The general crop of Oats, cultivated for Oaten HAY, was cut on or about the first week in December.

On the 9th the *Aphis* attacked some of the Brassicae, which the hot winds in November had cleared; and on the 13th cabbages were being destroyed.

The insect increased rapidly after the heavy rain on the 7th.

LIGHTNING was seen at 10.15 p.m. on the 24th, on the N. and N.N.W. horizon. THUNDER was heard on the 19th, at 1 and 2 p.m.; and on the 25th, at 2.30 p.m.

THUNDER-STORMS occurred on the 2nd, between 9 and 10 p.m.; on the 3rd between 5 and 9 p.m.; and on the 26th, between 6 and 10.30 p.m.

SOLAR HALOS were seen on the 2nd, 10th, 11th, 15th, and 17th.

A LUNAR HALO was seen on the 17th.

HALE fell at 11 p.m. on the 7th.

SHOOTING STARS.—On the 15th, at 11.16 p.m., splendid red train meteor about 15° above N. horizon, moving from W. to E.; 14th, at or near 7.45 p.m., large meteor in the S.W., moving from E. to W., and throwing off sparks; 23rd, at 9.41 p.m., small meteor, about 15° above N. horizon, moving from S.E. to N.W.; and on the 31st, at 9 p.m., small meteor near the South Pole; 9.8 p.m., small very rapid meteor from S. to N., about 50° above N. horizon; and 9.11 p.m., very small meteor from E. to W., passing through TELANG. AUSTRA.

A meteor much resembling the AURORA AUSTRALIS was seen at 9.30 p.m. on the 23rd. It was very faint.

On the 2nd and 3rd the wind was slightly warm.

WHEREAS a certain building has been erected at Meredith, in the county of Grant, at the public expense, and for a lock-up for police purposes: And whereas it is deemed expedient to proclaim such building to be a gaol, prison, and house of correction, within the meaning of an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the said colony, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of Offenders*: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the said building, called and known as the Police Lock-up, situated at Meredith aforesaid, as and to be a public gaol, prison, and house of correction, within the meaning of the said Act.

WILL-WILL-ROOK PUBLIC CEMETERY.

REGULATIONS made by the Trustees of the Public Cemetery established at Campbellfield, parish of Will-Will-Rook, county of Bourke:—

1. The burial ground will be open to the public daily from sunrise to sunset.
2. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
3. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept, and may be inspected at the charge set out in schedule A. The register of said grounds is kept by the secretary.
4. By the 8th section of the Act, any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever.
5. Application for such permission to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying, on payment of the charge in schedule A.
6. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person died in indigent circumstances, and that the relatives of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
7. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent in writing of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
8. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
9. Every coffin in a vault or bricked grave to be bricked in, or cemented closely and covered by a slab of stone or iron to the satisfaction of the trustees.
10. The plans of all monuments, tombstones, and fences to be submitted to the trustees for approval.
11. Any person wantonly and wilfully destroying, or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished, as prescribed by the 14th section of the Act 17 Victoria No. 12.
12. The trustees reserve to themselves the right to make any alteration from time to time in these charges and regulations.

NOTE.—At Boroondara affections of the stomach and bowels are on the increase, especially among children. At Brighton cases of fever and dysentery are reported. At Brunswick there were no deaths, but whooping-cough prevails. At Collingwood of the twenty-seven deaths twenty-one were among children under three years of age. At Flemington dysentery, diarrhoea and whooping-cough are reported as very prevalent. At Footscray the health of the district is stated to be good. In Melbourne out of thirty-four cases twenty-one were of children under three years, the most fatal diseases being dysentery and diarrhoea. At Prahran four deaths out of five were of children under three; and at Sandridge and Emerald Hill seven deaths out of the total number (eight) were of children under twelve months. Richmond sent no return. South Yarra calls for no special remark. At St. Kilda dysentery has been prevalent, and also a low form of continued fever. At Williamstown the deaths were considerably above the average owing to five cases of inquest.

SIXTH HALF-YEARLY REPORT.

REPORT of the proceedings of the Municipal Council of Sandhurst for the half-year ending 10th January, 1859.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The works completed during the past half-year, or now in progress, are the formation of Oak street, Lily street, Forest street, Bernal street, Dowling street, Bayne street, and Arnold street; kerbing and channelling portions of Mitchell street, McCrae street, Lyttleton terrace, and Arnold street; flagging footpaths in Pall Mall; bridges over Commissioner's Gully and at the White Hills; tanks in View place and High street; additional lamps, with many other minor works, and the general maintenance of existing works.

The intention of the council, alluded to in last half-year's report, of providing a building suitable for public offices, municipal police court, &c., is being carried out by the erection of the town hall as designed by Mr. Fletcher, and which is now rapidly approaching completion.

BYE-LAWS PASSED.

- No. 15. For establishing vote by ballot.—Assented to.
- No. 16. For legalizing the rate and assessment.
- No. 17. For establishing additional polling places.
- No. 18. For legalizing the appropriation of the grant-in-aid received from Government.

FINANCE.

The assessment for 1858 comprises 2762 properties, giving a total annual value of £115,614, on which a rate of ninepence in the pound has been levied. The market and weighbridge dues for the past half-year have amounted to £642; the sum collected being in a great measure owing to the energy and application of the market inspector, Mr. Ryan.

MISCELLANEOUS.

In the absence of any regulation for the maintenance of the sludge channels (which had been constructed and maintained with the £4000 before obtained from the Government by the

council) to save the town and low auriferous lands from destruction, the council were obliged to undertake a constant heavy weekly expenditure in drainage works, trusting that the Government would refund the amount. It being found, however, at the outset that the Government refused to acknowledge any expenditure in excess of the £4000 before alluded to, a deputation was sent from the council, who succeeded in obtaining a promise from the Honorable the President of the Board of Land and Works that an expenditure of at least £50 a week until the Sludge Commission report was received, should be refunded. The total amount expended to the end of 1858, is £1589. This sum does not appear in the corporation account, as the council hope to recover the whole amount from the Government.

To bring the Botanic Garden reserve into use in the most economical manner, an agreement has been made with a practical gardener to lay out the ground, and plant and maintain any trees or shrubs the council may provide, in return for the use and occupation by himself of a portion of the ground as a market garden.
