where the attendance was given, the distance from the medical man's abode, and the time of attendance, whether day or night.

No account should include services rendered in different quarters of the year, and accounts for "Medical attendance," and for "Examination of lunatics and giving evidence," should be rendered separately.

It is important that the claimant should write on the face of the account whether he wishes it made payable at Melbourne, or at one of the sub-treasuries, and it is requested that all claims be rendered as early as possible after the service is given.

All charges are to be in accordance with the following Scale of Fees, viz.:—

SCALE OF FEES.

For medical or surgical attendance, inclusive of all necessary medicines, within any city or township, 10s 6d. per visit. At night double this fee.

Travelling expenses 10s. 6d. per mile for each mile after the first.

For minor surgical operations £2 2s.

The scale of payment for capital operations to be submitted to the Chief Medical Officer.

For examination of insane persons, and giving the necessary evidence and certificates, One guinea for each case; mileage at 2s. per mile.

The body appears to have been in the water four or five months at least.

Description.—A young man, of small make, about 5 feet 5 inches high, with brown hair, whiskers, and moustache.

Dress.—Blue under striped cotton shirt, blue serge shirt, blue Guernsey shirt, white cotton drawers, worsted cord trousers, red cotton pocket handkerchief with white spots on it in the shape of shamrock leaves.

A large dog, of reddish color, between a bull and mastiff, having a broad white streak round the right side of his neck and a long cut over the right eye, now in possession of the police, was seen near the hole in which the deceased was found, about the time of the supposed murder, and as the animal gave signs of great uneasiness and distress it is presumed that it had belonged to the murdered man.

SANDHURST MUNICIPALITY.

FOURTH HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF SANDHURST FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING 11TH JANUARY, 1858.

PUBLIC WORKS, ETC.

DURING the past half-year the council have pushed the works for the improvement of the town as much as they possibly could. Upwards of fifty new works have been contracted for, in addition to repairs and maintenance of works previously performed, the principal being:—Kerbing and channelling in Golden square, part of McCrae street, and high side of Market square; pitching and metalling part of Mitchell street and View Place road and opposite post office; road work in Vine street, Bernal street, McIvor road and bridge, Raglan street, Ophir street, New street opposite Maple street, &c.; forming footpaths and side channels in McLaren, Myers and Mollison streets, and in parts of Mundy, Williamson, Bull, Hargraves, McIvor, Dowling and McCrae streets, and Littleton terrace; stump clearing and hole filling in Thistle street, Napier street, Wattle square, Bernal street, Dowling street, Iron-bark range, Simons street, &c.; flagging in View place, footbridge and paths into Bridge street from the Camp road, horse bridges at Bernal street, Maple street, and opposite Bayne street; removal of soil from Creek; cut and raising Pall Mall, &c.; forming ten additional tanks, viz., three High street, three Bridge street, two Pall Mall, and two Market square, cutting sludge channel and raising culvert at foot of New Chum Gully; removing and improving weigh-bridge; erecting new office, belfry for fire bell, putting up street name-plates, &c.

Towards the formation of the road and bridge opposite Maple street the inhabitants contributed a portion of the cost, and also the flagging of View place footpath was partly paid for by the property owners, in accordance with a regulation made by the council, in July last, that they would flag any footpath the length of an entire block frontage provided the inhabitants agreed to pay half the cost.

Amongst the works named are repairs to the McIvor road and bridge, and cutting sludge channels and raising culvert, &c., at the foot of New Chum Gully to prevent the sludge burying the Government road—both works which the Government should have done but which the council have had to do, at a cost of £486 10s., from the Government's continued neglect or refusal to do them. The council of course tried every means in their power to induce the Government to perform these indispensable works rather than expend the local revenue on matters that belong the general revenue, but in vain, and so had no alternative but to spend the money or see the two main roads from Melbourne stopped.

The council have received from England a powerful fire-engine of the best description obtainable there, which has been delivered over to the care of the Sandhurst Fire Brigade.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

Many and continuous applications have been made to the Government on various points for the advantage of the town, but the council regret to say with far less success than has attended those made to previous administrations. The following are the principal, with the results:—

GRANTED.

The formation of parts of the Murray road from Sandhurst to Huntley.

The appointment of two letter carriers in Sandhurst, and post office at the White Hills.

