THE attention of persons using nets in any bay, estuary, or other influxion of the sea, or any river in Victoria, is directed to the second clause of the Act 22 Victoria No. 77, by which it is prescribed that such persons shall register their names, places of abode, &c., at the nearest court of petty sessions. A penalty not exceeding Five pounds is prescribed by the third section in cases in which nets shall be used by persons who do not register themselves.

Gentiemen.

The great results bearing upon the advancement of the science of navigation, which have been obtained during the last ten years, by collecting ships' logs according to Maury's plan, must necessarily impress us with the importance of also rendering our assistance by pursuing a similar method to those at present followed in Great Britain and the United States.

The logs of splendid ships, skilfuily navigated, which enter this port, afford an opportunity of collecting a great many facts, which, properly classified and compared, would prove of the greatest benefit to navigation.

These ideas impress me with the necessity of combining with the Observatory for Terrestrial Magnetism a branch for the development of nautical science, and thus it happens that I bring these few lines under your notice, and ask for your support in a matter which is of the highest importance in enlarging our knowledge in the theory of winds and currents, and for the development of science in general.

Those gentlemen who are in the habit of keeping the "Abstract Log" according to Maury's regulations, are only requested to report to the Observatory when appearances in nature, discoveries; disasters, &c., took place-during the passage, and to give a short sketch of the circumstances under which they occurred. An extract from such logs is in this case not required, as they will be examined when returned to the proper authorities in Great Britain or the United States.

All common logs will be of the greatest value for the objects of the Observatory, and an inspection of them is very desirable, and I would therefore request you to supply me with them under the promise to have them returned within four days.

It is a matter of the highest importance for the development of navigation in this country to obtain the logs of coasters in order to enable me to derive from them facts calculated for the construction of wind and current charts of this coast and the adjacent seas.

In return for the assistance thus rendered, I am willing to correct gratuitously, sextants, barometers, and thermometers, which are used in making the observations, and the instruments have only to be brought to the Observatory to undergo the most careful examination.

In conclusion, I have only to add that I invite all captains during their stay in this port to visit the Observatory as frequently as possible, and whatever information is in my power to furnish them with, and whatever aid bearing upon the scientific part of navigation I can give them, shall certainly be supplied with the greatest readiness.
