LAND RESERVED FOR ROADS.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the land hereinafter described, situate in the parish of Frankston, in the county of Mornington, being reserved for the purpose of forming public roads.

Plans, whereon are recorded the course, bearings, and measurement hereinafter set forth, are deposited at this office.

ROADS THROUGH DAVEY'S PRE-EMPTIVE RIGHT.—Commencing at the southern angle of Davey's pre-emptive right, in the parish of Frankston; thence north 50 degrees east 10 chains; thence north 13 degrees east 28 chains; thence north 1 degree 20 minutes east 32 chains; thence north 12 degrees east 14 chains and 75 links; thence north 26 degrees 20 minutes east 11 chains; thence north 15 degrees 15 minutes east 10 chains and 20 links; thence for a distance of 6 chains and 78 links, by a curve having a radius of 3 chains and 6 links; thence south 38 degrees east to the crossing-place on the Kackeraboite Creek; the road being 1 chain in width, and the line above described being its western boundary.

Commencing again at a point on the western boundary of the road above described, south-west of the aforesaid crossing-place on the Kackeraboite Creek, and distant therefrom 14 chains more or less; thence north 53 degrees 30 minutes west 8 chains; thence for a distance of 1 chain and 21 links by a curve having a radius of 2 chains and 80 links; thence south 88 degrees west 11 chains and 90 links; thence for a distance of 4 chains and 91 links by a curve having a radius of 4 chains and 42 links; thence north 9 degrees 40 minutes west to the northern boundary of Davey's pre-emptive right aforesaid, the road being 1 chain in width, and the line above described its southern boundary.

POLLING PLACES FOR THE ELECTORAL DISTRICT
OF THE MURRAY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the nineteenth year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act to provide for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria respectively*: I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation abolish the polling places already appointed for the electoral district of the Murray; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby appoint that the several places mentioned in the last column of the schedule hereunto annexed shall be respectively the polling places for the purpose of taking the poll at any contested election for the said district; and that all votes in respect of qualifications within the boundaries and limits mentioned in the second column of the same schedule shall be taken at any election for such district at the polling place or polling places in the said last column set opposite to the names of the respective divisions of such district, that is to say:—

Divisions.	Boundaries and Limits.	Polling Places.
Violettown	As described in the Proclamation of the sixteenth day of September, 1856	Violettown, Longwood, confines of Benalla, confines of Wangaratta, and confines of Avenel.
Mansfield ...	As described in the same Proclamation	Mansfield.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it is enacted that a poll shall be taken for the election of members for each division of every mining district, at such places within such division as the Governor in Council shall from time to time direct, and every poll shall commence at Nine o'clock in the forenoon, and close at Five o'clock in the afternoon, and shall be taken in such buildings as the returning officer shall select: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct, that in lieu of all places previously appointed for taking the poll at elections for the several divisions of the mining district of Castlemaine, the poll shall be taken for the said elections at the several places named in the last column of the schedule hereunto annexed, within and for the divisions respectively set opposite thereto in the second column of the same schedule, that is to say:—

MUNICIPALITY OF CRESWICK.

BYE-LAW No. 1.—STANDING RULES AND ORDERS.

CHAP. I.—Order of Proceedings.

THAT the business of the council shall be conducted on all ordinary occasions with open doors, but any one member present may require the exclusion of strangers until it shall have been decided by the council whether the question proposed to be introduced shall be discussed with open doors.

2. The council shall commence business so soon after the time appointed for meeting as there are a sufficient number of members present to constitute a quorum, but if at the expiry of twenty minutes from the time specified in the summons there is not a quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the council at that meeting.

3. That at the hour appointed for the meeting of the council, or any committee thereof, the town clerk shall enter in the minute book the names of the members present, or who may be present at any time during the meeting (the time of entry being stated), and from such entries compile and publish a half-yearly register of members' attendance, and keep an attendance registry.

4. That whenever the chairman is obliged to adjourn a meeting for want of a quorum, the hour at which such adjournment is made and the names of the members then present shall be entered in the minute book, and in the event of the chairman's absence any member present may adjourn such meeting.

5. That at every meeting of the council the business shall be taken in the following order:—

The reading, discussion as to accuracy, and confirmation of the minutes of the meeting last preceding.

The reading of correspondence, and when necessary the motions of course contingent thereon, as "That it be received," "That it be referred to a committee," "That it be taken into consideration with an order of the day," or "That its consideration be made an order of the day for the next meeting."

The presentation of petitions respectfully worded; at this stage the only question which shall be entertained shall be, "That the petition be received," "That its consideration be postponed, or if necessary referred to a committee."

