## TIME SIGNAL AT WILLIAMSTOWN.

MARINERS and the public generally are informed that the following alterations in the mid-day time signal are now observed.

The Time Ball will drop from the cross-arms at the top of the shaft on the tower of the Electric Telegraph Station, Gellibrand's Point, instead of the Flagstaff as hitherto.

The Ball will be hoisted half-mast at 12.30 p.m., up to the cross-arms at 12.58, and will be dropped at *One o'clock* exactly (observatory mean time) daily (Sundays excepted).

The drop of the Ball will indicate 15 h. 20 m. 10 sec. Greenwich mean time, and any error occurring, accident or other wise, in the signal, will be duly notified in the daily papers of the ensuing day.

## NUNAWADING ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the sixth day of August, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, a certain district was declared as and to be a road district by the name of "The Nunawading Road District," and the boundaries thereof were defined: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the boundaries of the said road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the authority vested in me in this behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as defines the boundaries of the said Nunawading road district, and I do hereby proclaim and declare that from henceforth the said Nunawading road district shall consist of the portion of the said colony comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-west angle of portion lviii, parish of Nunawading; thence by a line bearing north to the Koonung-koonung Creek; thence easterly by that creek to the south-east angle of section vii, parish of Bulleen; thence due east to the Mullum-mullum Creek; thence by that creek south-easterly to the south-east angle of section xxvi, parish of Warrandyte; thence due south to the Dandenong Creek; thence by that creek to the south-east angle of reserved portion 110, parish of Nunawading; thence by a line bearing west to the commencing point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixteenth day of February, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and in the twenty-first year of Her Majesty's Reign.

## MUNICIPALITY OF KYNETON.

**BYE-LAW NO. 1.—A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE, BY MEANS OF STANDING ORDERS, THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF KYNETON.**

**WHEREAS** by an Act of the Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "*An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*," it is amongst other things enacted, "that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district, established under the provisions of the said Act, to make bye-laws for the regulation of their own proceedings;" and whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor, dated 30th October, A.D. 1857, the district of Kyneton was duly established a municipal district, under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act; and whereas it is expedient to make divers regulations for conducting the proceedings and business of the municipal council for the said district of Kyneton: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council for the district of Kyneton, That from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, as required by the provisions of the said Act, the proceedings and business of the said council shall be conducted by the following regulations only, which shall be and be called the "Standing Orders" of the said council, that is to say:—

1. The ordinary meetings of the council shall be held on Friday in each week, at Six o'clock in the evening from 1st April to 30th November inclusive, and at Seven o'clock in the evening from 1st October to 31st March inclusive, in every year, except otherwise ordered, and shall be open to the public; the council to have the power to adjourn such meeting from time to time, not being more than fourteen days from the last day of meeting. Minutes of the proceedings of all meetings of the council shall be drawn up and fairly entered into a book for that purpose, and shall be signed by the councillor presiding at the meeting; and the said minutes shall be open to the inspection of all persons on the ratepayers' roll, at all reasonable times, free of charge.

2. At all meetings of the council the business shall commence so soon as the legal quorum of three councillors are present, but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of half an hour, such circumstance shall be noted (with the names of the members present) in the Minute Book, and the business of such meeting shall lapse.

3. The first business at each meeting of the council shall be to confirm the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereupon except as to the accuracy thereof.

4. At all meetings the reading of correspondence unconnected with the business of the meeting, the presentation of petitions, notices of motion, and bringing up of reports, shall have the precedence of all motions or orders of the day.

5. All communications presented to the council must be in the form of a petition or memorial, addressed to the municipal council, and be couched in respectful language.

6. No motion shall be discussed or decided on at any meeting of council unless notice in writing, signed by the councillor proposing, shall have been given at a previous meeting of the council, nor shall any report of committee be decided on unless similar notice be given, and the clerk to the council shall furnish each councillor with a copy of each notice of motion three clear days before the meeting for which the same is given.

7. The orders of the day shall include all business of which due notice has been given, and all matters arising out of former meetings of the council.

8. No motion shall be proceeded with unless the councillor giving notice, or one of the council authorised by him in writing, be present to proceed with the same when called upon.

9. No bye-law shall hereafter be proposed without due notice (as in the case of motions), neither shall any such bye-law be finally passed or adopted by the council, nor be presented for the assent of His Excellency the Governor, until the expiration of twenty days from the publication thereof in one or more of the local newspapers, and the posting thereof on the outer door of the council chamber; and a copy of all bye-laws in force under the Act shall be kept in the council chamber for the inspection, free of charge, at reasonable times of all persons on the ratepayers' roll.