A reservoir site at Golden square, but half the area applied for only granted.

REFUSED, OR THE ANSWERS DEFERRED.

A branch post office or receiving house in portion A.

The filling of the dangerous holes on the main Murray road, contiguous to the metalling, and used tracks.

The formation or repairs to main Murray road, in Napier street, and between Basset's and Queen's bridge.

That some other site should be chosen for the post office than in the camp reserve.

The erection of a municipal court house.

The fencing or covering of the dangerous road drain in View place, opposite the Albion.

No. 20.—FEBRUARY 9TH, 1858.—4.

The erection of a police station before promised, and improvement of the lock-up at the White Hills.

The proclamation of the camp reserve at Sandhurst as a reserve for the recreative purposes of the inhabitants only. This was applied for to secure the land for its promised use, and prevent a recurrence of portions being resumed at will by the Government for other purposes, in spite of the promise to the contrary made in answer to a memorial from the council in 1856.

Many applications in reference to the creek becoming obstructed with sludge.

The formation of a pound.

The allotment of an amount for road works for 1858, proportionate to the importance of the district with its population of above forty thousand, contributing a tenth of the indirect taxation, and a fourth of the gold duty, and in just comparison with other districts, instead of the single £1000 put on the estimates, when the Melbourne district is to have £93,000.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been passed by the council and assented to:—

No. 9. For making the assessment and rate for the past year.

No. 10. For prevention of fires in chimneys, inflicting a penalty in all cases, unless the occupier can prove that the chimney has been swept within one month.

No. 12. For appropriation of endowment to street formations.

No. 14. For compelling occupier to keep the footpaths and channels in front and rights-of-way in the rear of their properties free from the sweepings, rubbish and filth, too generally thrown there.

The following are passed but not yet assented to:—

No. 11. Making regulations and fixing dues for the Sandhurst market.

No. 13. For compelling the construction of proper drains to prevent damage to the footpaths, &c.

The amount of £3112 17s. 8d. has been received as the second instalment of the grant-in-aid, making with the previous payment a total of £6112 17s. 8d. for the year 1857.

The assessment for the year was completed in August, numbering 2674 properties, and amounting to £118,714, on which a rate of ninepence in the pound was levied and made payable on the 15th September.

The sum of £3501 16s. 8d. has been collected up to the present date, and the collection is still in progress, but as many of the smaller tenements have been removed in the interior the whole amounts cannot be recovered.

MARKET.

The council regret the delay that has occurred in opening the market, but it has arisen solely from the Government. They have made all the exertion in their power to have had it in operation months ago. Their bye-law was passed in August, and the dues fixed, but are not yet assented to. There is, however, now some prospect of this being soon done.

A market inspector and weigher has been appointed at a salary of £160 per annum, Mr. John Ryan holding the office.

MISCELLANEOUS.

The council deemed it advisable when the Railway Bills were under the consideration of the Parliaments, that the interests of the town should be watched over by some of their body in Melbourne, and delegated that power to councillors Sullivan and Harney, who also represented the Chamber of Commerce, and were chosen by a public meeting. The council have the satisfaction of knowing from the results that the matter could not have been placed in abler hands.

In August it was deemed advisable to do away with the system of paying the town inspector by a share of the penalties and accordingly a fixed salary of £300 per annum was given instead. The present arrangement relieves that officer from the charge of interested motives in any prosecution he is obliged to make, and will also lead to the regulations of the town being carried out more by cautions and remonstrances than by summonses and penalties.

In September the town was honored by a visit from His Excellency the Governor. The council, as in duty bound, took some steps to welcome His Excellency, and incurred some small expense in so doing. They were also afterwards requested, by a public meeting of the ratepayers, to pay the liabilities incurred on the occasion by a committee elected by the inhabitants, and the council of course conformed to the wishes of their constituents.

The council feel it a duty in this report to state the obligations they feel, and render their thanks to Dr. Owens, M.L.A., for his prompt and frequent attention to their wishes in bringing various matters before the notice of the House of Parliament and Government authorities.

ELECTIONS, ETC.

In December Mr. McDougal resigned his seat in the council, and Messrs. Harney, Cahill and Harris retired by rotation at the end of the municipal year. Councillors Abbott, Cahill, Harris, and Burnside have been elected to fill the four vacancies.
