She is known as having been in service at Deep Creek, Keilor, Nunawading, Dandenong, and Emerald Hill. She has a brother, a laborer, living at Prahran.

Nov. 1.—9-30 a.m. cirri, and below a stratum of white and grey clouds, all at a great elevation; wind changed to W. at 9-47 a.m. 3-30 p.m. dull bluish grey clouds; the air feels warm and oppressive; drops of rain at 1-30 p.m. 9-30 p.m. dark sky; heavy rain.

" 2.—9-30 a.m. cirri, and a lower stratum of white and grey clouds moving quickly from the S.; squall and rain at 9 a.m. 3-30 p.m. small soft detached cumuli; fine. 9-30 p.m. dark clouds.

" 3.—9-30 a.m. small detached white clouds moving from the southward; fine. 3-30 p.m. very slight haze on the extreme E. horizon; fine. 9-30 p.m. fine and clear; shooting star at 9-40 p.m.

" 4.—9-30 a.m. cloudless; warm and fine. 3-30 p.m. one or two small cumuli, and a bank of light brown vapour in the east; fine and warm. 9-30 p.m. fine and clear.

" 18.—9:30 a.m. dull grey clouds and cirri at a great height. 3:30 p.m. bright cumuli moving from the westward; warm and fine. 9:30 p.m. light grey clouds; showers from 7 till 8 p.m.

" 19.—9:30 a.m. beautiful cumuli; fine and warm. 3:30 p.m. haze and cirrus; a little dust; fine and warm. 9:30 p.m. blue sky; fine and clear.

The cutting of Hay was commenced about the 16th.

On the 16th many of the Bradlee were examined, and the Aphid was observed to be unusually numerous and destructive. The hot winds of the 21st, 22nd and 23rd, destroyed the insect, and cabbages which had been seriously injured recovered their freshness. The dried bodies of the insect could be shaken off the plants on the 23rd.

LIGHTNING was seen on the 5th at evening, on the east and west horizon; on the 12th, at 10.15 p.m., on the N.N.W. horizon; on the 16th, at 11 p.m., on the S. horizon; and on the 23rd, at 10 p.m., on the W.N.W. horizon.

THUNDER was heard on the 13th, at 7 a.m.; and on the 17th, at early morning.

THUNDER-STORMS occurred on the 6th, at 7 p.m.; on the 11th, at 5 p.m.; on the 20th, between 2 and 5 p.m., and at 10 p.m.; and on the 30th, at 6 p.m.

SOLAR HALOS were seen on the 5th, 20th, and 22nd.

LUNAR HALOS were seen on the 12th, faint red, about 8° in diameter; 16th, prismatic, about 4½° in diameter; and on the 17th, about 5° in diameter. SHOOTING STARS.—On the 3rd, at 9.40 p.m., small bright meteor in the S. passing from N.W. to S.E.; 4th, at 9.55 p.m., very bright meteor about 65° above W.N.W. horizon, passing to S.W., path at first straight, and before disappearing, zig-zag; 10th, at 9.38 p.m., small faint meteor from N.E. to S.W., about 30° above W. horizon; 22nd, at 8.43 p.m., small bright meteor from S.W. to N.E., about 22° above E.N.E. horizon; and on the 20th, at 9.10 p.m., two small meteors in the S., about 50° above the horizon, the one seen about 2° after the other.

On the 21st and 22nd, WARM winds blew from the N. and N.W., which were occasionally more at the day advanced; and on the 23rd, a WARM wind blew from the N.W. at morning.

The observations at 9.30 p.m. are recorded by CORPORAL HEADY and MR. E. PRICE.
