SURVEY OF HIGH AND LOW PRESSURE STEAM VESSELS FOR HALF-YEAR ENDING 31ST DECEMBER, 1859.

NOTICE is hereby given that under the fifth clause of the above cited Act the owner of every steam vessel employed as stated is bound to have the vessel and the whole of her machinery surveyed by the Engineer and Shipwright Surveyors appointed for that purpose by the Victoria Steam Navigation Board, in the manner and at the times following:—

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the more easy Recovery of certain Debts and Demands*, it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to direct that county courts shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands, under the said Act, and from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to direct in what towns and places a county court shall be holden, and that the judge of each court holden under the said Act shall attend and hold such court at the place where the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, shall have directed that such court shall be holden, at such times as such judge shall appoint for that purpose, so that a court shall be holden in such place once at least in such interval as the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, shall in each case direct: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present order direct that a county court shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act at the place and within the interval following, that is to say:—

At Indigo, once at least in every three calendar months.

JURY LISTS TO BE PREPARED FOR THE JURY DISTRICT OF INDIGO.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the fifth day of December, 1859.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating Juries*, it is enacted, that in case any assizes, or any county court or court of general sessions of the peace, shall hereafter be lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at any town other than those at which the same are now holden, the clerk of petty sessions at such court town, and the clerk of petty sessions at every other town or place within the jury district of such court town, and all justices, constables, officers of police and sheriffs, shall within such time as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall order for that occasion only, do and perform all such acts, matters and things in and towards preparing, correcting, allowing, sending and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve as aforesaid, and making out the jury books for every such jury district as are thereinbefore required to be ordinarily done at a different time or period; and all such last-mentioned jury books shall be brought into use, and the persons whose names shall be therein set down shall be liable to serve immediately after the same shall have been made out by the sheriff; and the said last-mentioned books shall be used until new books shall have been prepared under the provisions thereinbefore contained: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, bearing even date herewith, it is ordered that a county court shall be holden at Indigo, the same being a place at which a county court has not previously been holden: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present order direct that jury lists shall be prepared for the jury district of Indigo, in the manner and within the intervals hereinafter stated, that is to say:—

The clerk of petty sessions at Indigo shall issue his warrant to prepare and make out the jury lists for the jury district of Indigo on or before Monday, the twelfth day of December instant; such lists shall be prepared forthwith, and the notice prescribed by the 8th section of the said Act shall be fixed, as provided by the Act, on Sunday, the twenty-fifth day of December aforesaid; the court of petty sessions at Indigo aforesaid shall revise such lists on Friday, the thirteenth day of January now next ensuing; such lists shall be sent to the sheriff on or before Tuesday, the seventeenth day of January aforesaid; and the jury books shall be prepared and brought into use on or before Tuesday, the thirty-first day of the said month of January.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor of the said colony, by any orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within and the times at which circuit courts should be holden in the said colony, and the said limits and times to alter and vary as he should, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the seventh day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, certain times were appointed for the holding of the several circuit courts of Victoria in every year as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter and vary the times appointed for holding the first sittings of such several courts during the year next ensuing: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter and vary the times at which the said courts are now holden, and doth define and direct that the times at which the first circuit courts shall be holden at the several places hereinafter mentioned during the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty, shall be as follow, that is to say:—

At Ballarat on Friday the tenth day of February.

At Beechworth on Thursday the twelfth day of April.

At Castlemaine on Monday the twentieth day of February.

At Geelong on Thursday the second day of February.

At Portland on Wednesday the eleventh day of April.

At Sandhurst on Monday the twenty-seventh day of February.

MUNICIPAL EXEMPTION, MALDON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference by any municipal council constituted under the said Act, with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to except the buildings hereinafter mentioned from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Maldon for one year: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of Maldon, for the period of one year, commencing on the tenth day of September now last past, the following buildings situate and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

The Wesleyan Methodist Chapel, Fountain street;
The Church of England Denominational Boys' School, Main street;
The Church of England Denominational Girls' School, Camp hill;
The Welch Chapel, Peg-leg;
The Presbyterian Denominational School, Eaglehawk road;
The Maldon Hospital.

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY
POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL
DISTRICTS OF BUNINYONG AND HEATHCOTE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander
of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General
and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-
Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the
reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled,
An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places
in Victoria, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many
of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of
towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V.,
VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X., in the said Act, should extend to
and be in force in such cities, towns, districts and places as
the Lieutenant Governor might by proclamation in the *Government*
Gazette declare to come under the operation of the same
respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the
Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to
vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation;
and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last
(being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation
throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after
the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor
of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby
declare that the municipal districts of Buninyong and Heath-
cote shall come under the operations of the sections of the said
Act, numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X.

