WITH reference to the notice published in the *Government Gazette* on 31st May, 1859, relative to "Coast and Harbor Lights" in Victoria, the following intimation, giving details of the position of, and other matters relating to, the lighthouse on *Wilson's Promontory*, is published for the general information of mariners.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.—WILSON'S PROMONTORY LIGHT.

In reference to a note appended to a notice to mariners respecting the abovenamed light, dated the 28th of May, 1859: Notice is hereby given that the light on *Wilson's Promontory* will be exhibited, as formerly stated, on the evening of the 15th of July next, and on every night thereafter, from sunset to sunrise.

The *Wilson's Promontory Lighthouse* is situated on the south-eastern part of that headland; its approximate position is latitude 39° 9' S, longitude 146° 23' E.

The light will be a catoptric, first class *fixed white light*, elevated three hundred and forty-two (342) feet above the mean level of the sea, and will be seen in clear weather at the distance of about twenty-four (24) nautic miles, allowing ten feet for the height of the eye, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

The lighthouse tower is circular, built of stone, and painted *white*.

The light will be visible from E.N.E. seaward, round southerly to S.S.W., excepting that by the intervention of the adjacent islands the light will be eclipsed to vessels upon the undermentioned bearings from it, and for a few degrees on either side of them.

Bearings of islands taken from the lighthouse, and their approximate distances:—

Vessels steering through Bass's Straits, or from Port Phillip, bound eastward round *Wilson's Promontory*, may first see the light through the gap between Cleft and the adjacent Glennie Islands, bearing E.N.E.; as they proceed to the southward and eastward it will be eclipsed for a few degrees by Cleft Island.

When the light bears N.E. the channel between Cleft Island and the Rodondo will be open, and vessels may steer direct for the promontory.

Vessels to the eastward of the Seal Islands, and bound round the promontory, sighting the light bearing to the southward of S.W., will be to the northward of the fairway, and should haul out until the light bears S.W. by W., which bearing will lead them clear of Clifty and the other Seal Islands.

All bearings are by compass.

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

DAYLESFORD.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by One hundred and sixty-one householders at Daylesford, in the county of Talbot, praying for the erection of the said township into a municipal district.

The petitioners state, that they are all householders resident in and around the township of Daylesford, and within the district hereinafter described:

That such district contains a large quantity of land under cultivation, and that extensive mining operations of a permanent character are being carried on therein and in the neighborhood:

That at a public meeting, held on the 18th of May, 1859, a resolution was carried unanimously, that the establishment of a municipal council would be beneficial to the township and district in general:

That they are of opinion that the district hereinafter described should be created a municipality, its area containing a population of more than 300 householders, and not exceeding nine square miles, wherein no point is distant more than six miles from any other point, with the following boundaries, viz.:-

Beginning at the north-east corner of allotment 9, section 7, parish of Glenlyon; from thence west 77 chains to a creek unnamed; from thence along the said creek south to the north-west corner of allotment 1, section 7, parish of Wombat; from thence south 39 chains; from thence west 56 chains; from thence south 40 chains; from thence due west 175½ chains; from thence due south 248 chains; from thence east 128 chains; from thence north 86½ chains, east 25½ chains, north 55½ chains, east 76 chains, north 23½ chains, west 4 chains, north 70 chains, east 27 chains, north 39½ chains, east 14 chains, and north 97 chains, to the commencing point aforesaid.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"And your petitioners therefore pray that the said district so defined may be proclaimed a municipality under the name of 'The Municipal District of Daylesford,' according to the provisions of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15."

No. I.—SMITH WARD, MELBOURNE.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by One thousand and three householders in the ward of the city of Melbourne called Smith Ward, praying for the erection of the said ward into a municipal district under the said Act.

