WILFUL MURDERS.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD, AND FREE PARDON TO AN ACCOMPLICE.

WHEREAS on the 30th day of last November, the bodies of two men, named Hugh McLean and Robert Dunlop, were found in a hole between Dunolly and Jones's Creek, and the skulls of both of the said men were fractured: And whereas a coroner's inquest has been held and a verdict returned that death was occasioned by violence caused by some person or persons unknown: Notice is hereby given that a reward of One hundred pounds will be paid to any person giving such information as will lead to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons who murdered the said Hugh McLean and Robert Dunlop.

His Excellency the Governor will also extend Her Majesty's free pardon to any person implicated in the said murders (such person not being the actual murderer or one of the actual murderers) who may afford the information sought.

PARTICULARS.

On the 30th ultimo, the bodies of two men hereafter described were found dead in a hole between Dunolly and Jones's Creek, two and a half miles from Dunolly, and a quarter of a mile from the old Jones's Creek road. Over the bodies were found an opossum rug, repaired in the centre with two pieces of striped calico, a blanket, and two calico caps, one of which had a hole in the crown:—1st, a man 6 feet high, thirty-five years old, very muscular, black hair, and small dark whiskers, had on a pea jacket, blue shirt, trousers, and Blucher boots; and 2nd, 5 feet 10 inches high, forty years old, light hair, reddish whiskers, thick beard and moustache, and sharp features, had on a pea jacket, drawers, moleskin trousers, and Blucher boots. The skulls of both men are fractured, and the bodies are in an advanced stage of decomposition, and appear to have been in the hole in question about five or six weeks.—10th December, 1857.

MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF PRAURAN ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency **SIR HENRY BARKLY**, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the then Lieutenant Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-third day of April, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, it was declared and appointed that the several districts therein named should be municipal districts, and amongst others the boundaries of the municipal district of Prahran, in the county of Bourke, were thereby defined: And whereas in compliance with a petition presented to His Excellency the Governor, signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident in the district hereinafter described, it is deemed expedient to alter the boundaries of the said municipal district of Prahran, and to unite thereto a portion of land hitherto comprised within the corporate limits of the city of Melbourne, under the authority of two several Acts of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, respectively, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," and, "An Act to amend an Act, intitled, 'An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria,'" Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, alter the said municipal district of Prahran and the limits thereof, and, with the advice aforesaid, I do declare and appoint that the boundaries and limits hereinafter defined shall be the boundaries and limits of the said municipal district of Prahran, that is to say:—

Commencing at that point on the southern bank of the River Yarra Yarra intersected by a line passing through the centre of the Punt road; thence south by a line passing through the centre of the Punt road to Wellington street; thence eastwards by lines passing through the centre of Wellington street and the centre of the Great Dandenong road to the Kooyoung road; thence north by a line passing through the centre of the Kooyoung road to the River Yarra Yarra; and thence westerly by the southern banks of that river to the commencing point aforesaid.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Prahran."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighth day of January, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and in the twenty-first year of Her Majesty's Reign.

General Order to the Troops.

Deputy Adjutant General's Office,
Head Quarters, Melbourne, 7th January, 1858.

ON the presentation of new Colors to the 40th Regiment, at Spencer street Barracks, Melbourne, Major-General Macarthur, C.B., commanding the Forces in the Australian Colonies, made the following observations to such portion of the battalion as could be assembled. They are now promulgated throughout this command, that those of the regiment who by duty and other causes were absent, may be accurately acquainted with what it was the Major-General's duty to impress on the minds of the troops.

"Major Leslie, officers, non-commissioned officers, privates, and others of the 40th Regiment now under arms,—I rejoice at an occasion so honorable to you all, and much regret that the inhabitants of this colony cannot be present to see these honors reflected on you from the new standards now displayed in your ranks.

"But while hailing with proud satisfaction the presence of new colors, it must be with regret that you part with the old. They were presented to you in the East Indies, and were at once records of the past services of the regiment, and truthful witnesses of its subsequent glorious acts.

"A previous presentation of colors took place not long after the memorable Battle of Waterloo, in which the regiment bore so distinguished a part. They in like manner continued the record of the famed deeds of the regiment up to that time; and constituted a wide-spread and lasting testimony of what it had performed.

"The new colors, let me remind you, are no more than simple memorials of the past. It will be for you by your conduct in the field, should your country require your services, to emulate your predecessors, and add to the list of their distinguished achievements.

"The actions now inscribed on your colors are no less than nineteen in number; they have received Her Majesty's warranty, and will never be effaced from your standards.

"In two instances they relate to general services, such as Egypt and the Peninsula; and in seventeen others, to hard-fought battles that were crowned by the hands of Victory.

"The men who achieved so much renown, be it remembered, were of the same race and lineage as yourselves; they consisted of similar sterling materials, and were raised in all parts of the United Kingdom. Do not allow yourselves to be outstripped in the arduous race by the true soldiers who preceded you in the ranks.

"For a long period of years the 40th Regiment has in no small measure been composed of individuals from the West of England.

"At Taunton, the standing head-quarters of the regiment, the remnants of its old colors are deposited in the church, and in a manner held sacred; and there, as in other parts of the United Kingdom, it would be hard to find a family not associated with its acts, as with the acts of every regiment in Her Majesty's armies.

"Persons of all classes and degrees sympathize in their fortunes; and I may myself truly state that I am in no small degree identified with the honors of the 40th Regiment, having been present with it in one-third of the general actions in which it was engaged.

"The past history of the Regiment leads to high anticipations of its future conduct, and that it will, whenever occasions arise, continue to afford fresh proofs of its valour.

"My observations are brief, since it is not by words but by acts that British soldiers seek to be distinguished.

"The profound silence which at this moment reigns in your ranks, is the sure test of the discipline to which the regiment has attained, and of your entire obedience to command."
