FITZ ROY WARD, MELBOURNE.—SECOND PETITION.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by sixteen hundred and ninety householders and ratepayers of Fitz Roy Ward, in the city of Melbourne, praying for separation from the said city, and the erection of the said ward into a distinct municipality.

By His Excellency's Command,
F.3118. JOHN O'SHANASSY.

The petitioners state that after carefully considering the existing management and financial position of the corporation of Melbourne, they are fully convinced as to the necessity for immediate separation therefrom, and the erection of their ward into a separate municipality, for the following reasons, viz.:

1. The present revenue of the city is insufficient to meet current expenses and to keep the made streets in moderate repair, there remaining, according to the statement of the finance committee, after paying interest and the cost of management, and of cleansing streets, but £2000 for repairs throughout the city during the current year.

2. In addition to the Gabrielli loan, the corporation at present owe £20,000.

3. During 1857, a sum of over £5000 was contributed by Fitz Roy ward to the city funds, and a sum of less than £1500 was expended by the corporation on the ward.

4. During the present year the rates of Fitz Roy ward will exceed £7000, of which there is no probability that the corporation will expend more than £1500 on the ward; but, if the ward be detached from the city, there will remain, after deducting the interest on the ward's share of the Gabrielli loan, upwards of £5000 for the use of the separate municipality.

5. The ward is both politically and geographically separated from the city.

6. The ward, containing as it does, 13½ miles of streets and 12,000 inhabitants, is sufficiently important to require distinct local management. Its prosperity, too, will be greatly furthered by speedy and entire separation from the city.

7. Through the inability of the corporation to carry out the necessary works, large quantities of stagnant water have accumulated in the lower or northern parts of the ward, to the

serious injury of the health and property of the inhabitants of the contiguous localities.

8. Fitz Roy ward is at present entirely destitute of market accommodation.

9. The want of a local police court and of a small debts court is felt to be a source of serious inconvenience, the Melbourne Courts being too remote.

10. The opposition formerly offered to separation from the city is now withdrawn, nearly the whole of the ratepayers and freeholders being unanimous in favor of separation.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore pray that your Excellency would be pleased to take their case into your most favorable consideration, and cause the necessary steps to be taken to have the Fitz Roy ward district proclaimed a distinct municipality, with the following extension of its boundaries, to obviate objections from the city council of Melbourne, namely:—That its southern boundary be the centre of Victoria parade in lieu of the north side line of the same; its western boundary be the centre line of Nicholson street, continued to the centre of Reilly street northwards, in lieu of the east side line of the said street; that the eastern boundary be the centre of Smith street, continued in a straight line to the centre of Reilly street, and its northern boundary be the centre of Reilly street."

ELECTIONS.

Councillor Smith resigned on the 30th November, and John Cunningham, Esq., was, on the 22nd December, elected in his stead. On the 24th of December, the late chairman, F. J. Sargood, Esq., J.P., resigned his office of councillor, and John Cunningham, Esq., was elected the chairman. Mr. John Thompson was elected councillor in the room of F. J. Sargood, Esq., on the 22nd January. The annual election took place on the 20th February, when councillors J. B. Crews, H. W. Lacey, and James Stodart, were elected in the room of councillors J. Mason, W. R. Pye, and J. B. Crews. The following gentlemen were candidates and received the number of votes attached to their names:—J. B. Crews, 446; Henry W. Lacey, 402; James Stodart, 386; W. K. Pye, 272; H. Court, 48.

The present councillors hold office as follows:—Councillor Crews for three years, the chairman, councillors Lacey and Stodart for two years, councillors Palmer, Stephen and Thompson, for one year.

At the first meeting of the council, 22nd February, councillor Cunningham was elected chairman unanimously; and the following committees appointed:—

Finance, Legislative and Rate Committee:—Councillors Stodart (chairman), Stephen and Lacey, Public Works Committee:—Councillors Crews (chairman), Palmer and Thompson.

MEETINGS OF COUNCIL.

During the past half-year the council have held twenty-nine meetings. The chairman, F. J. Sargood, attended seventeen meetings out of nineteen; councillor Palmer, twenty-nine; councillor Crews, twenty-eight; councillor Pye, twenty-six; councillor Mason, twenty-four; councillor Stephen, eighteen; councillor Smith, five out of fourteen meetings; the chairman, J. Cunningham, nine out of nine meetings; councillor Thompson, four out of four meetings.

COMMITTEE MEETINGS.

Finance committee have held twelve meetings. Councillor Mason attended ten meetings; councillor Pye, six meetings; councillor Smith, seven meetings (resigned 30th November); councillor Stephen, appointed 7th December, attended three meetings out of five.

Public works committee have held sixteen meetings. Councillor Crews attended sixteen meetings; councillor Palmer, thirteen meetings; councillor Smith, five (resigned 30th November); councillor Pye appointed 7th December, attended seven meetings, being all the meetings held after that time.

BYE-LAWS.

A bye-law to prevent nuisances arising from suffering cattle to be at large in the streets, on unenclosed places within the district, has received the assent of His Excellency the Governor.

EXTENSION OF BOUNDARY.

The boundary of the municipality has been extended to the centre of the boundary road east, Dandenong road and Wellington street south, and Punt road west. Previous to the extension, the building line of the above streets was the boundary.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The works executed during the past half-year are, the forming of Shipley, Caroline, William, Arthur, and Avoca streets; Gardiner's Creek road, kerbing and pitching the entrances thereto; building culvert at Major's Gully, High street forming and pitching channel Union street; kerbing and pitching crossings at the entrance of several streets; building fire-engine house. Contracts have also been entered into for forming Yarra street, forming and metalling High street and Commercial road (two miles). The expense of building the lock-up keeper's house and the Court House fencing has been borne by the Government. They have also put down kerbing and channelled a portion of Gardiner's Creek road: this has been done at the earnest solicitation of the council, they claiming a portion of the tolls collected at the St. Kilda Tollgate, for that purpose.

Since the last report the delivery of letters has been extended to the River Yarra on the north, Dandenong road and Wellington street on the south, William's road on the east (taking both sides of the road), and the Punt road on the west.
