WHEREAS by the Constitution Statute it is amongst other things enacted, that the provisions of the Act of the fourteenth year of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-nine, and of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy-six, For the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land, which relate to the giving and withholding of Her Majesty's assent to Bills, and the reservation of Bills for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, shall apply to Bills to be passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly constituted under the Constitution Act of Victoria and the now reciting statute, and by any other legislative body or bodies. constituted under the Constitution Act of Victoria and the now reciting statute, and by any other legislative body or bodies which may at any time hereafter be substituted for the present Legislative Council and Assembly: And whereas on the twenty-fourth day of February, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine. the Bill hereinafter mentioned, passed by the said Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly, was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation signify and declare that the Bill, intituled, An Act to enlarge the powers of the Australian Trust Company, and to remove doubts as to the validity of Deeds executed by Agents of the Company, and for other purposes, so reserved as aforesaid, has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same. to assent to the same.

And whereas the said provisions were maintained in force as regards Bills passed by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the said colony by a subsequent Act passed in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of the reign of Her said Majesty, intituled. WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereinafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the Government Gazette, and (if no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the Government Gazette, such locality so defined should be deemed and WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the Government Gazette, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition for the purposes aforesaid has been presented to His Excellency the Governor by the householders and landholders at Daylesford, in the county of Talbot, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Bakkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Excentive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

The Mechanics' Institute made application for a grant of £150, but the council, after due deliberation, resolved, that instead of granting them money the sum of £50 should be expended in books for the benefit of that institution, provided a bye-law is sanctioned by the Executive for that purpose.

On the application of the council, a grant of five acres of land at South Muckleford for a municipal quarry was made by the Government.

A grant of £300 has been conceded by the Government for the purpose of enclosing the reserve on Wattle Flat. The money has not yet been received, as it is intended to pay for the work as the work progresses.

WATER SUPPLY.

The question of a water supply for the township still engrosses the attention of the council. The basin of the Coliban

grosses the attention of the council. The basin of the comban-has been surveyed, and the town surveyor has been busily en-gaged in preparing plans and estimates of the work. The boring in Market square had to be discontinued, the Government Geologist assuring the council that there was no-hope of obtaining a supply of water from that locality.