The petitioners recite the 1st and 2nd sections of the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, and state that they are in number One thousand and three, all resident within the district called Smith Ward, and request that the substance and prayer of their petition may be published as directed by the said Act, in order that in due time, if no sufficient cause is shown to the contrary, the district hereinafter described and named may be proclaimed a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:-

Smith Ward, bounded on the south by a line running east along the centre of Victoria street from its intersection with Elizabeth street to its intersection with Nicholson street; thence by a line running north along the centre of Nicholson street to its intersection with the north side of Reilly street; thence by a line running east along the said north side of Reilly street to its intersection with the centre of Smith street; thence by a line running north along the said centre of Smith street to its intersection with the southern side of the Heidelberg road; thence by a line running easterly along the said southern side of the said road to its junction with the west side of the Merri Creek; thence by a line running up the said creek to its intersection with the south boundary line of the Brunswick municipality; thence west along the said boundary line to its intersection with the east side of the Sydney road; thence by a line running southerly along the east side of the Sydney road to its junction with the north end of the Madeline street extension; thence by a line running west at right angles to east (crossing the Sydney road) to its intersection with the west side of the Sydney road; thence by a

line running southerly along the said west side of the Sydney road to its junction with the northern side of the Flemington road; thence by a line running south-easterly along the centre of Elizabeth street to the commencing point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"May it therefore please your Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council, to take the premises into your gracious consideration, and cause the advertisement of the substance and prayer of this petition to be made in the *Government Gazette*, as required by statute, and in due time thereafter, if there be no counter petition signed by a greater majority (*sic*) of householders of Smith Ward and delivered, then, in pursuance of the aforesaid statute, to proclaim the locality presently known as and called Smith Ward to be a municipal district, to be known by the name and style of the 'Barkly Municipality,' or such other name as your Excellency shall adopt, all within the meaning of the said statute, or to do, order and proclaim otherwise in the premises as it may seem meet to your Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council."

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

No. II.—SMITH WARD, MELBOURNE.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by Forty-eight citizens of the city of Melbourne (stated to be the majority of the residents in the portion of Smith Ward east of Nicholson street, and bounded on the north and south by the municipalities of Brunswick and Fitz Roy), praying to be included within the municipal district of Fitz Roy.

The petitioners state, that rates have been levied by the corporation of Melbourne in their locality for at least six years, during all which time none of the revenue has been expended directly or indirectly in improving any portion of it:

That in consequence of this neglect they have suffered great pecuniary loss and personal inconvenience, the impassable state of the approaches to the city proper having rendered their property almost valueless:

That the position of the contiguous municipality of Fitz Roy, which is situated immediately south of their locality, and lies between them and the city, is such that they are anxious to be embraced within it, and the council of the said municipality has expressed its willingness to accede to their desire, and to make all the necessary improvements without delay.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your memorialists, being the majority of the residents within the area described underneath, would therefore pray that your Excellency will be pleased to alter the northern boundary of the municipality of Fitz Roy as follows:—From a point at the intersection of Nicholson street and Reilly street along the centre of Nicholson street northward to the southern boundary of the Brunswick municipality; thence in an easterly direction to the Merri Creek, along the centre of the said creek to the centre of the Plenty road; thence in a south-westerly direction to the centre of the Heidelberg road; thence to a point at the intersection of Smith street and the said road; thence southerly to a point at the intersection of Reilly street and Smith street."

MUNICIPALITY OF AVOCA.

BYE-LAW No. 2.—A BYE-LAW FOR MAKING PUBLIC PLANS OF WORKS, ETC.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to regulate their own proceedings for the good rule thereof: Be it ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Avoca, that the draft of any bye-law proposed for adoption of said council shall be read and adopted at two consecutive meetings of the same, before being passed by the council, and shall be open for inspection of the ratepayers for at least seven days at the town clerk's office.

That all plans and specifications for the formation of any street for drainage, or any other municipal work or building whatever, shall be laid before the council at least seven days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and shall be open to the inspection of the ratepayers at the town clerk's office during that time, and any ratepayer having any objection to make in regard thereto may give notice thereof in writing to the town clerk; provided that such notice be given at least twenty-four hours before the meeting of the council

whereat such matter may have to be decided upon. This bye-law to have effect on being approved of His Excellency the Governor.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 2, made by the municipal council of Avoca, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF BELFAST.

No. 16.—A BYE-LAW TO AMEND "BYE-LAW No. 13.—TO REGULATE THE CONDUCTING OF THE ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL."

