PROTECTION OF FISHERIES ACT.

THE attention of persons using nets in any bay, estuary, or other influx of the sea, or any river in Victoria, is directed to the second clause of the Act 22 Victoria No. 77, by which it is prescribed that such persons shall register their names, places of abode, &c., at the nearest court of petty sessions. A penalty not exceeding Five pounds is prescribed by the third section in cases in which nets shall be used by persons who do not register themselves.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

EAST ST. KILDA.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by Fifty-five householders, stated to be the majority of the residents in the portion of the Caulfield road district generally known as East St. Kilda, praying that their locality may be annexed to the municipal district of St. Kilda.

The petitioners state, that they are resident householders within the portion of the Caulfield road district known as East St. Kilda, which may be generally described as bounded on the north by the Great Dandenong road, on the south by the Glen Huntley road, on the west by a road or street called Hotham street, and on the east by a road called Barkly road; and that they are desirous of being included within the municipal district of St. Kilda:

That the said locality adjoins the said municipality, and contains an average of at least thirty-six residents to each square mile, of whom the petitioners state that they constitute the majority:

That the municipal council of St. Kilda have expressed their willingness to accede to their proposal for annexation.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"That your Excellency will avail yourself on our behalf of the powers vested in you under the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, section 3, and proclaim the locality described in this petition to be united with and form part of the municipal district of St. Kilda."

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

No. III.—SMITH WARD, COUNTER PETITION TO No. I.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the counter-petition hereinafter mentioned, which was received at this office within the period allowed by the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, for the delivery of the same, signed by One thousand three hundred and thirty freeholders and householders resident in Smith Ward, in the city of Melbourne, opposed to the severance of the said ward from the city, as prayed for in a petition (No. I.), the substance and prayer whereof were published on the 24th ultimo and at subsequent dates.

The counter-petitioners state that they are freeholders (householders resident) in Smith Ward, Melbourne, and that their attention has been drawn to a petition emanating from the same ward, which was published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th ultimo, wherein the erection of the ward into a separate municipality was prayed for.

The counter-petitioners further state that they are opposed to such separation on several grounds, viz.:—1st, because the severance of the ward from the city is highly undesirable, as leading to a partition of interests between localities whose contiguity renders union infinitely more advantageous; 2ndly, because they believe, that after making all fair allowance, no case of mismanagement or neglect of the interests of the ward can be brought against the city council to justify the demand for separation; 3rdly, because they believe that the movement for separation has had its origin, and many of the signatures to the petition therefor have been obtained through misrepresentation of facts; 4thly, because they are of opinion that separation will retard the interests of the ward, and although by no means perfectly satisfied with the city council as at present constituted, they prefer entrusting their interests to that body rather than to the ardent advocates for separation; 5thly, because among other evils anticipated from separation, the burden of maintaining and forming the roadway around the extensive public reserves proposed to be included in the new municipal district, such as Carlton Gardens, Prince's Park, the University, the Cemetery, &c., which are designed for the improvement and benefit of the metropolis, would fall upon the ratepayers of the proposed district, at the same time that no revenue can be derived from such roadway.

The counter-petitioners also allege that the petition of the separationists contains among some genuine signatures the names of many persons who are not householders or ratepayers, and who are without interest, in Smith Ward.

And the counter-petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore most humbly and urgently pray that your Excellency will take their case into your most serious consideration, and that your Excellency will be pleased to favorably entertain our petition by refusing to grant a separation from the city of Melbourne."

The petitioners state that they are freeholders, householders, and residents within the municipal district of Fitz Roy, and that great injustice would be done to them by including within their district the portion of Smith Ward east of Nicholson street, and bounded on the north and south by the municipalities of Brunswick and Fitz Roy, as prayed for in a petition purporting to be signed by a majority of the residents in the portion of Smith Ward above described.