Every report of a committee shall be brought up by its chairman, and, when read, he or any member of such committee may move, "That it be received and considered with an order of the day," or "That its consideration be made an order of the day for the next meeting."

The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration.

That on a motion being passed that the council go into a committee of the whole, strangers be requested to withdraw, and that it be competent for any member to propose such motion without notice.

Notice of every motion initiating a subject for discussion shall be openly given at a previous sitting of the council, and duly entered on the notice paper. In the absence of the mover, any other member may take up a motion of which notice has been given.

Any standing order of the council may be suspended in case of emergency, provided a majority of the members present shall deem such suspension necessary.

6. No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next meeting of the council regularly convened, and every such bye-law shall (in the interim) be posted outside the town clerk's office for the inspection of any of the burgesses.

7. No motion proposing any petition, address, bye-law, or standing order, shall be entertained unless the mover shall submit therewith a draft of such petition, address, bye-law, or standing order, and the draft so submitted shall in no case be taken into consideration until it shall have been referred to the legislative committee, who shall report thereon, and the mover of every such proposition shall be (*pro hac vice*) a member of such committee.

8. In connection with a motion one amendment only shall be discussed, but if lost, another may be proposed before the original motion is put to the vote. Upon an amendment being carried it shall be acted upon as an original motion, and one other amendment may be moved thereon, but not more.

9. That if two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

10. That members in speaking shall designate each other by their respective titles of chairman or councillor, as the case may be.

11. Any member may of right require the production of any of the documents of the council relating to the matter under discussion.

12. That each or any of the following, acts, words, or omissions, shall constitute and be a breach of order, punishable as a contempt, unless the offending member, upon being called to order, do make a satisfactory apology to the council:—

Addressing the council in other than a standing posture without permission of the chairman.

Interrupting another member while addressing the council except upon a point of order.

Presenting to the council a petition disrespectfully worded.

Refusing to cease speaking when interrupted by a call to order.

Making a verbal or unwritten motion or amendment.

Addressing the council as proposer of a motion or amendment without previously stating the nature thereof.

Speaking more than once on the same motion or amendment, except through the chairman in explanation, or in reply as the mover of the original motion.

Digressing from the subject matter of the question under discussion.

Using offensive language, imputing improper motives, or making personal reflections on any member.

13. The chairman in deciding a point of order, shall state the rule applicable to the case, and his decision thereon shall be final.

14. The chairman, or the then presiding chairman, shall stand up when addressing the council on any question.

15. Any member may require the town clerk to take down in writing any words used by another member immediately on the same being used.

16. Except in cases of election, which shall be decided by ballot, the council shall vote by show of hands, each question being put first in the affirmative and afterwards in the negative.

17. No discussion shall be allowed on a motion for adjournment of the council; and should such motion be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the council.

18. Any member of the council may enter his protest against any resolution of the council, provided that such protest is not inconsistent with truth, or disrespectful to the council. Notice of intention to protest must, however, in every case be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest, signed by the member or members protesting, and specifying the reasons for protesting, must be entered before the next regular meeting of the council, by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the town clerk's office, and duly referred to in the minutes of the council, the same to be considered also a part of such minutes.

19. Any member who shall wilfully disobey any lawful order of the council, and any member or other person who shall wilfully or vexatiously interrupt the orderly conduct of the business of the council, shall be guilty of contempt.

20. That when in consequence of a breach of order, the chairman shall call upon any member or person by name, such member or person shall withdraw as soon as he has been heard in explanation, and after such member or person's withdrawal, the council shall at once take the case into consideration, and if such member or other person be adjudged guilty of contempt, he shall be fined in a penalty, at the discretion of the chairman, not exceeding Ten pounds, and in default of immediate payment

shall be sued before two or more justices of the peace for recovery of the same.

21. That it shall be in the power of the chairman, or of any three members of council by requisition to the chairman, to convene a special meeting of the council; and that due notice of such meeting, together with the object thereof, be given by the town clerk in writing to each member of council, at least twenty-four hours before the time of such meeting.

22. No motion, the effect of which if carried would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year, unless a call of the whole council has been duly made for that purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the council which shall have been negatived by the council shall be again entertained during the same municipal year.

23. That no member or officer of the council shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council, or for any work done by the council; and that no member shall have directly or indirectly any share or interest in any contract given or made by the council; and in all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

24. That the town clerk shall have the custody of the common seal of the municipal council, and shall affix the same to contracts, bonds and licenses, and all bye-laws and addresses to the Governor passed by the council, but he shall not affix it to any other municipal document without the authority of the council; he may also affix such seal to powers of attorney, and other legal instruments not relating to the municipal council.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 1, made by the municipal council of Creswick, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council. Gazetted on the 18th day of February, 1859, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 33.
