**NOTICE TO MARINERS.—LIGHTHOUSES AT KING GEORGE'S SOUND,
WESTERN AUSTRALIA.**

For the guidance of shipping frequenting King George's Sound, a lighthouse has been erected on the summit of Breaksea Island at the entrance of the Sound, and another at the entrance to Princess Royal Harbor.

A light is exhibited in both between sunset and sunrise.

That on Breaksea Island is a good catadioptric light of the second order, white, fixed, and elevated 383 feet above sea level. It may consequently be seen in clear weather at the distance of 9 leagues, from an elevation of 12 feet above the water.

The octagonal iron tower which carries this light is erected near the centre of the island, which is 12 miles in length E. by S. and W. by N., with an average width of nearly a quarter of a mile. From Breaksea light the extremity of Bald Head bears south 40 degrees west 3 miles, Cape Vancouver at the foot of Mount Gardner east 15 degrees north 7 miles, and the light at the entrance of Princess Royal Harbor west 20 degrees north 6½ miles. By a vessel from the westward, the light may first be seen round the steep slope of Bald Head on the bearing of N.E. ¼ E., just open to the south of the Eclipse Islands. These bearings are magnetic.

The light at Princess Royal Harbor is on Point King, the north point of its narrow entrance. It is a fixed white light of the same description as that on Breaksea, but smaller, and is elevated 37 feet above high water. From the mid-channel between Breaksea and Michaelmas Islands this light bears W. by N. ¼ N., and from the N.E. extremity of Bald Head N.W. ¼ W. It is carried by a wooden square tower 17 feet in height, and 37 feet from the water's edge. All bearings magnetic.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorize the interference, by any municipal council constituted under the said Act, with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected, formed, or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to exempt the place and buildings hereinafter mentioned from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Beechworth: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of Beechworth the following public place and buildings, situate and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

The land reserved for the use of the Presbyterian Church, and all erections and buildings thereon.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this nineteenth day of March, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and in the twenty-first year of Her Majesty's Reign.

PUBLIC WORKS.

During the past half-year the council have forwarded the works for the improvement of the town to the utmost extent of their means.

The following works have been finished since the publication of last report, viz.:—

Forming, making, pitching and metalling 13 chains 68 links of Rutledge street.

Forming, making, pitching and metalling 3 chains 25 links of Tootal street, and raising a large culvert over a branch of the Kilmore Creek at Tootal street.

Pitching and metalling 10 chains of Union street.

Pitching and metalling 7 chains of Foot street.

Forming, making, pitching a portion, and metalling 5 chains of Clarke street, and raising a culvert at the intersection of Sydney and Clarke streets.

Forming, making and metalling 5 chains of Albert street and constructing a culvert on same.

Forming, making and metalling about 5 chains of Fitz Roy street, and constructing a culvert across same.

Forming, making, pitching a portion of street and 5 chains of wide side drain, and metalling the whole in Mitchell street.

Constructing a large double culvert across Sydney street.

ELECTIONS.

The annual election took place in August last, to supply the four vacancies occasioned by the retirement by rotation of Councillors Butler, Corboy and Morris, and by the resignation of Councillor Biddle.

Messrs. Butler, Corboy, Beavan and Leahy were duly elected, by polled votes, to fill the vacant seats, and at a meeting of the council held on Wednesday, the 19th day of August, Councillor F. W. C. Beavan was unanimously elected chairman.

UNION STREET.

Early in November last, the council succeeded in coming to terms with Messrs. Trainor and Kelly relative to the opening up of Union street, between Sydney and Melbourne streets. The amount of compensation to the gentlemen named was determined by arbitration, and the sums so awarded having been paid, the street was immediately opened to its full width, much to the satisfaction of the ratepayers in general.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been approved of by His Excellency during the past half-year, and are now in operation:—

No. 9. For the appropriation of a second sum of Two thousand pounds, granted from the public revenue for the year 1857, to the municipality of Kilmore.

No. 10. For levying a rate of 1s. in the pound for the current municipal year.

No. 11. For the assessment of all property within the boundaries of the Kilmore municipality for the year ending the 8th August, 1858.

No. 12. A bye-law to prevent danger from fire arising from the erection of inflammable agricultural produce within the municipal district of Kilmore is now under the consideration of His Excellency the Governor.

MAIN ROAD.

Amongst the works completed are—Formation, making, pitching and metalling about 9 chains of the main road to Kyncton, and raising a substantial double culvert across Sydney street, at the intersection of Mitchell street. The council tried every means to induce the Government to undertake these works, but were met with the reply that there were no funds available for the purpose. Now that grants for the improvement of both these roads have been voted for the year 1858, it is but reasonable to expect that the council will be reimbursed the amount, £465, expended out of the local revenue on works, the expense of which ought to be borne by the general revenue.