WHEREAS under authority of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, a bye-law to regulate the proceedings at elections for members of this council was passed and assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and gazetted on the 22nd March, 1859: And whereas certain omissions were made in clause No. 2 of said bye-law: It is therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of the district of Belfast, that from and after the time this bye-law shall receive the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, as required by the provisions of said Act—

1. That said clause, No. 2 of bye-law No. 13, shall be rescinded; and

2. That the following shall be substituted therefor and be construed with and taken to be part of said bye-law No. 13:—

If at any election a poll shall be demanded in the manner and form required by the said Act, the chairman shall cause to be provided at the polling place or places a sufficient number of stalls or compartments, to be provided with ink and pens, or pencils, for the purpose of enabling the electors to mark the voting papers as hereinafter provided; in any which polling place no person other than the chairman, or his deputy, the town clerk, or the electors who shall for that time be tendering their votes, and the police under the chairman's control, shall be entitled to be present, except by the chairman's written authority, which shall only be given to members of council, candidates for election, and a scrutineer for each candidate, duly authorised, in writing, by such candidate, or, if absent, by his agent.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 16, made by the municipal council of Belfast, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF ST. KILDA.

BYE-LAW No. 24.—A⁵ BYE-LAW FOR THE REGULATION OF PUBLIC VEHICLES WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF ST. KILDA.

THE municipal council of St. Kilda, by virtue of the power to them in this behalf given in the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, and of all other powers and authorities enabling them in this behalf, do hereby enact as follows:—

1. Such places as the said council shall from time to time appoint shall be stands for public vehicles plying for hire within the municipal district aforesaid; provided that the council may from time to time, as they shall see fit, alter the situations and number of the said stands so appointed, and of the vehicles on each stand: six clear days' notice of such appointment and of such alteration shall be given by such council by advertisement in one newspaper published within the city of Melbourne, and in the local newspaper.

2. The owner or driver of any public vehicle shall not permit any part of such vehicle, or of any horse drawing the same, to stand within ten feet of the corner of any street, whether for hire or otherwise.

3. At every fourth vehicle on each stand there shall be left a space of at least six feet for passengers to pass through.

4. Public vehicles shall take their stations on the stand in the order of their arrival, and when any vehicle shall be called or driven off any stand, the vehicle immediately behind shall draw up to the vacated place, and any other vehicle behind in the like order.

5. No driver of any public vehicle shall suffer the same to stand for hire across any street or alongside of any other public vehicle, nor obstruct the driver of any other vehicle in taking up or setting down any person, nor wilfully, wrongfully, or forcibly prevent, or endeavor to prevent the driver of any other vehicle from taking a fare.

6. No owner or driver of any public vehicle shall permit his vehicle, with or without horses, to stand in any street, lane, thoroughfare or public place, longer than may be necessary for loading or unloading, or taking up or putting down any passenger, except while standing for hire in some lawful place appointed for that purpose, as provided by this bye-law, or waiting for the hirer.

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7. No driver or conductor of any public vehicle shall carry or knowingly permit to be carried in any such vehicle within the said municipality, except to some police office, or watch-house, any person so noisily or violently conducting himself, or otherwise so misbehaving as to occasion any public annoyance or disturb the public peace.

8. The driver of every public vehicle shall be constantly attendant on the same when plying on any public stand, or otherwise engaged for hire within the said municipality.

9. Every public vehicle plying for hire, or engaged after sunset and before sunrise, within the said municipality, shall be provided with proper carriage lights, and the driver shall keep the same lighted while so plying or engaged for hire.

10. The driver of every public vehicle shall place a muzzle upon the head of any vicious horse used or employed by him, and keep the same thereon whilst on any stand within the said district.

11. Every driver of a public vehicle who shall feed any horse whilst on any stand within the said district shall use a nose bag to contain the forage, and shall not remove such horse's blinkers during the time of feeding.

