SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICT OF OMEO.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act to make provision for the Sale of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors, and of Refreshments, in certain Districts*," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to proclaim any part or portion of the said colony to be a district subject to the provisions of the said Act, to be called a Special Licensing District, and to define the boundaries of such district: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, by this my Proclamation, declare the following part or portion of the said colony to be a district subject to the provisions of the said Act, to be called "*The Special Licensing District of Omeo*," the boundaries whereof are hereby defined as follow, that is to say:—

Commencing at the source of the Inomungee River at the south-eastern extremity of the Bogong Range; thence by a line southerly, crossing the Australian Alps, to the eastern source of the Wentworth River; thence by a line east crossing the River Tambo, twenty-six miles more or less; thence by a line northerly to Mount Tambo; thence by the Australian Alps to the source of the Limestone River; thence by the Limestone River to its junction with the Indi River; thence by a line south-westerly to the foot of Mount Gibbo; thence south to the Gibbo River; thence by the Gibbo River to its junction with the Inomungee River; and thence by the Inomungee River to the commencing point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifteenth day of June, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and in the twenty-first year of Her Majesty's Reign.

MARYBOROUGH MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAWS REGULATING MINING OPERATIONS IN THE MINING DISTRICT OF MARYBOROUGH.—[14th May, 1858.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Maryborough, begun and holden at Maryborough, in the said district, on the 14th day of May, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

CLASS A.—DRY ALLUVIAL SINKINGS.

1. *Prospecting*.—Any party discovering a new gold field or working distant three miles and upwards from any old gold field or working, shall have allotted for such discovery, upon application to the warden or other authorised person, an area of ground of two hundred feet square.

Any party discovering a new gold field or working distant two miles from any old gold field or working, shall have allotted for such discovery, upon application to the same authority, an area of ground of one hundred and fifty feet square.

Any party discovering a new gold field or working not less than one mile from any old gold field or working, shall have allotted for such discovery, upon application to the same authority, an area of ground of one hundred and twenty-five feet square.

Any party discovering any new gold field or working less than one mile and over one-quarter of a mile from any old gold field or working, shall have allotted for such discovery, on application to the same authority, an area of ground of one hundred feet square.

Any party discovering a lost lead or working which may have been abandoned, shall have allotted for such discovery, on application to the same authority, an area of ground of one hundred feet square.

But in all such cases the parties making such discoveries shall make the same known to the warden or other authorised person, without unnecessary delay, and have previously marked off the requisite ground.

2. *Extent of claim in new ground*.—The extent of claim in new ground shall be, for

One miner, twenty-eight feet square,
Two miners, forty feet square.

3. *Marking claims*.—All parties marking out claims shall evidence their boundary by firmly driving in a substantial peg at each corner of the claim, such pegs to stand at least one foot above the surface, and be kept visible during the working of the claim, and no person shall remove, destroy or cover any such pegs marking the boundary of any claim.

4. *The wall*.—A wall of two feet shall be left between each claim by the party last marking out, which said wall may be worked by either of the adjoining parties, but the party working or removing the said wall must place good and sufficient props, with good and sufficient caps and sole-pieces, not less than three feet apart, along the entire length of the wall so worked or removed. Where vacant ground exceeding the wall of two feet shall have been left between adjoining claims, any party wanting a claim may take possession of such vacant ground without let or hindrance from adjoining claimholders.

5. *Shepherding*.—Every miner or party of miners must be at his or their claim every working day after the day on which such claim may have been taken possession of, from Nine to Twelve o'clock in the morning, and from Two to Four o'clock in the afternoon (Saturday afternoon excepted), until his or their shaft may be bottomed or the claim abandoned.

6. *Ground to be secured with props*.—Parties working any claim must secure the ground by placing good and sufficient props, with good and sufficient caps and sole-pieces, not more than six feet apart throughout the whole of the extent of the ground so worked and removed.

7. *Measurement of disputed ground*.—In all cases where the right to certain ground forms matter of dispute between miners, each claim shall be measured from the boundary pegs opposite to the side of the claim in dispute, and no party shall be protected from encroachment unless the boundary pegs shall have been kept visible during the working of the claim.

8. *Extent of claim in old ground*.—The extent of claim in old ground, previously worked and abandoned, shall be, for

One miner, forty-two feet square,
Two miners, sixty feet square.

9. *Forfeited shares*.—Any miner or party of miners being absent from his or their claim for a longer period than forty-eight hours during the working of the claim, his or their share shall be deemed to be forfeited, unless where specially provided for.

CLASS B.—WET ALLUVIAL SINKINGS.

10. *Wet sinkings*.—The term "wet sinkings" shall be understood to mean sinkings where slabbing may be necessary; provided that in no case shall surface water cause any claim to be considered as wet sinkings.

11. *Extent of claim in wet sinkings*.—The extent of claim in wet sinkings shall be, for

Four miners, sixty-four feet square.

12. *Claims how to be marked*.—All parties marking out claims in wet sinkings shall evidence their boundary by firmly driving in a substantial peg at each corner of the claim, such pegs to stand at least two feet above the surface, and be kept visible during the working of the claim, and no person shall remove, destroy or cover any such pegs marking the boundary of any claim.

