MUNICIPALITY OF ARARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 9.—FOR PROHIBITING THE DEPOSIT OF NIGHT SOIL OR OTHER OFFENSIVE MATTER EXCEPT IN SOME PUBLIC DEPÔT.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances, the preservation of health, &c., &c.: And whereas great public nuisance is caused and the public health seriously endangered by persons depositing night soil, offal, and other offensive refuse within the township of Ararat: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Ararat, that no person shall deposit, place, or put any night soil, manure, offal or other offensive refuse or matter whatsoever upon any of the unenclosed lands, or upon any public road or way within the boundaries of the said township or of the said municipality, excepting in some public depot appointed by the said council to be the receptacle of such night soil, manure, offal, or offensive refuse; and any person so offending shall upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace for the said district, forfeit and pay any for such offence a fine not exceeding Twenty pounds sterling. And be it further ordered and directed by the said municipal council that an announcement according to the said Municipal Act 18 Victoria No. 15, shall be deemed an appointment of such public depot for night soil, manure, offal, or other offensive refuse.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 9, made by the municipal council of Ararat, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF PORTLAND.

BYE-LAW No. 9.—BYE-LAW TO PREVENT ACCIDENTS FROM FIRE IN CHIMNEY FLUES, AND TO CAUSE WATER DRAWERS TO GIVE PROMPT AID AT FIRES.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the preventing and extinguishing of fires. Be it therefore enacted as follows:—

The occupier of any building within the municipal district of Portland, whose chimney flue shall take fire from having become foul, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

If any such occupier shall plead that his chimney did not take fire from being foul, the proof thereof shall lie with him.

That in case of any chimney flue or vent being constructed of improper materials, or that the top of such chimney, though constructed of proper materials, is not sufficiently elevated or removed from any inflammable materials of which the roof or other portions of the building, or any adjoining building, is constructed, or that any chimney is not so constructed as properly to carry up the smoke so that it may become a

nuisance to the neighbors, then the inspector of the district, in case of any complaint in writing from any ratepayer, or if it shall appear necessary to him without such complaint, shall forthwith proceed to inspect the same, and if he shall find that there is proper ground for such complaint or reasonable cause to apprehend danger or nuisance, he shall forthwith serve a notice upon the occupier of such premises, calling upon him to alter the said chimney, vent or flue; and any occupier refusing or delaying for more than fourteen days to make such alteration as shall be necessary, shall, on conviction thereof, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

Every water drawer for hire within the municipal district shall register his name and place of abode at the office of the clerk to the council, upon which a license shall be delivered to him; and every such license shall be in force from the 1st day of January to the 31st day of December, in the year in which it shall be granted; and every person drawing water for hire within the municipal district without having previously obtained such license, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

It shall be lawful for the municipal council from time to time to fix the rewards for the water carriers who shall supply water in cases of fire within the municipal district, and such rewards shall be paid by such council accordingly.

Every water drawer for hire shall keep his cart or dray loaded with water from sunset to sunrise, and on neglect thereof he shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

Every water drawer for hire when called upon to attend a fire by a policeman or fireman shall on neglect or refusal of the same forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

Every water drawer for hire shall have his designation as such painted in white on black ground, or in black on white ground, over his door or other conspicuous part of his dwelling, and on neglect thereof he shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings.

CARISBROOK CEMETERY.

REGULATIONS made by the Municipal Council of Carisbrook, in exercise of the power vested in them by the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 27. &c., for the management of the Public Cemetery established there under the Act 17 Victoria No. 12, sec. 68, &c.:-

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the grave or vault is opened.
2. Orders for interment must be given at the office of the secretary between the hours of Ten a.m. and Five p.m. the previous day.
3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.
4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from the 1st September to 30th April, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months of the year.
6. No charges will be made for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to the chairman of the municipal council that the relations or friends of such persons are unable to pay the same.
7. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made at the office of the secretary. A certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying on payment of the charges set forth in the schedule A.
8. The council will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the directions of the council or some person appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of bluestone, granite, slate, or iron.
11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument, must be submitted to the council for their approval.
12. Wooden fences allowed subject to the approval of the council, and which if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the council without notice to the owner.
13. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the charges set forth in schedule A.
14. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the council, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
15. The keeper shall have power to turn out or to take into custody (as the case may require) any person who shall behave indecorously, or commit any trespass or injury to the trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the Act of Council relating to the cemetery or the regulations for the protection of the same, and such person will be proceeded against according to the provisions of the 14th section of the Act 7 Victoria No. 12.
16. The council reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.