COUNTY COURTS.

GENERAL RULE UNDER THE ACT 21 VICTORIA No. 29, SEC. 69.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the
reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the*
more easy recovery of certain Debts and Demands, it is enacted
that it shall be lawful for the several persons who for the time
being shall be Attorney General, Solicitor General, and County
Court Judges, or any three of them of whom the said Attorney
General or Solicitor General shall be one, from time to time to
frame such general rules as to them shall seem expedient, in
relation to any of the provisions of the said Act as to which
there might arise doubts: Now, therefore, in pursuance of the
provisions hereinbefore recited, we do frame the General Rule
hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

All notices of special defences under section thirty-five of the
said Act shall be given one clear day before the hearing of the
complaint, and where such notice is given by the post it shall
be posted in such time as that in the ordinary course of the
post it could reach its destination one clear day before the day
fixed for the hearing of such complaint.

And we do further fix the fifteenth day of December instant
as the time for the commencement of the said General Rule.

Clause 58.—Every importer, agent, or other person entering
any goods, who shall wilfully fail to comply with the foregoing
regulations, so far as they are respectively applicable to the
goods so entered by him, shall forfeit and pay the sum of
Twenty pounds.

Clause 134.—If any person shall make and subscribe any
false declaration, or make or sign any declaration, certificate,
or other instrument required by this Act to be verified by signa-
ture only, the same being false in any particular, or if any
person shall make or sign any declaration made for the con-
sideration of the Commissioner on application presented to him,
the same being untrue in any particular, or if any person
required by this or any other Act relating to the Customs to
answer questions put to him by the officers of Customs shall
not truly answer such questions, or if any person shall coun-
terfeit, falsify, or wilfully use when counterfeited or falsified
any document required by this or any Act relating to the
Customs, or by or under the directions of the Commissioner, or
any instrument used in the transaction of any business or
matter relating to the Customs, or shall fraudulently alter any
document or instrument, or counterfeit the seal, signature,
initials, or other mark of or used by the officers of the Customs
for the verification of any such document or instrument, or for
the security of goods or any other purpose in the conduct of
business relating to the Customs, or under the control or
management of the Commissioner or any officer of Customs,
every person so offending shall for every such offence forfeit
the penalty of One hundred pounds.

MUNICIPAL ELECTION.

The Hon. T. T. a'Beckett, Esq., the chairman, being detained in the country on public business, was unable to preside, and the council, pursuant to Bye-law No. 5, elected councillor Turner presiding returning officer.

The nomination meeting was held on the 11th October, 1859, on the municipal site, Johnston street, to supply the vacancies occasioned by the retirement by rotation of councillors the Hon. T. T. a'Beckett, Samuel Ramsden, and John Wood.

The following gentlemen were proposed as candidates, and received the number of votes affixed to their respective names on the close of the poll held on the 12th October, 1859. The returning officer gave his casting vote in favor of Mr. B. Jarvis. This decision was disputed, a petition against it presented by Mr. John Newlands, with a deposit of £50. The council was convened under Bye-law No. 5, and sat as a committee of elections and qualifications thereon, resolved only to examine the voting paper disputed, when they determined the election to be, as declared by the returning officer, in favor of Mr. Benjamin Jarvis.

The council elected Thomas Cope, Esq., chairman of the council for the ensuing municipal year.

FINANCE.

The amount of rate for 1859, exclusive of arrears of rates for preceding years, is, to the present date, £2503 8s. 6d., with arrears for 1856-7-8, £162 14s., making a total of £2666 2s. 6d. A considerable per centage must be deducted from outstanding rates for those uncollectable from absent owners and other causes. The rate collector reports unprecedented difficulties this year in collecting rates; hence the large balance still outstanding.

It cannot, however, be too strongly impressed upon the minds of the ratepayers that the legislative grant is regulated in amount by that of the rate collected in this year (1859), for the rate struck in the same. The sum paid will be about 30s. for every pound collected; and, consequently, every pound due in 1859, not paid or collected within that period, will entail a loss of thirty shillings to the municipality.

The town clerk having on the 5th of August last resigned his office of acting municipal treasurer, held it by request of the council until the close of the municipal year, when Thomas Cope, Esq., the chairman, was appointed municipal treasurer for the current municipal year.
