WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for the more easy Recovery of certain Debts and Demands," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to direct that county courts shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, and from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to direct in what towns and places a county court shall be holden, and that the judge of each court holden under the said Act shall attend and hold such court at the place where the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, shall have directed that such court shall be holden at such times as such judge shall appoint for that purpose, so that a court shall be holden in such place once at least in such interval as the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, shall in each case direct: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present order direct that a county court shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act at the place and within the interval following, that is to say:—

AT MALDON, once at least in every three calendar months.

And the Honorable Henry Samuel Chapman, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

APPOINTMENT OF TIME FOR PREPARING JURY LIST FOR THE COUNTY COURT OF MALDON.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for Regulating Juries*, it is enacted that in case any assizes, or any county court or court of general sessions of the peace, shall hereafter be lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at any town other than those at which the same are now holden, the clerk of petty sessions at such court town, and the clerk of petty sessions at every other town or place within the jury district of such court town, and all justices, constables, officers of police and sheriffs, shall, within such time as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall order for that occasion only, do and perform all such acts, matters, and things in and towards preparing, correcting, allowing, sending and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve as aforesaid, and making out the jury books for every such jury district as are thereinbefore required to be ordinarily done at a different time or period; and all such last mentioned jury books shall be brought into use, and the persons whose names shall be therein set down shall be liable to serve immediately after the same shall have been made out by the sheriff; and the said last-mentioned books shall be used until new books shall have been prepared under the provisions thereinbefore contained: And whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the 26th day of July, 1858, it was ordered by His Excellency, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, that a county court should be holden at Maldon, the same being a place at which a county court had not previously been holden: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the jury list for the jury district of Maldon be prepared and published on or before the 23rd day of August next, and shall be corrected and revised on or before the 31st day of the same month of August; and that the jury book shall be made therefrom on or before the 7th day of December next: and that such jury book shall be brought into use and be used in and for the said district from and after the said 7th day of the same month of December.

And the Honorable Henry Samuel Chapman, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE accompanying notifications from the Russian Government relative to the navigation of the Gulf of Finland, and the entrance to the Port of Archangel, are published for the information of masters of vessels respectively bound thereto.

The Hydrographic Department of the Imperial Ministry of Marine hereby notifies to Mariners, that in order to render the navigation near the Cape of Perespe in the Gulf of Finland less dangerous, the pole surmounted with a sheaf of iron rods with the points turned upwards, which hitherto was placed at the northern end of the reef at a depth of twenty-one feet, will, from the opening of the navigation of 1858, be placed north of the two sandbanks at a depth of twenty-four feet, and replaced in this way every year.

The pole will be two and a half Italian miles distant from the stone of Pouri-Kari, in the direction north-west 50°, and five Italian miles from the Eckholm Lighthouse, in the direction north-west 80°, all according to the corrected compass.

The Hydrographic Department of the Imperial Ministry of Marine hereby gives notice to the commanders of vessels entering the Port of Archangel, that instead of the former signals placed upon a common line, on the Berezowbar, at the mouth of the northern Dwina, upon the west bank of the island of Moudianga, to indicate the direction of the channel, and which signals were removed during the late war, two new signals have been placed during the summer of 1857 upon the south-west point of the island abovementioned.

The first signal at the north, and which is consequently nearest to the sea, shows a three-faced tower, forty-two English feet in height from its basis to the summit of the roof: this tower is painted with three perpendicular bands, of which the side ones are black and the middle one white, and are prolonged over the roof, this last being painted red.

The second signal, placed on the south-east, consists of a mast forty-two feet in height from the basis to the summit. Above this mast is raised a topmast twenty-eight feet high, making the total height seventy feet from the basis to the truck. The topmast abovementioned carries at its summit three black globes. The distance between the two signals is three hundred and five Sajenes (seven English feet to a Sajene), in the direction north-west and south-east 43°, according to the corrected compass.

The common line of the centre of the white band and of the mast indicates the direction of the channel in the shoals of the Bar of Berezow, between the black and red buoys; the black buoys should be left to the north-east, and the red ones to the south-west.

The common line of the two signals abovenamed may also be of great assistance to pilots who, in consequence of bad weather or other circumstances, or when the buoys may have been displaced by tempest or by the passage of a vessel, should not be able to direct their course towards the vessel requiring them.

An opening has been cut in the forest between the southern signal, that is to say, of the three black globed mast and the Lighthouse of Moudianga, in the direction north-west 17½°, by the corrected compass:

BYE-LAW.—[13th April, 1858.]

