RESERVED BILL ASSENTED TO.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of
the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General
and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-
Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Constitution Statute* it is amongst other
things enacted, that the provisions of the Act of the
fourteenth year of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-nine, and of the
Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty, chapter
seventy-six, *For the Government of New South Wales and Van
Diemen's Land*, which relate to the giving and withholding of
Her Majesty's assent to Bills, and the reservation of Bills for
the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, shall apply
to Bills to be passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly
constituted under the *Constitution Act of Victoria* and the now
reciting statute, and by any other legislative body or bodies
which may at any time hereafter be substituted for the present
Legislative Council and Assembly: And whereas on the
twenty-fourth day of February, in the year One thousand
eight hundred and fifty-nine, the Bill hereinafter mentioned,
passed by the said Legislative Council and Legislative
Assembly, was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's
pleasure thereon: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the
Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation signify and
declare that the Bill, intituled, *An Act to enlarge the powers of
the Australian Trust Company, and to remove doubts as to the
validity of Deeds executed by Agents of the Company, and for
other purposes*, so reserved as aforesaid, has been laid before
Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased
to assent to the same.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifth and sixth years of Her
Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for the Government of New
South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*, it is amongst other things
enacted, that no Bill which shall be reserved for the signifi-
cation of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon shall have any force or
authority within the colony of New South Wales until the
Governor of the said colony shall signify, either by speech or
message to the Legislative Council of the said colony, or by
Proclamation as therein aforesaid, that such Bill has been laid
before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been
pleased to assent to the same:

And whereas by another Act passed in the thirteenth and
fourteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for
the better Government of Her Majesty's Australian Colonies*, it
was provided among other things that the provisions of the
said former Act concerning the reservation of Bills for the sig-
nification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon should apply to
and be in force in the colony of Victoria:

And whereas the said provisions were maintained in force
as regards Bills passed by the Legislative Council and Legisla-
tive Assembly of the said colony by a subsequent Act passed
in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of the reign of Her
said Majesty, intituled, *An Act to enable Her Majesty to assent
to a Bill as amended of the Legislature of Victoria to establish a
Constitution in and for the Colony of Victoria*:

And whereas on the twenty-fourth of February, One thou-
sand eight hundred and fifty-nine, the Governor of the said
colony of Victoria reserved a certain Bill passed by the Legis-
lative Council and Legislative Assembly of the said colony,
intituled, *An Act to enlarge the powers of the Australian Trust
Company, and to remove doubts as to the validity of Deeds
executed by agents of the Company, and for other purposes*, for
the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon:

And whereas the said Bill so reserved as aforesaid has been
laid before Her Majesty in Council, and it is expedient that the
said Bill should be assented to by Her Majesty:

Now therefore Her Majesty, in pursuance of the said Acts, and in exercise of the powers thereby reserved to Her Majesty as aforesaid, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, declare her assent to the said Bill. And the Most Noble the Duke of Newcastle, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

GIPPS LAND GENERAL SESSIONS TO BE HOLDEN AT PALMERSTON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better Administration of Justice in the Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace should be established and holden in certain places therein named, and such other places and districts within the said colony as the Lieutenant Governor thereof should appoint; and that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said colony from time to time to define and appoint by Proclamation the limits and boundaries of such places or districts within which all such courts should have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts should be holden, and such limits, districts, places and times respectively to revoke, alter or vary as the said Lieutenant Governor should think fit: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the then Lieutenant Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eleventh day of September, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, it was directed that the Court of General Sessions of the Peace for the district of Gipps Land, therein described, should be holden at Alberton until otherwise ordered: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighth day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it was appointed that the said court should be holden at Alberton aforesaid, at the times therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the said court should be holden at Palmerston in lieu of Alberton: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint that the said Court of General Sessions of the Peace of and for the district of Gipps Land shall be holden at Palmerston, in lieu and instead of Alberton aforesaid, at the times mentioned in the Proclamation lastly above recited until otherwise ordered.

COUNTY COURT TRANSFERRED FROM ALBERTON TO PALMERSTON.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the more easy Recovery of certain Debts and Demands*, it was enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to direct that county courts should be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, and with the advice aforesaid to alter the place of holding any such court: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the seventh day of January in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it was amongst other things directed that a county court should be holden at Alberton once at least in every six calendar months: And whereas it is deemed expedient that such county court should be holden at Palmerston instead of Alberton: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a county court shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act at Palmerston in lieu of Alberton aforesaid.

