MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF DAYLESFORD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-third day of September in the present year, the municipal district of Daylesford was declared as therein mentioned: And whereas the boundaries specified in the said Proclamation comprise the greater area originally proposed by the petitioners for the said municipal district, instead of the lesser area subsequently agreed to by them, and it is expedient to redefine the said district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as purports to describe the boundaries of the said municipal district, and with the advice aforesaid, I do by this my Proclamation declare that the said municipal district of Daylesford shall be and consist of the area comprised within the boundaries and limits hereinafter described, that is to say:—Commencing at the north-eastern angle of portion 2 of section 3, in the parish of Wombat; thence west 175 chains and 50 links; thence south 248 chains; thence east 128 chains; thence north to a point due west of the south-eastern angle of portion 5 of section 16, parish unnamed; thence east to the said south-eastern angle; thence north to the southern boundary of portion 21 of section 4, in the parish of Wombat; thence east to the south-eastern angle of portion 22 in the said section; thence north to the north-eastern angle of the said portion; thence east to a point due south of the south-western angle of portion 4 of section 6, in the parish of Wombat; and thence north to the commencing point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this seventeenth day of October, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.
