TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD.

No. 1.—BYE-LAW FOR STANDING ORDERS FOR THE MINING BOARD OF ARARAT.—[9th March, 1859.]

AT a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the Shamrock Hotel, Barkly street, Ararat, in the said district, on the 9th day of March, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

CHAP. I.—*The Order of Proceedings of the Mining Board of Ararat.*

1. *Business to commence at the time appointed.*—That the chairman shall take the chair at the hour appointed, and shall commence the business of the board at each meeting as soon as the legal quorum is present; but if at the expiration of thirty (30) minutes after the appointed hour of meeting there be not a quorum, the board shall stand adjourned to the next day, at the same hour, and the names of the members present shall be recorded in the minutes.

2. *Acting chairman.*—That in the absence of the chairman at the meeting of the board, the members present shall appoint one from the members of the board forming that meeting, and the member so appointed shall at such meeting hold and exercise the powers of chairman.

3. *Order of business.*—The first business at each meeting of the board shall be to confirm the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereon except as to the accuracy thereof.

4. *Order of business.*—At all meetings, the reading of correspondence unconnected with the business of the meeting, the presentation of applications, and the bringing up of reports, shall have precedence of all motions in the order here mentioned.

5. *Notices of motion.*—No motion shall be entertained at any meeting unless notice in writing, signed by the member proposing the same, shall have been given at the previous sitting, or in the event of the board being out of session, unless such motion shall have been forwarded to the clerk of the board at least seven (7) clear days previous to the next sitting, and a copy of such notice shall be at once forwarded by the clerk to each member of the board.

6. *Reports of committees.*—That the reports of committees appointed by the board shall be always brought up at the first

meeting succeeding their appointment, unless some satisfactory reason be assigned for delay.

7. *Orders of the day.*—The orders of the day shall include all business of which due notice has been given, and any which may have been left incomplete at a previous sitting.

8. *Members who have given notice of motion shall be present.*—Any motion entered on the notice paper, the mover of which may be absent, and no member being deputed to bring it forward when the business is called in order, such notice shall be struck out.

CHAR. II.—*Order of debate.*

9. In connection with a motion, one amendment only shall be discussed at a time; after all amendments have been put to the vote and lost, the original question shall be then put. Upon an amendment being carried, it shall be acted upon as an original motion, and one other amendment may be proposed thereon, but no more, and the names of the members voting for and against the question shall be recorded and their votes entered on the minutes.

10. *Members may call for papers.*—Any member may call for the production of any of the documents of the board relating to the subject under discussion.

11. *Breach of order.*—That any or each of the following acts, words, or omissions, shall constitute and be a breach of order, punishable as a contempt, unless the offending member, upon being called to order, do make a satisfactory apology to the board:—

Addressing the board in other than a standing posture without permission of the chairman:

Interrupting another member while addressing the board, except upon a point of order:

Presenting to the board an application disrespectfully worded: Refusing to cease speaking when interrupted by a call to order:

Making a verbal and unwritten motion:

Speaking more than once on the same motion or amendment, except through the chairman in explanation, or in reply as the mover of the original motion, but members merely seconding a motion shall not be considered to have spoken upon it:

Interrupting the business of the board by asking questions as to what has been transacted previously:

Using offensive language, imputing improper motives, or making personal reflections on a member.

12. *Chairman to state the rule for point of order.*—The chairman in deciding a point of order shall state the rule applicable to the case, and his decision thereon shall be final.

13. *When two members rise to speak.*—If more than one member rise to speak, the chairman for the time being shall decide which is entitled to precedence.

14. *Words objected to taken down.*—Any member may require the clerk to take down in writing words used by another member immediately on the same being used.

15. *Discussion on a motion for adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on a motion for adjournment of the board, and should such motion be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next sitting.

16. *The chairman shall rise to speak.*—The chairman shall arise when addressing the board in discussion of any subject.

17. *New bye-law to be read at three sittings.*—Every bye-law introduced at this board shall be read at three several and distinct sittings of the board previous to final adoption.

18. *Members disobeying order of the chairman.*—Any member who shall wilfully disobey any lawful order of the chairman, and any member who shall wilfully or vexatiously interrupt the orderly conduct of the business of the board, shall be held guilty of contempt.

19. *Fine, amount.*—Any member adjudged by the chairman, for any of the causes hereinbefore mentioned, guilty of contempt, shall be fined in any sum not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and not less than One pound (£1).

20. *Application of penalties.*—All moneys arising from the penalties imposed by this bye-law shall be deducted in the appropriation account of the Government grant at the close of each half-year, from the amount due to any member so fined, and the total amount of such fines placed to the credit of the chairman, to be appropriated as the board may determine.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-law.

## BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have received the assent of His Excellency the Governor since the publication of last report, viz.:

No. 14. To fix the levels of Sydney street, Kilmore.

No. 15. For the appropriation of a sum of One thousand three hundred and sixty-four pounds thirteen shillings and sevenpence, granted out of the public revenue for the year 1858 to the municipal district of Kilmore.

No. 16. For the assessment of all property within the boundaries of the Kilmore municipality for the year ending the 8th of August, 1859.

No. 17. A bye-law for the levying of a rate of One shilling in the pound for the current municipal year.

No. 18. To regulate the conducting of the election of members of the municipal council.

## PUBLIC WORKS FINISHED OR IN PROGRESS.

The contract for the formation, making, pitching, and metalling twelve chains of Foot street has been completed from Church street to John street, and a substantial culvert erected thereon. The contract for kerbing and channelling the west side of Sydney street, from Foot street to Mitchell street, is now nearly completed, and adds materially to the comfort as well as to the convenience of the inhabitants, especially in wet weather. The bridges on Union and Mill streets having been considered dangerous to travellers, more particularly on dark

and clouded nights, the council ordered the erection of two lamps and lamp-posts, one on each of these bridges, to be lit on dark nights only. The extirpation of thistles within the municipality early engaged the attention of the council. The reserves have been for some time cleansed from this destructive weed, the expense being borne by the council. It is to be hoped that all owners of property within the municipality will be compelled to destroy any thistles growing upon their respective properties, and that the inspector will use his best endeavors to accomplish that purpose. A culvert has been constructed in Andrew street, and the water channels thereto for some distance paved. Two culverts, a paved crossing, and one chain of road metalled have been constructed in Foot street. A contract has also been entered into for the removal of a culvert at the junction of Clarke and Sydney streets; for repairs to and extension of a culvert at the junction of Mitchell and Sydney streets, and for cutting a drain therefrom to the creek; and for the cleansing of a culvert and approaches at the junction of Routledge and Powlett streets; together with the construction of three dams across the Kilmore Creek, with the view of retaining sufficient water, if not for culinary, at least for washing purposes.

## THE COMMONAGE RESERVE.

The inhabitants of the municipality need scarcely be informed that the resumption of the Kilmore Commonage Reserve by the Government has caused no small amount of dissatisfaction. The council, upon learning that the Commissioner of Crown Lands had granted a license for the occupation of the reserve, at once put themselves in communication with the Honorable the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey in reference to the matter, but, strange to say, no reply has yet been received. From information derived from other sources, the council are inclined to believe that the reserve will be restored to the free use of the public in terms of the order of His Excellency the Governor in Council.