12. The words "public vehicle and vehicle," where used in this bye-law, shall be understood to mean all coaches, omnibusses, cars, cabs, and other carriages plying for hire or carrying passengers for hire within the municipal district of St. Kilda, whether at separate and distinct fares for each passenger, or at one fare for the whole vehicle, or otherwise, and not impelled otherwise than by animal power; the word "owner" shall signify every person possessed of a beneficial interest in any public vehicle; and the word "conductor" shall include every person other than the driver who shall attend upon any public vehicle, or upon the passengers therein: and whenever in this bye-law, with reference to any person, animal, matter, or thing, any word or words is or are used importing the singular number only, yet such word or words shall be understood to include several persons, animals, matters, or things, unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant thereto.

13. For every offence against any of the provisions of this bye-law the offender shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 24, made by the municipal council of St. Kilda, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

CARLSRUHE ROAD DISTRICT.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE CARLSRUHE DISTRICT ROAD BOARD, CONFIRMED AT A MEETING HELD ON THE 16TH APRIL, 1859.

ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS.

THE business of the board shall be conducted on all occasions with open doors.

2. At all meetings of the board the business shall commence as soon as the legal quorum is present; but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of thirty minutes after the hour appointed for meeting, such circumstance shall be noted (with the names of the members present) in the minute book, and such meeting shall lapse.

3. The minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the Board, in order to their confirmation; and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon, except such as to their accuracy, as a record of their proceedings.

4. At all meetings, the readings of correspondence unconnected with the business of the meeting, the presentation of petitions, and the bringing up of reports, shall have the precedence of all motions.

5. Every communication addressed to the board shall be in proper form, and presented by one of its members, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.

6. On the presentation of a petition no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given in the usual manner, and the only question that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be, that the petition be received; and if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

7. No report shall be considered or adopted on its presentation, nor until due notice shall be given. All such reports shall be read and received *pro forma*, and if ordered by the board, printed for distribution among the members.

8. If in the report of a committee there are distinct recommendations contained, such report shall not be adopted until the sense of the board has been taken separately on each.

9. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the board may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of notice of motion. No such motion, however, shall be decided on at any meeting of the board, unless notice thereof

shall have been given to the secretary, in writing, by the member bringing it forward at the meeting previous to that in which the same shall be taken into consideration.

10. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, be present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the papers.

11. No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next meeting of the board, regularly convened; and every such bye-law shall, in the interim, remain open for the inspection of any of the inhabitants in the office of the board, free of charge.

12. The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee shall be *pro hac vice* a member of such committee.

ORDER OF DEBATE.

1. Any member, when proposing a motion or amendment or discussing any matter, must address the chairman, and no member shall be interrupted unless by a call to order. The member calling to order shall then be heard, and the question decided before the subject is resumed, or any other business entered upon.

2. No member shall speak twice on the same subject, unless by way of explanation merely, or in reply as the mover of an original motion, or upon any amendment; and upon such explanation or reply the question shall be put to the vote.

3. The presiding chairman's decision shall be final on all questions of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

4. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the board, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, at the desire of any member of the board; and the votes of all members shall be entered in the minutes.

5. Any member making a motion or amendment shall put it in form, sign, and deliver it to the secretary, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder; and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the mover.

6. Any member desirous of proposing either an original motion or amendment, must state the nature of such motion or amendment before addressing the board in support thereof.

7. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded; any member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the board by simply noticing that such is disobeyed.

8. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

9. No member shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or impute improper motives to others; and all personal reflections upon any member shall be considered highly disorderly.

10. The chairman shall stand up when addressing the board in discussing of any question.

11. Any member who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member, shall, if required by the board, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the board.

12. Any member may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a member immediately on the same being used.

13. Any member may of right require the production of any of the documents of the board relating to the question or matter in discussion.

14. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time; but if lost, another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote.

15. Upon the adoption of any amendment by the board, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion; and for all purposes of subsequent discussion, the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

16. The chairman shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as is necessary to form and declare his opinion, from the show of hands, which party has the majority.

17. The board in all cases shall vote by show of hands.

18. No discussion will be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

19. Any member of the board may enter his protest against any resolution of the board, provided that such protest is not inconsistent with truth, or disrespectful to the board. Notice of intention of protest must, however, in every case be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest, signed by the member or members protesting, and specifying the reasons for protesting, must be entered, before the next regular meeting of the board, by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the secretary's office, and duly referred to in the minutes of the board; the same to be considered, also, a part of such minutes.

20. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the board, shall

be entertained during the same year, unless a call of the whole board has been duly made for that purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the board which shall have been negatived by the board, shall be again entertained during the same year.

21. No election to any office at the disposal of the board shall take place until six clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more of the local newspapers, inviting applications from candidates properly qualified.

22. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the board shall be fixed in all cases before proceeding to the election.

FORMATION OF CONTRACTS.

1. No member shall be received as surety for any officer, nor shall any auditor or other officer become surety for any other employé of the member, or for any work to be done for the board; and in all cases where security shall be required, the expense of preparing the same shall be borne by the party giving the same.

2. All contracts shall be made by tender, advertised not less than by two insertions in the local papers. Each tender shall be deposited in the tender box, addressed to the chairman, and such tender only be opened at the time of their consideration by the board; the respective amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, to be entered in every case on the minutes of the board; and when tenders are accepted, a contract bond shall be entered into and signed by the contractor and chairman of the road board, the seal of the board being attached thereto.

PAYMENT OF MONEYS.

All payments of moneys received from Government shall be by a cheque signed by the chairman and countersigned by the secretary, and no such cheques shall be given unless they be passed at a regular meeting of the board.

LOCAL ASSESSMENT.

Collection thereof.

1. In all cases it shall be deemed sufficient for the collector to call once for payment of any amount due upon the assessment roll; and, in the event of any such amount not being paid to him, a notice shall be left, stating that unless the amount be paid to the secretary of the board before the expiration of one month from the date thereof, legal proceedings will be taken for its recovery—a duplicate of such notice to be deposited in the office of the board.

2. All payments shall be made by an order on the treasurer, signed in the same manner as the vote account payments.

3. Any one or more of these may be suspended *pro tem.*, in case of emergency, with the consent of the majority of the board.

THIRD REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING 10TH JUNE, 1859, INCLUSIVE.

I.—MEETINGS.

DURING the period embraced by this report the council have held 33 meetings, viz.:—24 general and 9 special, of which the chairman, councillor Kenworthy attended 30, councillors Kelly 26, R. D. Thompson 28, Bland 30, Healey 20, Fitzgerald 24 out of 25, and James Thompson 24 out of 25 meetings.

II.—PUBLIC WORKS.

Completed.

Two and a half miles and twelve chains of footpaths.
 Three culverts in Epping, Baynton, and Edden streets.
 Culvert at junction of Mollison and Hutton streets.
 Purchase and erection of twenty iron lamp-posts and lamps.

The first portion of the Government grant received for the current year is £954 6s. 11d. This will be supplemented by the local rate of One shilling in the pound, amounting to £1183.

The certified statement of the receipts and expenditure for the half-year appears at the foot of this report.

On the 11th December, 1858, councillor Kelly (the late chairman) having declined to accept the office, councillor Kenworthy was elected chairman of the council for the current year.

On the 17th December last, councillors James and Geary resigned, and councillors Fitzgerald and James Thomson were elected in their stead.

F. H. Boulton, Esq., has been appointed solicitor to the council.

The new valuation for the year amounts to £23,660.
 The council purchased sets of standard weights and measures for the use of an inspector, but owing to the defective state of the law they cannot at present be made available.

The new ratepayers' roll for the year contains 406 names.
 The levels and gradients of the principal streets have been adopted, and are in the hands of the town surveyor.

The council are now in treaty with Mr. Praagst for lighting the town with gas.

The council appointed one of a deputation to His Excellency the Governor, from the various inland districts, having for its object the establishment of Local Insolvent Courts, the result of which was considered satisfactory.

The council prepared a memorial and appointed a deputation to the Government urging them to make a survey of the proposed North Deviation Railway, in compliance with which a survey has been forthwith promised. The council are happy in acknowledging the assistance rendered in this work by the municipality of Castlemaine, the Carlsruhe Road Board, and others.

The council has been in communication with committees formed for the purpose of establishing fairs and a corn market, in which undertakings the council was desirous of rendering every assistance in its power. Legal difficulties have, however, for the present operated to prevent anything being done.
