WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act for the more easy recovery of certain Debts and Demands, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the several persons who for the time being shall be Attorney General, Solicitor General, and County Court Judges, or any three of them of whom the said Attorney General or Solicitor General shall be one, from time to time to frame such general rules as to them shall seem expedient, in relation to any of the provisions of the said Act as to which there might arise doubts: Now, therefore, in pursuance of the provisions hereinbefore recited, we do frame the General Rule hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

The attention of consignees and persons tendering Import and Fxport Entries for goods both dutiable and free is especially called to the necessity of specifying in such entries respectively the correct value of such goods; and they are hereby cautioned, that by failing to attend to this regulation they are liable to penalties of Twenty pounds and One hundred nounds.

Clause 134.—If any person shall make and subscribe any false declaration, or make or sign any declaration, certificate, or other instrument required by this Act to be verified by signature only, the same being false in any particular, or if any person shall make or sign any declaration made for the consideration of the Commissioner on application presented to him, the same being untue in any particular, or if any person sideration of the Commissioner on application presented to him, the same being untue in any particular, or if any person required by this or any other Act relating to the Customs to answer questions put to him by the officers of Customs shall not truly answer such questions, or if any person shall counterfeit, falsify, or wilfully use when counterfeited or falsified any document required by this or any Act relating to the Customs, or by or under the directions of the Commissioner, or any instrument used in the transaction of any business or matter relating to the Customs, or shall fraudulently alter any document or instrument, or counterfeit the seal, signature, initials, or other mark of or used by the officers of the Customs for the verification of any such document or instrument, or for the security of goods or any other purpose in the conduct of business relating to the Customs, or under the control or management of the Commissioner or any officer of Customs, every person so offending shall for every such offence forfeit the penalty of One hundred pounds.

- At Melbourne (including Pentridge, Yarra Bend, &c.), Nos. 1 to 11 inclusive.
- At Williamstown (including Hobson's Bay), Nos. 3 to 11 inclusive.

CONDITIONS.

- 1. All the articles required by this notice are to be of the best quality of their several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages.
- 2. The flour and bread must be the produce of prime wheat, from which on ration No. 1, twenty per cent., and on those of prisoners of the Crown, twelve per cent. has been extracted in bran and waste.
- 3. Fresh meat (beef and mutton), when ordered for the Lunatic Asylum, to be delivered entirely free from bone, and in all other cases to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately. - 5. The above substitutions are to be made whenever it may be considered advisable by the officer authorised to draw the rations, but not otherwise. Scales Nos. 3, 4 and 5 will be drawn at Pentridge, either with or without vegetables, as the officer in charge may direct.
- 6. The supplies are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto, on the written order of the officer in charge, except in the case of Aboriginal Stations, which are to be supplied under the Melbourne contract, and the several articles are to be delivered at the Government Stores.

- 10. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which, it will be procured by the person requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 7.
- 11. In the country districts, when a Board of Survey cannot be conveniently assembled, and in all cases when the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due, or to the contractor, in waiting for a Board of Survey, the Head of the Department, or officer in charge of the station, will have the power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which, it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 7.

FINANCE.

The amount of rate for 1859, exclusive of arrears of rates for preceding years, is, to the present date, £2503 8s. 6d., with arrears for 1856-7-8, £162 14s., making a total of £2666 2s. 6d. A considerable per centage must be deducted from outstanding rates for those uncollectable from absent owners and other causes. The rate collector reports unprecedented difficulties this year in collecting rates; hence the large balance still outstanding outstanding.

outstanding.

It cannot, however, be too strongly impressed upon the minds of the ratepayers that the legislative grant is regulated in amount by that of the rate collected in this year (1859), for the rate struck in the same. The sum paid will be about 30s. for every pound collected; and, consequently, every pound due in 1859, not paid or collected within that period, will entail a loss of thirty shillings to the municipality.

The town clerk having on the 5th of August last resigned his office of acting municipal treasurer, held it by request of the council until the close of the municipal year, when Thomas Cope, Esq., the chairman, was appointed municipal treasurer for the current municipal year.