And the Honorable Henry Samuel Chapman, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF DAYLESFORD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition for the purposes aforesaid has been presented to His Excellency the Governor by the householders and landholders at Daylesford, in the county of Talbot, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF DAYLESFORD.—Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 9 of section 7 in the parish of Glenlyon; thence west seventy-seven chains to a creek unnamed; thence southerly by the said creek to the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section 7 in the parish of Wombat; thence south thirty-nine chains; thence west fifty-six chains; thence south forty chains; thence west one hundred and seventy-five chains and fifty links; thence south two hundred and forty-eight chains; thence east one hundred and twenty-eight chains; thence north eighty-six chains and fifty links; thence east twenty-five chains and fifty links; thence north fifty-five chains and fifty links; thence east seventy-six chains; thence north twenty-three chains and fifty links; thence west four chains; thence north seventy chains; thence east twenty-seven chains; thence north thirty-nine chains and fifty links; thence east fourteen chains; and thence northerly ninety-seven chains to the commencing point.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Daylesford."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this nineteenth day of September, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

MUNICIPALITY OF EMERALD HILL.

BYE-LAW No. 22.—A BYE-LAW FOR LEVYING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND THREEPENCE IN THE POUND FOR THE CURRENT MUNICIPAL YEAR.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate on all property, works, houses, tenements, or lands within such district, according to its fair average annual value, such rate not to exceed Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council for the district of Emerald Hill, that a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound for the current municipal year be levied on all property in works, houses, tenements, or lands within said district, to become due and payable on and after the first day of October, 1859.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 22, made by the municipal council of Emerald Hill, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF CASTLEMAINE.

THE SEVENTH HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF CASTLEMAINE.

IN accordance with the 43rd clause of the Municipal Act, 18 Victoria No. 15, the following report of the proceedings of the municipal council of Castlemaine for the preceding six months is submitted. The period of this report extends from the 28th January, 1859, to the 27th July, 1859, both days inclusive.

CHANGES IN MEMBERS AND OFFICERS.

On the 26th April Councillor Christophers resigned his seat, and on the 27th May James Chapman, Esq., was elected in his stead. On the 29th March it was determined that the town surveyor's salary should be at the rate of £300 per annum, with the privilege of private practice.

The council resolved to take the weighbridge under its own management, and on the 15th March Mr. L. J. Welsford was elected weighmaster; at the same time the messenger's services were dispensed with.

MEETINGS OF COUNCIL AND ATTENDANCE OF MEMBERS.

During the half-year there have been twenty-seven general meetings and one special meeting of council, the attendance of members being as follows:—

PUBLIC WORKS.

The following public works have been completed:—
The forming, metalling, channelling, and kerbing of Urquhart street, for length of 5 chains.

For enclosing the eastern end of the market-house with doors.

For quarrying and carting 500 cubic yards of bluestone from Bald Hill, South Muckleford, for the purpose of providing metal for repair of streets.

For making a portion of the road leading across Barker's Creek.

The following contracts are now in operation, and will soon be completed:—

For forming, kerbing, and channelling the council's portion of Barker street.

For quarrying, breaking, carting, and spreading 500 cubic yards of bluestone metal for completion of Barker street.

For supplying and laying 2000 square yards of flagging.

For the supply and erection of cast iron lamp pillars, lanterns, and gas fittings.

For enclosing reserve on Wattle Flat.

The council have entered into a contract with the Castlemaine Gas Company for lighting the street lamps in the vicinity of their mains for a period of twelve months.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been passed by the council and have received the sanction of His Excellency:—

No. 42. For the assessment of house and land property within the municipal district of Castlemaine; and

No. 43. For levying a rate of one shilling in the pound.

FINANCE.

On the 20th of April a court of petty sessions was held, when eighteen appeals were heard against the assessment, and the amount reduced by £455, leaving a total assessment of £82,691, which was afterwards confirmed by bye-law. The rate of one shilling in the pound on the above amount will be £4134 11s.

The sum of £2122 16s. 8d. has been received of the grant-in-aid, and information was requested as to the full amount to which this municipality is entitled, but no definite answer has yet been received.

MISCELLANEOUS.

A court of revision of the ratepayers' roll was held on the 25th of May.

A grant of £100 was made to the Corn Market Committee, for the purpose of assisting in the formation of a corn market in Castlemaine. Also a grant of £50 to the Castlemaine Volunteer Fire Brigade, and a first-rate fire-engine has been purchased at a cost of £220.

The Mechanics' Institute made application for a grant of £150, but the council, after due deliberation, resolved, that instead of granting them money the sum of £50 should be expended in books for the benefit of that institution, provided a bye-law is sanctioned by the Executive for that purpose.

On the application of the council, a grant of five acres of land at South Muckleford for a municipal quarry was made by the Government.

A grant of £300 has been conceded by the Government for the purpose of enclosing the reserve on Wattle Flat. The money has not yet been received, as it is intended to pay for the work as the work progresses.

WATER SUPPLY.

The question of a water supply for the township still engrosses the attention of the council. The basin of the Coliban has been surveyed, and the town surveyor has been busily engaged in preparing plans and estimates of the work.

The boring in Market square had to be discontinued, the Government Geologist assuring the council that there was no hope of obtaining a supply of water from that locality.