13. *The wall*.—A wall of four feet shall be left between each claim by the party last marking out, which said wall may be

worked by either of the adjoining parties; but the party working or removing the said wall must secure the ground to the satisfaction of the adjoining claimholders, by placing double props, with good and sufficient caps, sole-pieces and lathing, along the entire length of the wall so worked or removed.

14. *Wet sinkings, how to be worked*.—All parties holding unworked claims in wet sinkings within six claims in every direction from the last shaft which has struck water, shall commence to sink their shaft without delay, and shall continue to sink such shaft all and every working day until such shaft shall have struck water also. Beyond the abovenamed limits, any party of four miners shall be allowed to hold a claim unworked, provided they are all present at and upon such claim from Nine o'clock in the morning until Twelve o'clock at noon on every working day during which such claim may lawfully remain unworked.

All parties holding claims within six claims in every direction of any shaft bottomed shall sink their shaft all and every day until the well is completed.

15. *Water baling and night-work*.—Whenever the majority of the holders of claims which may be bottomed, or which may have struck water, shall decide night and day baling to be necessary, it shall be competent for the warden or other authorised person to require all parties holding claims which may be bottomed, or which may have struck water, to bale such water all and every night; and it shall be competent for the majority of claimholders as aforesaid to fix the minimum capacity of the bucket or other vessel used in such water baling.

16. *Measurement of disputed ground*.—In all cases where the right to certain ground forms matter of dispute between miners, each claim shall be measured from the boundary pegs opposite to the side of the claim in dispute; and no party shall be protected from encroachment unless the boundary pegs shall have been kept visible during the working of the claim.

17. *Extent of claim in old ground in wet sinkings*.—The extent of claim in wet sinking, in old ground previously worked and abandoned, shall be, for

Four miners, ninety feet square.

18. *Drawing slabs from abandoned shafts*.—Persons drawing slabs from abandoned shafts, where there is drift or any other strata from whence water proceeds, must immediately fill up such shaft to a sufficient height to prevent the water flooding adjoining claims. Slabs left in any shaft for twenty-eight days after the claim is abandoned shall be deemed forfeited, and may be drawn and appropriated by any party requiring the same.

CLASS C.—QUARTZ REEFS.

19. *Prospecting quartz reefs*.—The first party commencing to prospect a quartz reef, or any party taking up a previously worked or abandoned reef, or any party commencing and continuing to sink a shaft three hundred yards a-head of the last marked claim on any line of reef, shall be entitled to mark off a prospecting claim of one hundred and twenty feet along the course of any such reef by three hundred feet in width, taken in accordance with rule 20, and such parties shall, upon application to the warden or other authorised person, be entitled to hold the same.

20. *Prospecting claim on quartz reef*.—Any party having received a prospecting claim on a quartz reef of less extent than provided for in quartz rule 19, shall, on application to the same authority, receive the full extent of claim allowed in said rule, provided always the adjoining ground shall not be occupied at the time of such application.

21. *Extent of claim*.—Every miner shall be entitled to twenty feet along the course of the reef by three hundred feet in width, such width to be formed by a line drawn at right angles with the course of the reef, and measuring one hundred and fifty feet on each side of the centre of the reef, and such miner shall be entitled to every vein or leader found within such limits, but no claim shall exceed eighty feet in length unless specially provided for.

22. *Claims how to be marked*.—All parties marking out claims on quartz reefs shall evidence their boundary by firmly driving in six substantial pegs, one peg at each end of the claim on the line of the supposed course of the reef, and one peg at each corner of the claim at right angles with the supposed course of the reef, such pegs to stand at least four feet above the surface and to be kept visible during the working of the claim, and no person shall remove, destroy or cover any such pegs marking the boundary of any claim.

23. *The wall*.—A wall of five feet shall be left between adjoining claims by the party last marking out; and when any miner or party of miners shall have neglected to leave the proper space for the wall, it shall be competent for the warden or other authorised person to deduct the necessary length from the claim last marked and assign it as a wall between such claim and the claim first marked; and the wall being the common property of the claimholders between whose claims such wall may be situated, no party shall take down, mine into or remove, any such wall, without obtaining the consent in writing thereto of the owners of adjoining claims.

24. *Water baling and night-work*.—Whenever the majority of the holders of claims which may have struck water shall decide night and day baling to be necessary, it shall be competent for the warden or other authorised person to require all parties who have struck water to bail such water all and every day and night; and it shall also be competent for the majority of the claimholders as aforesaid to fix the minimum capacity of the bucket or other vessel used in such water baling. Where the

above bailing is requisite, it shall be compulsory on all parties within six claims of the last shaft striking water to sink their shafts and bale water all and every day and night until their shafts may be abandoned.