10. All business shall be considered in the order in which notice thereof was given.

11. Any member, when proposing a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, must rise and address the chairman; and no member shall be interrupted unless by a call to order, when he shall sit down. The member calling to order shall then be heard upon such point of order, and the question decided before the subject is resumed, or any other business entered upon.

12. Any member desirous of proposing either an original motion or amendment must state the nature of such motion or amendment before addressing the council in support thereof.

13. Any member making an amendment shall put it in writing, sign and deliver it to the clerk to the council, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder; and no question once brought before the council shall be withdrawn without leave of the council, nor shall any motion be entertained by the council until the same be seconded.

14. If more than one councillor rise at the same time, the chairman for the time being shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

15. No councillor shall speak twice on the same question, unless by way of explanation merely, or in reply as the mover of an original motion, or upon any amendment; and after such explanation or reply, the question shall be forthwith put to the vote; but councillors merely seconding any motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

16. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, or impute motives; and all personal reflections shall be considered highly disorderly.

17. The presiding chairman's decision shall be final on all questions of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

18. The presiding chairman shall rise when addressing the council.

19. Any councillor who shall use expressions capable of being offensively applied to any other councillor shall (if required by the chairman) withdraw such expressions, and make a satisfactory apology to the council, under a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

20. Any councillor may require the clerk to the council to take down any particular expressions immediately on their being used.

21. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council bearing on the question, under discussion.

22. Only one amendment shall be discussed at one time, and upon the adoption of any amendment the original motion shall be deemed rejected; and the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as a substantive motion.

23. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the votes of the councillors, if a division be called for, shall be entered in the minutes.

24. The council shall vote by show of hands, except in cases of elections.

25. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment; but if the question be decided in the negative, the motion then under consideration, or the next motion or order of the day, shall be considered before the question of adjournment shall be again entertained; and any business left undecided shall take precedence at the next meeting of the council.

26. Any councillor may record his protest against any decision of the council, provided the same be made in writing before and presented not later than the next meeting of the council, and be couched in respectful language.

27. No motion, the effect of which would be to rescind any previous resolution of the council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year, unless a call of the whole council has been duly made for that purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the council which shall have been

negated by the council shall be again entertained during the same municipal year.

28. That when a call of the council has been determined on, three clear days' notice in writing shall be given of such call to, or left at the residence of, each member by the clerk to the council; and any member who shall without reasonable cause absent himself from the meeting upon the day for which such call shall be made shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

29. The chairman of the council when appointed on committees shall be chairman thereof; and the Standing Orders of the council shall be observed in all committees except as to the number of times limited for speaking.

30. That on any committee being appointed, the clerk to the council shall give such notices calling the committee together as may be requisite.

31. The clerk shall not affix the common seal to any corporate document without the express order of the council, nor unless such document bears the signature of the chairman, except in the case of powers of attorney and other legal documents not relating to the corporation, the signatures to which require to be verified before the chairman by declaration; and in any such case the said seal shall and may be affixed by the clerk to the chairman's certificate accompanying the same on the receipt of a fee of Ten shillings and sixpence for each attestation.

32. No election to any office at the disposal of the council shall take place until six clear days' notice has been given in the local journals and any other newspapers the council may think fit, inviting applications for the same, and the salary or other remuneration of such office in all cases be fixed before proceeding to the election.

33. At all such elections the voting shall be on cards provided for the purpose, on which the voter shall write the name of the candidate he supports and sign his own; no others will be received; and the clerk to the council shall forthwith proclaim the same aloud and preserve the same as a record.

34. No councillor shall have, directly or indirectly, by himself or his partner, any share or interest in any contract or employment with or by the council, except he be a shareholder in any public company or corporation with which the council may contract for the supply of gas or water, or for the insurance of premises against fire in the municipality; nor shall any councillor be received as surety for any officer, nor shall any councillor, auditor, or other officer become security for any contractor or other employé with or by the council. No contract with any such public company or corporation in which a councillor may be a shareholder shall be concluded until ten days after notice thereof shall have been advertised in all the local journals and such other papers as the council may think fit, and posted on the outside door of the council chambers. Any councillor or officer infringing any of the stipulations of this bye-law shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds.

35. Any one or more of the Standing Orders may be suspended *pro tem.*, in case of emergency, with the consent of a majority of the council.

