No. XII.—BYE-LAW RELATING TO DRY SINKING IN THE PLEASANT CREEK DIVISION OF THE ARARAT DISTRICT.—[14th September, 1859.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the Quartz Miner's Hotel, Pleasant Creek, in the said district, on the 14th day of September, 1859, it is ordained by the said board, that is to say:—

1. *Size of claim.*—The extent of ground for one miner in surface (not exceeding eight (8) feet in depth) shall be twenty-five (25) by fifty (50) feet; in any greater depth one miner shall not hold a claim. The extent of ground for two miners shall be fifty (50) feet by fifty (50) feet. No other size claim shall be allowed, except where specially provided for in other bye-laws.
