PUBLIC BUILDINGS, ETC., EXEMPTED FROM THE JURISDICTION OF MUNICIPAL COUNCILS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*," it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference, by any municipal council constituted under the said Act, with any public road, cemetery, market, wharf, aqueduct, or any other public work, place, or building, of what description soever, not erected, formed, or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, except from the jurisdiction of the several municipal councils mentioned in the first column of the schedule hereunto annexed, the several public buildings and rooms set opposite to the respective names of such councils in the second column of the same schedule, that is to say:—

APPOINTMENT OF GENERAL SESSIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*," it is lawful for the Governor from time to time to define and appoint by Proclamation the times at which such courts shall be holden, and such times to alter and vary as the said Governor shall think fit: And whereas it is expedient to alter and vary the times at which the said courts are now holden: Now therefore I, the Governor aforesaid, do hereby alter and vary the times at which the said courts are now holden, and do proclaim and appoint that the times at which the courts of general sessions shall be holden at the several places hereinafter mentioned shall be as follows (that is to say):—At ALBERTON on the first day of March and the first day of September in every year; at BALLARAT on the tenth day of April, the seventeenth day of August, and the sixth day of December in every year; at BENDIGO on the thirty-first day of January, the twenty-fifth day of May, and the tenth day of October in every year; at BELFAST on the sixteenth day of February, the twelfth day of May, the sixteenth day of July, and the seventh day of November in every year; at CARISBROOK on the

second day of February, the first day of May, the fifth day of August, and the fifth day of November in every year; at CASTLEMAINE on the nineteenth day of April, the twenty-sixth day of August, and the ninth day of December in every year; at GEELONG on the seventh day of April, the eighth day of August, and the first day of December in every year; at HAMILTON on the twenty-fifth day of May and the twenty-fifth day of November in every year; at KILMORE on the eighteenth day of January, the twelfth day of April, the eighteenth day of July, and the twenty-second day of October in every year; at KYNETON on the twentieth day of February, the tenth day of May, the twentieth day of August, and the twentieth day of November in every year; at MELBOURNE on the first day of every month except January in every year; at PORTLAND on the tenth day of February, the tenth day of July, and the thirteenth day of November in every year; at SANDHURST on the twenty-eighth day of April, the twenty-eighth day of August, and the fifteenth day of December in every year; and at WARRNAMBOOL on the twentieth day of February, the seventh day of May, the twentieth day of July, and the second day of November in every year: Provided always that when any of the said days shall happen to fall upon any Sunday or Good Friday, the day next following shall be the day on which the said court shall be holden: Provided lastly that this Proclamation and Appointment shall operate and take effect as to the several places aforesaid respectively from and after the time at which the next Circuit Court or Court of General Sessions as the case may be shall be holden in such places respectively.

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

DUNOLLY.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency, as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-one householders resident in the district of Dunolly.

The petitioners state that they are deeply impressed by the conviction that necessity exists for the erection of Dunolly into a municipal district, and that its incorporation will tend to the improvement and good government thereof; and they suggest that the boundary line should commence at the Junction Hotel, Burnt Creek, and be continued thence due north five miles and 1298 yards, so as to include the property in the occupation of William Fenwick, Esquire, the warden of the district; the other boundaries to be such as to enclose an area not exceeding nine square miles, within which no spot shall be distant six miles from any other spot. In the proposed area they state that there are more than three hundred householders.

And they pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that Dunolly may be proclaimed a municipal district according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

The memorialists represent that considering the present bad condition of many of the public roads in and about Brighton, the numbers and position of its inhabitants, &c., it is highly important that a road district be formed, and they suggest that the boundaries thereof be as follow:—"Starting from the Elsternwick Hotel, proceed along the right hand side of the red metal road to the Plough and Harrow; thence at a right angle by the boundary road to the beach; thence along the beach to the boundary of the St. Kilda Municipality; and thence in a direct line to the starting point."

And the memorialists pray as follows:—
"In accordance with the contents of the said resolutions, we beg most respectfully to solicit your Excellency to proclaim the limits and boundaries therein mentioned as 'The Great Brighton Road District.'"

MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF PORTLAND.

STATEMENT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE SIX MONTHS ENDING ON THE 31ST DAY OF JANUARY, 1858.

PUBLIC WORKS.

THE council have continued to expend the funds at their command in the improvements of the principal streets, chiefly in Percy street, Julia street, Henty street, Hard street, Gawler street, and Otway street. Some improvements have also been made in South Portland. The approaches to the jetties are also in the course of formation under the direction of the council, the expense of which will be borne by a special appropriation of the sum of £950 at the disposal of the Central Road Board.

The council have to regret that the new jetty, which has been so long in construction, has not yet been completed, but as the council have no control whatever over that work, and there is no engineer or other officer in Portland in charge, the delay is not to be wondered at, nor can the council be blamed. The consequence of the delay is that the jetty could not be used during the busy season of the year.

ENDOWMENT.

The council have petitioned the Governor to recommend to the Legislature a liberal permanent endowment of the municipalities within the colony. Nothing permanent has, however, been yet decided on, but a grant has been made for the ensuing year, based on the amount of local assessment collected, but the amount has not yet been declared.

BOTANICAL GARDEN.

In the latter end of September last, the sum of £300 was appropriated for the purpose of improving the botanical gardens, but with an injunction that the whole of the money must be spent before the 25th December. The council accordingly applied themselves to expending the money as speedily as they could, and to the best advantage that the limited time would allow, and, acting on the suggestion of the superintendent of the Botanical Gardens in Melbourne, obtained the services of Mr. Alexander Elliott (then employed in the Melbourne Gardens) in forming walks in the eastern portion of the gardens, which has been fenced off from the remainder, from which it was decided to raise some revenue by letting it for a grazing paddock. While the works were in progress the sum appropriated was increased from £300 to £500, and the restriction as to the time in which the money was to be spent removed, but too late, however, as to the £300, which was by that time nearly spent, the walks being completed. The council have suspended their proceedings in consequence of the difficulties attending the receipt of the money appropriated, none of which has yet been received, although, within the last few days, an order has been made for the payment of the money (not to the council but to the chairman and the police magistrate), but as the latter has no instructions on the subject, the council are still unable to get repaid the sum they have expended in anticipation of the grant. It is hoped, however, that time may overcome the difficulties in the way, and that the full amount may ultimately be available for the public benefit.

FIRE-ENGINE.

An efficient fire-engine for the use of the town has been ordered from London, and its arrival may be expected shortly.

In consequence of a communication from the Central Board of Health of the prevalence of small-pox in Melbourne and other parts of the colony, the council took such steps as appeared necessary to be prepared in case that disease should appear in Portland.

The attention of the council having been directed to the bills now before Parliament for the alteration of the electoral districts of the colony, and which appeared highly detrimental to the western portion of the colony, the council adopted a petition to the Legislative Assembly against the bill, which was presented by Mr. Hughes, M.L. for the town, and has been followed by several other petitions from different parts of the western district and other places in the colony.

A vacancy in the council having been caused by the sudden death of Mr. Bell, an election of a successor took place on the 4th December, when Mr. Thomas Finn, a former member of the council, was elected without opposition.

At the end of the municipal year, Messrs. Crouch, Learmonth, and Fitzgerald retired from the council by rotation, and Messrs. Fitzgerald, Learmonth, and John Browning (a former member of the council) were duly elected to fill the vacancies in the council.
