QUARANTINE OF THE "BERMONDSEY."

SEVERAL cases of Fever having been reported as existing on board of the immigrant-ship *Bermondsey*, now lying at the Quarantine Station, Point Nepean, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has placed the said ship, and the crew and passengers thereof, under Quarantine for a period of fourteen days, unless previously released by an Order of the Governor in Council; and all persons are hereby required to take notice thereof accordingly.

The boundaries of the Quarantine Station, Point Nepean, are specified in a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of November, 1852.
