POSTPONEMENT OF THE NEXT PORTLAND AND BELFAST GENERAL
SESSIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*," it is lawful for the Governor, from time to time, to define and appoint by Proclamation the times at which such courts shall be holden, and such times to alter and vary as the said Governor shall think fit: And whereas it is expedient to alter the times already appointed for holding the next Courts of General Sessions of and for the districts of Portland and Belfast respectively: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby alter the times appointed for holding the next Courts of General Sessions at Portland and Belfast respectively as follows, that is to say:—At Portland, from Monday, the twelfth day of July instant, to Thursday, the fifteenth day of July aforesaid; and at Belfast, from Friday, the sixteenth day of July instant, to Monday, the nineteenth day of July aforesaid.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and in the twenty-second year of Her Majesty's Reign.
