By His Excellency Sir Henry Barrly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

In pursuance of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the initeenth year of Her Majesty's reign, initialed, An Act to provide for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria, with the advice of the Excutive Council, do by this my Proclamation abolish the polling places already appointed for the electoral district of the Murray; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby appoint that the several places mentioned in the last column of the schedule hereunto annexed shall be respectively the polling places for the purpose of taking the poll at any contested election for the said district: and that all votes in respect of qualifications within the boundaries and limits mentioned in the second column of the same schedule shall be taken at any election for such district at the polling place or polling places in the said last column set opposite to the names of the respective divisions of such district, that is to say:—

MUNICIPALITY OF CRESWICK,

BYE-LAW NO. 1 .- STANDING RULES AND ORDERS, CHAP. I .- Order of Proceedings.

HAT the business of the council shall be conducted on all ordinary occasions with open doors, but any one member present may require the exclusion of strangers until it shall have been decided by the council whether the question proposed to be introduced shall be discussed with open doors.

- 2. The council shall commence business so soon after the time appointed for meeting as there are a sufficient number of members present to constitute a quorum, but if at the expiry of twenty minutes from the time specified in the summons there is not a quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the council at that meeting.
- 3. That at the hour appointed for the meeting of the council, or any committee thereof, the town clerk shall enter in the minute book the names of the members present, or who may be present at any time during the meeting (the time of entry being stated), and from such entries compile and publish a half-yearly register of members' attendance, and keep an attendance registry.
- 4. That whenever the chairman is obliged to adjourn a meeting for want of a quorum, the hour at which such adjournment is made and the names of the members then present shall be entered in the minute book, and in the event of the chairman's absence any member present may adjourn such meeting.

5. That at every meeting of the council the business shall be taken in the following order:—

The reading, discussion as to accuracy, and confination of the minutes of the meeting last preceding.

Every report of a committee shall be brought up by its chairman, and, when read, he or any member of such committee may move, "That its consideration be made an order of the day," or "That its consideration be made an order of the day," or the next meeting."

The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration.

That on a motion being passed that the council go into a committee of the whole, strangers be requested to withdraw, and that it be competent for any member to propose such motion without notice.

Notice of every motion initiating a subject for discussion shall be openly given at a previous sitting of the council, and duly entered on the notice paper. In the absence of the mover, any other member may take up a motion of which notice has been

Any standing order of the council may be suspended in case of emergency, provided a majority of the members present shall

of emergency, provided a majority of the members present shall deem such suspension necessary.

6. No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next meeting of the council regularly convened, and every such bye-law shall (in the interim) be posted outside the town clerk's office for the inspection of any of the burgesses.

7. No motion proposing any petition, address, bye-law, or standing order, shall be entertained unless the mover shall submit therewith a draft of such petition, address, bye-law, or standing order, and the draft as submitted shall in no case be taken into consideration until it shall have been referred to the legislative committee, who shall report thereon, and the mover of every such proposition shall be (pro hae vice) a member of such committee.

In connection with a motion one amendment only shall be discussed, but if lost, another may be proposed before the original motion is put to the vote. 13. The chairman in deciding a point of order, shall state the rule applicable to the case, and his decision thereon shall be finely applicable to the case, and his decision thereon shall be

14. The chairman, or the then presiding chairman, shall stand up when addressing the council on any question.

15. Any member may require the town clerk to take down in writing any words used by another member immediately on the same being used.

16. Except in cases of election, which shall be decided by ballot, the council shall vote by show of hands, each question being put first in the affirmative and afterwards in the negative.
