POSTPONEMENT OF THE NEXT CIRCUIT COURTS OF CASTLEMAINE
AND SANDHURST.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the 28th day June, 1858.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "*An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the colony of Victoria,*" it is lawful for the Governor, by any orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the times at which Circuit Courts shall be holden, and the said times to alter and vary as he shall, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of May last, the times appointed for holding the next Circuit Courts for Castlemaine and Sandhurst were amongst others altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient again to alter the times at which the said Circuit Courts of Castlemaine and Sandhurst have been directed to be holden: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the times appointed for holding the next Circuit Courts at the respective places herein-after mentioned shall be postponed as follows, that is to say:—At Castlemaine, from Wednesday, the thirtieth day of June instant, to Monday, the fifth day of July next; and at Sandhurst, from Friday, the ninth day of July next, to Wednesday, the fourteenth day of the same month of July.

And the Honorable Henry Samuel Chapman, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