They are of opinion, that as their district is in a state of infancy, and requires that a great number of streets and public works of importance be commenced and completed to ensure to the inhabitants proper means of access to their homes, and thorough drainage so essential to health, it will be detrimental to their interests to annex to their district the portion of Smith Ward above referred to, whereby the expenditure of some portion of the rates paid by them will be diverted from their own locality, in which they are domiciled and have paid taxes for upwards of seven years, to the annexed locality.

EMERALD HILL MUNICIPALITY.
REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE HALF-
YEAR ENDING 30TH JUNE, 1859.

DURING the half-year the following works have been executed, viz.:—

The widening to seventy-nine feet of extension of Moray street, from York street to the Sandridge road.

The formation, kerbing, and partial channelling of Dorcas street, from Cecil to Moray street.

The formation and metalling of Cecil street, from Dorcas to Park streets.

The temporary formation of a portion of Montague street; also, footpaths and water channels in several other streets where more permanent works have not yet been executed.

A crossing over the railway in the line of the Three-chain road, with approaches on each side forty feet in width.

A planked footway six feet in width along the south bank of the Yarra, from the line of the extension of Clarendon street to the Falls.

Wood kerbing has been laid down in Dorcas street east and west, in Coventry and Bank streets west, and in portions of Moray street.

Also, a crossing at the entrance to Little Park street from Cecil street, a cube crossing in Clarendon street at the intersection of Dorcas street, and channelling in Coventry street east of Clarendon street.

Forty-five corners of public streets have been stone-kerbed and channelled.

A fire alarm bell weighing nearly 5 cwt has been purchased and placed on the Town Hall Reserve.

The following works are in progress:—Channelling in portions of Moray street; the formation of portion of the Three-chain road; the formation of Bank street west; and Coventry street between Cecil street and the railway station.

A contract has been entered into for the supply and delivery of 1800 yards of metal, which will be immediately laid down in portions of Moray street, Clarendon street, Cecil street, Ferrers street, Coventry and Bank streets west.

The flagging ordered from the Yorkshire quarries is in course of arrival, and will be distributed over the township according to the requirements of each street.

Arrangements of a satisfactory character have been made with the Melbourne Gas Company for lighting the public lamps; 28 additional lamp-posts have been erected, and the whole are now being prepared to receive the pipes.

After having been for a considerable time in communication with the Sewerage and Water Commission, the council have at last secured the extension of the Yan Yean water supply to this district, the commissioners having imposed as a condition that the extension of Moray street from the Sandridge road to the Falls should be formed sufficiently wide to receive the mains. Pipes have been already laid in several of the main streets, and the remainder will be laid immediately.

The council finding the Three-chain road was a thoroughfare extensively used by carters and others non-resident in the district (who likewise used the other streets of the township without in any way contributing towards their maintenance), and that the formation and maintenance of the Three-chain road would act as a considerable drain on the town funds, the lands abutting therein being principally composed of reserves, framed a bye-law establishing a toll upon the road, which bye-law has received the assent of His Excellency. The toll has been leased, and the formation of portion of the road commenced.

Considerable improvements have been effected on the Sandridge road. The footpaths on the north side have been formed from Montague street to the railway crossing, and from the toll-house to the angle of the road. A number of additional lamps have been erected along the road. The footpaths have been kerbed, and are in course of being planted with suitable trees. Two thousand yards of additional metal are now being spread on the carriage-way, and orders have been transmitted to Britain for sufficient quantity of chain for a fence to be erected along the outer edge of the footpaths.

Many matters of importance have occupied the attention of the council and have received careful consideration, the action required being taken on each; amongst which matters may be mentioned the establishment of public baths, cattle yards, and markets within the district, the proposed bridge at the Falls, the crossing over the railway in the line of Clarendon street, additional postal communication, amendment of the municipal law, &c., &c.

The annual election took place on the 24th and 25th of June, and resulted in the re-election of Councillor Service, and the return of Mr. R. S. Mills and Dr. Haig in the room of Messrs. Gardner and Ross, who retired by rotation.

There have been twenty-four regular and five special meetings during the half-year, in all twenty-nine meetings, out of which