25. *Registration of claims.*—In the event of any party, after expending a large amount of time and labor in prospecting a quartz claim, being compelled to suspend their operations from sickness, want of funds, or other urgent cause, such party shall be allowed to register their claim for a period of three months; such registration to be effected in the form, and subject to the conditions following, that is to say:—A dated notice of intention to register must be posted and be kept posted upon some conspicuous part of the claim, and the party must then forward to the warden, or other authorised person, a written application for permission to register, signed by not less than four disinterested miners, recommending the claim for registry. At the expiration of seven days from the receipt of such application, the warden, or other authorised person, shall proceed to the spot, and if no sufficient objection shall have been made, the claim shall be registered forthwith. Any objection to such registry must be in writing, signed by not less than four miners, and must be forwarded to the warden, or other authorised person, before the expiration of seven days from the posting of the notice as aforesaid. In the event of any such objection being deemed by the warden, or other authorised person, to be a good and sufficient objection, the claim shall not be registered. In the event of the registry being granted, a certificate of registry shall be furnished to the parties, a copy of which certificate must be kept posted on some conspicuous part of the claim registered.

26. *Claims remaining unworked.*—Any unregistered claim which may have been worked for a longer period than three months remaining unworked for six clear working days, shall be deemed to be abandoned. Any unregistered claim which may have been worked for a period less than three months remaining unworked for three clear working days, shall be deemed to be abandoned.

27. *Plurality of claims in quartz mining.*—No miner shall be allowed, by virtue of his own miner's right, more than one claim or share in any claim, unless where specially provided for; but any authorised miner, party, or company of miners, may occupy and hold any number of claims or shares in any claims, provided the requisite number of authorised miners are employed on any such claims.

28. *Names of shareholders must be kept posted.*—The names of shareholders must always be kept posted on some conspicuous part of the claim.

29. Shareholders may employ themselves elsewhere during the sinking of the shaft.

In quartz mining, where it is found two miners are sufficient to sink the shaft, it shall be lawful for any of the other shareholders in the claim to employ themselves as they may think fit.

GENERAL RULES.

30. *Justifiable absence from claim.*—Any miner or miners working a claim shall not forfeit his or their share or shares by being absent through accident or sickness, or who shall be in attendance on any sick person, a court of justice, the mining board, or any other urgent business.

31. *Injury to shafts.*—No party shall be allowed to remove the pipe-clay or any other substance from the top of any shaft without leaving an embankment around the mouth of the same sufficient to prevent the water running into such shaft, and thereby making its way into the adjoining claims; neither shall any party be allowed to cut a drain into any shaft whereby another may be injured.

32. *Waterholes for domestic use.*—On application being made to the warden, or other authorised person, he may grant permission to enclose and reserve a well or waterhole for domestic purposes.

33. *Public holidays.*—Any miner or miners may be absent from his or their claim without forfeiting his or their share or shares, on the following public holidays:—Good Friday to Easter Tuesday inclusive, Christmas Day to third day of January inclusive, and all other stated days the warden, or other authorised person, may think fit.

34. *Public highways.*—Should a lead of gold be found to go under any surveyed road, public street or highway, a space of not less than twenty-five feet in width must be kept clear for the use of the public thoroughfare; no shaft to be allowed within ten (10) feet on either side of the said thoroughfare.

35. *Holding of claims.*—No miner shall be allowed to hold, in virtue of his own miner's right, more than one claim or share in any claim; but any authorised miner, party, or company of miners, may hold or occupy any number of claims, provided the requisite number of authorised miners are employed in such claims.

36. *Inspection of ground.*—In all cases of ground being unoccupied and said to be worked out, if taken possession of, the adjoining claimholders shall allow any two disinterested miners to descend their shaft and inspect the adjoining ground.

37. *Preservation of waterholes for mining purposes.*—No person or persons shall be allowed to throw hopper stones, tailings, or gravel into any creek or waterhole.

38. *Forcible possession.*—No party shall be allowed to take forcible possession of any claim or share; but when a claim or share is disputed, the party wishing to take possession of the said claim or share, shall first make application to the warden, or other authorised person, to enquire into and decide thereon.

39. *Effacing, &c., notices.*—That no person do efface, remove, or destroy any notice posted on any claim.

40. *Willfully cutting channels.*—No person or persons shall willfully cut a channel so as to cause the escape of water from any dam that is being used by any miner or miners.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-laws.

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

MALDON.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-eight householders resident at and near Maldon, praying for the erection of the said township into a municipality.

The petitioners state that at a public meeting held at Maldon, on the 19th of May last, a resolution to the effect that it is desirable to erect Maldon into a municipality, was carried; and that they are impressed with the conviction that such a step is advisable, for the better government and improvement of Maldon and its vicinity.

The petitioners suggest that the proposed municipal district should be circumscribed as follows, viz.:—Commencing at a point one chain and a half west from the north-west corner of allotment 12, section 2, suburban lots, north of Maldon (i.e., allowing for a road on the west side of allotment 12); thence north one mile; thence east two miles and a quarter; thence south four miles; thence west two miles and a quarter thence north three miles to the commencing point.

They further state that the area of the proposed district does not exceed nine square miles; that it contains more than three hundred householders; and that no one point therein is distant more than six miles from any other point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Excellency may declare the said district a municipal district, under the name of 'The Maldon Municipality,' pursuant to the provisions of the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, &c."