AT a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Sandhurst, begun and holden at Sandhurst, in the said district, on the 19th day of April, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say :—

That it is resolved the following clauses be added to bye-law No. IV.:—

1. When any warden shall receive the sum named in clause 1 of bye-law No. IV, for the purpose therein specified, he shall cause as much of the said sum to be expended as may be required for making the necessary survey, the balance (if any) to be returned by him to the depositors, within seven days from the day upon which the survey shall have been completed; or, should the amount deposited prove inadequate, the depositors will be held responsible for any deficiency, and must pay the same to the warden within seven days from the completion of the survey.

2. Immediately upon the completion of any such survey, the surveyor shall report to the warden in writing the number of claims benefited, the names by which such claims are known, and any other necessary information. Whereupon such warden shall notify the same to the owners of the said claims, and require them to choose or elect from each claim one partner to represent them in the committee, who shall meet at such time (not less than three days nor more than seven from the day on which the warden shall have made known the result of the survey) and place as shall be appointed by the warden.

3. No surveyor shall be deemed competent to make any such survey except those appointed by the Government, upon the recommendation of the mining board.

4. It shall be lawful for any warden to authorise any competent surveyor to enter any claim for the purpose aforesaid, and no person shall in any manner obstruct such entrance or impede such surveyor whilst engaged in making the said survey.

5. Should any drainage committee formed in accordance with by-law No. 4. not assemble within the time stated in clause 2 of said by-law, or having assembled not agree to fairly assess themselves, it shall be competent for the warden, upon receiving a requisition in writing from one-fourth of the benefited claim holders, to assess each of the claim holders declared by the surveyor to be benefited in any sum which he may deem equitable, and such assessment shall be paid weekly by the parties assessed to the owners of the shaft declared by the survey to be the draining shaft.

6. Any assessment levied by any committee formed as aforesaid shall be disbursed by the said committee, for the purpose of liquidating the expenses for draining the water, and any other necessary expenses in connection with the same; and all such assessment shall be regularly paid by the said committee to the owners of the shaft declared by the survey to be the draining shaft.

7. Any such committee may determine the period at which the owners of the benefited claims shall pay their assessment.

8. When any claim is supposed to be benefited subsequent to the survey, it shall be competent for the committee, upon examination, to declare whether such is the case or not; but should the committee deem another survey necessary, they shall hereby have full power to engage a competent surveyor, and all expenses attending such survey shall be fairly shared by the benefited claimers.

9. It shall be competent for any such committee to transfer to any other claim, or to a portion among two or more claims, the amount of assessment raised for bailing purposes, should they conceive such claim or claims to be drawing water, and entitled to a share of such assessment.

10. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the foregoing clauses, it shall be competent for any such drainage committee to erect any kind of machinery which they may consider necessary for the more effectual draining of the lode or vein, provided, however, that the whole of the committee are agreeable to do so.

11. When the chairman of any such committee, or in the absence of such committee the owner of the draining shaft, shall certify upon oath to any justice of the peace that the owner of any claim subject to assessment has refused to pay such assessment when due, it shall be lawful for any such justice to enforce the payment in the same manner that any justice is now by law empowered to enforce the payment of money adjudged by him to be paid.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-law.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD

PARTICULARS.

Description of the missing man.—Martin Leahman, a German, of slight make, about 48 years of age, with light hair slightly inclined to grey, and rather bald at the top of his head, without whiskers, but he did not shave for a fortnight before he left. He had on two cloth jumpers, the inner one yellow, two pairs of trousers made by himself of old flour bags, a pair of old bluchers or shoes, with blue stockings tied with old rags, an old black hat with a cover of old sacking.

On some day about the middle of June last, at 7 a.m., Leahman and Christian Von See were seen going in the direction of Myers's Flat with a horse and cart. About 8 a.m. they passed the "Allies Hotel," at Myers's Flat; and were then going towards Pearson's. Some days subsequently, at 5 p.m., Von See called at the "Allies Hotel;" he was accompanied by an aboriginal, and stated that he had been looking for a horse on the Loddon but could not find him. Von See also stated that he had travelled that day from the Serpentine, and had stopped the previous night at "Wood's Hotel."

Leahman, it appears, accompanied Von See to search for a lost chesnut horse, which had once strayed from its former owner (Mr. Cotton, of the Allies Hotel), and was eventually found at the Lower Loddon pound. Von See had on two occasions previously gone on foot and alone in search of this horse. There is reason to believe that they on this last occasion proceeded towards the Lower Loddon. The aboriginal above-mentioned is said to have gone to the Whipstick.

On Saturday, the 19th, and Sunday, the 20th of June last, Von See was at the "Durham Ox" public-house (Wood's), at Serpentine Creek, and then gave to mounted constable Emerson the following brands and description of a chesnut horse, which he stated he had lost and had come to look for, viz., "a chesnut horse, branded CT near shoulder, T off shoulder."

On Sunday, the 20th of June, the constable saw Von See's horse and cart at the above-mentioned public-house.

On Monday, the 21st of June, Von See left, and went in the direction of the Serpentine Inn (Holph's).