36. The neglect or breach of any or either of the foregoing bye-laws shall (except where a sum by way of penalty is hereinbefore fixed) subject the person offending to a penalty not exceeding the sum of One shilling in respect of each bye-law.

37. In all cases in which security for the due and faithful performance of any duty or contract is required, the expense of preparing such surety shall be borne by the person or persons giving the same.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF BEECHWORTH.

BYE-LAW No. 14.—FOR REGULATING THE HEIGHT AND WIDTH OF SHADES AND AWNINGS OVER OR ACROSS PUBLIC FOOT PATHS.

WHEREAS it is expedient to prevent shades and awnings in the public streets being public nuisances or dangerous: Be it and it is hereby enacted by the municipal council of Beechworth, That any shade or awning over or across any footpath in this municipality shall be erected with the upright posts or pillars thereof immediately at the outside of the kerbstone or other boundary of the footpath in front of any store, shop, dwelling, or other premises to which such shade or awning shall be attached; and that no plate, rafter, rail, or tie of any such shade or awning, or in any way thereto appertaining, shall be of a less height above the permanent level of such path than eight feet in the clear to the under side of such plate, rafter, rail, or tie. And with reference to any awning or shade to be erected in this municipality after this bye-law shall come into force that shall not be in every respect in conformity herewith, it shall be competent for the council, or any of its officers, to require the person or persons owning or occupying the premises to which it is attached to alter or remove it immediately. And as to any shade or awning in existence at the time of this bye-law coming into force

which is not in conformity with the within-mentioned regulations, it shall be lawful for the council, or any of its officers, at any time to require (by notice in writing) the owner or occupier of the premises to which it is attached to alter or remove the same within one month from the date of such written notice or requirement. And any person who shall erect or cause to be erected any shade or awning in any street, road, or lane within the municipality otherwise than in strict accordance with the regulations in such bye-law contained, shall forfeit and pay a sum or penalty not exceeding Ten pounds. And any person who shall refuse or neglect to comply with the requirements of the council or its officers to alter or remove any shade or awning as herein provided for, shall, upon conviction, if obtained within fifteen days after the expiry of the one month's notice above-mentioned, before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds per week for each and every week or fraction of a week that the said shade or awning shall remain unremoved or unaltered over and above or beyond the time it is required to be so removed or altered in accordance with the provisions of this bye-law.

*Proviso*—The written notice or requirement within alluded to shall be deemed to have been duly served if left with the owner or occupier (herein referred to) personally, or at his or her last known abode, or upon the premises to which the obnoxious shade or awning shall appertain or belong.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF SOUTH BARWON.

BYE-LAW No. 9.—FOR THE REGULATION AND LICENSING OF DRAYS, WAGGONS, AND OTHER VEHICLES WITHIN THE SOUTH BARWON MUNICIPAL DISTRICT.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for municipal councils to frame such rules and regulations as may be necessary for the regulation and licensing of drays, waggons, and other vehicles within their respective boundaries: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the South Barwon municipality, That so soon as the sanction of His Excellency the Governor in Council is obtained, all persons having carts, waggons, or drays within the municipality shall register the same with the town clerk, and pay a fee of One shilling per cart or waggon, as the case may be, for registration of the same, and that each cart or waggon so registered shall have the words "South Barwon Municipality" written on the off side, with such number as may correspond with the number of their registration on the books of the municipality.

Any person not complying with the foregoing regulation shall, on conviction before any two justices of the peace, be subject to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

THE Hydrographic Department of the Imperial Ministry of Marine gives notice that during the summer of 1857, a wooden tower, having the form of a truncated octagonal pyramid, has been erected on the north-east point of the Island of Verilaïda (Paternoster), at the entrance of the Gulf of Riga, in the Mound, at the same place where formerly stood a stone tower that had been destroyed during the last war.

The new tower is fifty-two English feet high from its basis, rises sixty-six feet above the level of the sea, is planked externally, is furnished with openings, and painted deep red.

# PARTICULARS.

*Dress.*—Blue under striped cotton shirt, blue serge shirt, blue Guernsey shirt, white cotton drawers, worsted cord trousers, red cotton pocket handkerchief with white spots on it in the shape of shamrock leaves.

A large dog, of reddish color, between a bull and mastiff, having a broad white streak round the right side of his neck and a long cut over the right eye, now in possession of the police, was seen near the hole in which the deceased was found, about the time of the supposed murder, and as the animal gave signs of great uneasiness and distress it is presumed that it had belonged to the murdered man.
