MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

FITZ ROY WARD, MELBOURNE—SECOND PETITION.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by sixteen hundred and ninety householders and ratepayers of Fitz Roy Ward, in the city of Melbourne, praying for separation from the said city, and the erection of the said ward into a distinct municipality.

The petitioners state that after carefully considering the existing management and financial position of the corporation of Melbourne, they are fully convinced as to the necessity for immediate separation therefrom, and the erection of their ward into a separate municipality, for the following reasons, viz. :—

1. The present revenue of the city is insufficient to meet current expenses and to keep the made streets in moderate repair, there remaining, according to the statement of the finance committee, after paying interest and the cost of management, and of cleansing streets, but £2000 for repairs throughout the city during the current year.

2. In addition to the Gabrielli loan, the corporation at present owe £20,000.

3. During 1857, a sum of over £5000 was contributed by Fitz Roy ward to the city funds, and a sum of less than £1500 was expended by the corporation on the ward.

4. During the present year the rates of Fitz Roy ward will exceed £7000, of which there is no probability that the corporation will expend more than £1500 on the ward; but, if the ward be detached from the city, there will remain, after deducting the interest on the ward's share of the Gabrielli loan, upwards of £5000 for the use of the separate municipality.

5. The ward is both politically and geographically separated from the city.

6. The ward, containing as it does, 13½ miles of streets and 12,000 inhabitants, is sufficiently important to require distinct local management. Its prosperity, too, will be greatly furthered by speedy and entire separation from the city.

7. Through the inability of the corporation to carry out the necessary works, large quantities of stagnant water have accumulated in the lower or northern parts of the ward, to the serious injury of the health and property of the inhabitants of the contiguous localities.

8. Fitz Roy ward is at present entirely destitute of market accommodation.

9. The want of a local police court and of a small debts court is felt to be a source of serious inconvenience, the Melbourne Courts being too remote.

10. The opposition formerly offered to separation from the city is now withdrawn, nearly the whole of the ratepayers and freeholders being unanimous in favor of separation.

And the petitioners pray as follows :—

"Your petitioners therefore pray that your Excellency would be pleased to take their case into your most favorable consideration, and cause the necessary steps to be taken to have the Fitz Roy ward district proclaimed a distinct municipality, with the following extension of its boundaries, to obviate objections from the city council of Melbourne, namely :—That its southern boundary be the centre of Victoria parade in lieu of the north side line of the same; its western boundary be the centre line of Nicholson street, continued to the centre of Reilly street northwards, in lieu of the east side line of the said street; that the eastern boundary be the centre of Smith street, continued in a straight line to the centre of Reilly street, and its northern boundary be the centre of Reilly street."

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," the council of any municipal district is authorised and appointed to pass bye-laws for the execution of any works by funds raised by aid from Government, &c., &c.: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Maryborough that the sum of £2000, being the first moiety of the Grant in aid, received by this council, be appropriated more or less as follows—£1250 for clearing streets, removing trees and stumps, filling holes, repairing, metalling, and draining streets of township, and forming roads over the different leads within the municipal district; £500 for the erection of municipal chambers; and £250 for enclosing old and new burying grounds and manure depot.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 8, made by the municipal council of Maryborough, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

ON the 29th September, Councillor Whitehead was re-elected, and Abijah John Brown and John Bland were elected in the room of David Talbot and Charles Ruffie, who retired by rotation.

On the 30th September, Councillor John Mason was unanimously elected chairman for the current year.

On the 14th December, James M. Knight and John L. Huntley were elected in the room of Alexander Russell and A. J. Brown, who had resigned.

Representation of Western district. Memorial was presented to the Legislative Assembly complaining of the contemplated reduction in the number of members for the Western district.

FINANCE.

On the 30th September, 1857, £1685 18s. 10d., the balance of the grant in aid for last year, was received. On the 23rd March vouchers were forwarded for the sum of £1578 3s. 9d. on account of grant in aid for 1858.

Pending the collection of rates and the receipt of the grant in aid the council have received permission from the Bank of Victoria to overdraw their account to the amount of £800.

PETITIONS.

On the 14th October a petition was received from various laborers and ratepayers, praying the council would cause public works to be proceeded with to afford relief to a number of unemployed, and a body of men were accordingly employed as day laborers under the superintendence of the surveyor. On the 9th December a petition was presented from various ratepayers requesting the council would provide a race-course as a place of public amusement. The course having been given this year by the proprietor, the difficulty was temporarily avoided, but the council are taking steps to provide a place for public amusement for the inhabitants.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The contracts in hand at the end of the last half-year for the performance of works on the Rosebrook road, Belfast East, Yambuk road, and in the town, have since been satisfactorily completed, and the contractors paid.

A contract of Lee and Haggarty to do certain town works for £1200 has been also satisfactorily completed.

Contracts have been taken by Gorrings and Brittain for repairs to the bridge over the Moyne for £40.

Messrs. Lee and Haggarty have taken a contract for works, on the Rosebrook road for £870, and for supplying 250 cubic yards of blue stone metal at 13s. 6d. per yard.

The council has during this half-year expended £1461 14s. 9d. in day labor, under the superintendence of the surveyor. £515 6d. of which has been expended in Belfast East, and £946 8s. 9d. in town improvements.

The council regret to report that while material suitable for the purpose of road making exists in abundance within the boundaries of the municipality, the defective state of the Municipal Act prevents their availing themselves of its advantages. A long correspondence with Mr. Woodward, the agent of the proprietor, was entered into for the purpose of submitting the valuation of the material to arbitration, which was agreed upon, but the whole matter was ultimately upset by Mr. Woodward having repudiated this arrangement, though originally proposed by himself.

MISCELLANEOUS.

The council have had communications with the Solicitor General, and suggested various alterations in the Municipalities Act, which it is very desirable should be amended during the present session of the Legislature.

On the 6th October, a conference was held with the Warrinambul Municipal Council and the Belfast District Road Board, on the subject of the application to Government to place money on the Estimates for a road to the gold fields, and it was agreed that application should be made for £100,000 for the purpose.

A committee has been appointed to enquire into and report upon the best site for the establishment of a public bathing place, and the probable expense thereof.
